Testimony of Sister Patricia Ann Koschalke, CSFN Chairperson, Resurrection Health Care Sponsorship Board

April 26, 2010

I am Sister Patricia Ann Koschalke, a member of the Religious Congregation of the Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth. I would like to welcome several other Sisters who have joined us here today, including Sister Clara Frances Kusek, Sister Donna Marie Wolowicki, Sister Mary Paul Schultz, Sister Rita Mary Ganser, Sister M. Florence Schultz, Sister Christine Maria, Sister Kathleen Skrocki, and Sister Virginia Ann Wanzek, all of members of the Congregation of the Sisters of the Resurrection. I would also like to welcome Sister, Elizabeth Trembczynski, and Sister Antonia Klausner, both members of the Religious Congregation of the Sisters of the Holy Family, like myself.

I am also pleased to see the hundreds of supporters of this Certificate of Need who have taken time out of their day to be here today to be with us.

I Chair the Sponsorship Board and serve on the Board of Directors of Resurrection

Health Care, which is responsible for the direction of this comprehensive health system. Prior to

my Board experience, I served as the Chief Executive Officer of Holy Family Medical Center for

23 years, where I gained a deep understanding of the health care needs of communities.

My testimony summarizes the mission discernment process regarding the sale of Westlake Hospital and West Suburban Medical Center to Vanguard Health Systems, Inc. Vanguard currently operates 15 hospitals including two in the Chicago area and runs three managed care plans. The company has experience purchasing and operating faith-based health care providers; St. Vincent's, a Catholic hospital in Worchester, MA, and Baptist Health System in San Antonio, Texas.

All assets associated with the operation of both hospitals, and the outpatient campus in River Forest are included in the transaction.

I want to stress that a timely and efficient review and approval of this Certificate of Need is essential to the continuation of health care services at these two facilities.

Resurrection Health Care will be unable to continue operation of the facilities as they exist today—and despite much effort, no other potential purchasers have expressed interest in continuing the operation of these facilities.

Resurrection Health Care's Mission Statement proclaims, "RHC exists to witness God's sustaining love through compassionate, family-centered care." A significant portion of Resurrection Health Care's operating losses are associated with these two hospitals. Keeping these providers in our System puts the rest of the RHC System at risk. We will be unable to "witness love through compassionate, family-centered care" in the communities served by our remaining hospitals and facilities if we continue to provide operating subsidies to West Suburban and Westlake.

The RHC mission statement also proclaims, "Motivated by a reverence for life and respect for those we serve, we are committed to improving the health and well-being of our community." The community that RHC serves has expanded significantly since 1997—from two hospitals to eight hospitals and a broad spectrum of other services and programs. Unfortunately, given our financial situation, Resurrection now needs to focus on a smaller market area and our strongest providers to improve the health and well-being of patients in those core markets.

Finally, our mission statement proclaims, "We promote a climate that empowers all of us to effectively steward our human and financial resources." RHC has very limited resources with respect to capital and management personnel. As good stewards, we are at a juncture at which we need to scale down to strengthen our remaining providers and focus on assuring our long-term ability to continue our mission. As one of the leaders of the System's Sponsors, this is very important to me and my fellow Sisters.

Market forces and a severe economic downturn are affecting many providers—overall volumes and net reimbursement are down and a continued shift to non-acute settings is evident.

National health care reform is now a reality. State and Federal governments and other payors will be reforming payment mechanisms to reward high quality, integrated, evidenced-based care.

The vision for Resurrection Health Care is to become an "accountable healthcare organization."

This vision places more importance on keeping patients healthy and coordinating their care than on owning and operating acute care hospitals. RHC must focus its limited resources on fewer markets and services and build enhanced capabilities needed to succeed in this new environment of health care reform.

No other viable options to transferring ownership of these hospitals have been found, despite extensive study. Since closure of either or both hospitals was considered undesirable, given the massive loss of jobs that would result, the only viable option remaining was divestiture of the facilities. RHC sought to identify a suitable buyer to take over the hospitals, one who would have sufficient resources to invest and assure their continued operation into the future. We believe the transfer of ownership to Vanguard Health Systems is the best option for the communities served by these facilities, and the physicians and employees who work there. Thank you for the opportunity to share this important message with you.

Testimony from Trip Pilgrim Senior Vice President and Chief Development Officer Vanguard Health Systems

Hearing on a Certificate of Need Proposal to Transfer Control of West Suburban Medical Center and Westlake Hospital from Resurrection Health Care Corporation to Vanguard Health Systems

April 26, 2010

Good morning/afternoon. My name is Trip Pilgrim, and I am currently the Senior Vice President & Chief Development Officer for Vanguard Health Systems. I have worked for Vanguard in various capacities over the last nine years and am the company's point person who has been working with Resurrection as this transaction has moved forward.

Thank you for the opportunity to speak today as the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board considers the proposed transfer of ownership of West Suburban Medical Center and Westlake Hospital from Resurrection Health Care Corporation to Vanguard Health Systems.

I want to begin by expressing my deep appreciation for the many community organizations, elected officials and regular citizens who have already expressed their support for these applications.

Our company provides health care services to a diverse group of patients and communities through 15 hospitals and facilities located in four states, including two facilities here in Chicago.

Our more than 20,000 employees bring to the table with them a broad spectrum of experience – from clinical care, operations, contracting and finance to purchasing, human resources and community relations.

Our company also has a track record of investment and growth. Over the last five years, Vanguard has funded capital expenditures of over \$950 million and increased its workforce by approximately 5,000 employees nationwide.

I am proud to be here today to talk about Vanguard's desire to expand the services we provide in the Chicagoland area. Our commitment to this region first started in 2000 with the purchase of MacNeal Hospital and continued in 2002 when Weiss Memorial Hospital joined our family.

Vanguard embraces the communities which it serves and is committed to ensuring that residents never have to leave their community to find access to the highest level of care and services. That is our philosophy and that is the level of service we provide.

As was, and still is, the case with MacNeal and Weiss, we respect our hospitals' autonomy and firmly believe in maintaining local authority.

Vanguard owns the physical assets of MacNeal and Weiss. But it is our teams of local administrators, medical professionals and employees who own their operations, set their policies and help to make the hospitals successful. If the proposed purchase is approved, we will bring the same philosophy to West Suburban and Westlake because we know this is a model that works for our hospitals and the patients they serve.

Vanguard has a long track record of success in strengthening the hospitals we own through significant capital investment and thought leadership that enhances their efficiency and, most importantly, improves clinical care and the experience for the patient. The communities we serve have seen healthcare improve as a result of our efforts. Simply put, we don't buy hospitals to maintain the status quo or to close them.

We are committed to developing urban-based, integrated health delivery systems. Therefore, we purchase hospitals as a part of our desire to develop these urban systems, to improve their clinical care, enhance the quality of services, increase patient satisfaction and grow the number of patients we serve. To that end, I have a lot of recent and personal experience.

When Vanguard purchased the Baptist Health System in San Antonio in January 2003, I had the great opportunity to serve there in a senior role and eventually as President and CEO of the system.

Like West Suburban and Westlake, Baptist Health was facing significant financial and operational challenges when we acquired it. We set ambitious goals for the system and reached out to San Antonio's diverse community with the goals of ensuring the system's solvency, improving its clinical care and involving the community in its turnaround.

In the last seven years, we have made capital investments of over \$450 million into the system, including upgrading and renovating facilities, expanding services and acquiring new clinical technologies. The result was many clinical firsts for the city of San Antonio and a significant growth in the numbers of patients we cared for. In Bexar County alone, our market share grew from 28.5% to almost 36%.

We also own a nursing school. In 2003 there were 125 students; today there are over 500 students.

Growth is a good thing, especially for creating jobs. When Vanguard acquired the BHS in 2003, there were approximately 4,500 employed by BHS. Currently there are over 6,000 employed.

I am also proud to say the culture we developed in San Antonio has resulted in BHS being among the top contributors, year in year out, to the United Way of San Antonio. The BHS family was among those leading efforts in San Antonio to provide assistance to coastal evacuees as a result of Katrina and Rita, and later Ike. This year, our entire Vanguard family raised \$162,000 for Haiti, which was matched by the company for a total of \$325,000.

Vanguard also recognized the challenges facing San Antonio's uninsured population, as Texas has the highest uninsured rate in the country. Among participating in numerous other community-based programs committed to serving historically underserved populations, we helped form a fully-staffed primary care center devoted exclusively to serving the region's working uninsured.

It is this experience, and similar ones from throughout the country, that we bring with us to West Suburban and Westlake hospitals.

Vanguard recognizes the significant responsibility that we have to provide care to the ENTIRE community we serve. In 2009 alone, our hospitals and health care facilities provided approximately \$100 million in charity care and over \$300 million of uncompensated care nationwide.

Right here in Chicagoland, among the region's largest hospitals, including not-for-profits, MacNeal and Weiss are consistently ranked in the upper echelon of hospitals that are most committed to charity care. This was reported on by *Crain's Chicago Business* just this past October.

According to data collected by the Illinois Department of Public Health, our hospitals in this region rank in the upper echelon of those who provide charity care.

MacNeal was one of six Chicago-area hospitals that pay_itaxes and spent a larger percentage of its revenue on a combination of charity care and treatment of public aid patients compared to the majority of the area's 20 largest non-profit hospitals.

That same data indicated that Weiss also spent more on charity care last year than half of the area's 20 largest hospitals.

In addition, nearly 80 percent of Weiss patients, and 55 percent of MacNeal patients, are either Medicare or Medicaid beneficiaries, programs that regularly fail to reimburse for the cost of the services that we provide.

Our hospitals are proud partners with the communities in which they operate. Our doctors, nurses and staff serve on the boards of neighborhood charities, schools, community organizations and religious groups. This includes the Alivio Medical Center, Chicago Health Outreach and Apna Ghar – just to name a few. Our investment in West Suburban and Westlake will allow us to continue and expand these partnerships, start new ones and ensure that critical medical care continues to be available in the Oak Park and Melrose Park communities.

Let me make clear that the challenges facing West Suburban and Westlake are significant and will be difficult to overcome. Moreover, the proposals we are talking about today are very different than that which Vanguard is currently involved in Detroit, Michigan. That is because these are very different organizations and the two situations are very different.

The Detroit Medical Center is a \$2 billion, 7 hospital system with over 12,000 employees. It provides world class clinical care and has achieved national recognition. The DMC has been identified by both US News and World Report and the Leapfrog Group as among the top clinical providers in the United States.

The DMC has three Magnet Status Nursing Hospitals and a world class Children's Hospital. They also have a world class Rehabilitation Hospital specializing in the treatment of traumatic spinal injuries. Also, the DMC is the primary teaching system for Wayne State Medical School, the largest single

campus medical school in the country. They have received national recognition for its Electronic Medical Record. And, they have been operating in the black for the last seven years.

In stark contrast, West Suburban and Westlake together are a fraction of the size of the DMC, and they are financially challenged facilities. Both hospitals have operated in the red for the last five years and, together, have lost a combined \$166 million during this time.

As you have heard, Resurrection approached us after concluding that in order to strengthen their overall system, they needed to divest these two facilities. In addition to Vanguard, Resurrection contacted other systems, including non-profits and for profit systems, Catholic Systems and secular systems. And other than Vanguard, there was no interest. It was our understanding then – and still is today – that if Vanguard had not been interested, then the future existence of these facilities as they are currently configured would have been in serious jeopardy.

But we are interested. As does Resurrection, we believe that these two hospitals have a reason to exist and can continue to serve their communities for years to come. Also, given the neighborhoods that MacNeal Hospital serves are close to those neighborhoods which are currently served by West Suburban and Westlake, we believe there are opportunities to gain some efficiencies that can make the overall system more viable.

We have done our due diligence and made our offer to acquire West Suburban and Westlake with our eyes wide open. Turning around these facilities will not be easy, and the challenges will be many, not the least of which is the continuing ability of Illinois Medicaid to reimburse providers at some level approximating the cost of treating Illinois Medicaid recipients.

However, Vanguard is willing to take on these challenges – and the risks that come with them – because we believe these facilities can not only survive, but thrive. We believe these hospitals are vital to the communities they serve and are committed to seeing them succeed.

We are fully aware of the financial investment and work that will be needed to be successful at West Suburban and Westlake to put them in a position to grow in the future because we have done it before. We've done it here in Chicago. And we have done it in San Antonio, Arizona and Massachusetts.

As the process moves forward, we welcome the opportunity to work with the Illinois Facilities and Services Review Board, appropriate state agencies and the Oak Park, Melrose Park and neighboring communities in turning West Suburban and Westlake into the facilities that we can all be proud of.

My name is Doug Woodson and I'm an organizer with AFSCME Council 31. Our union has been working with employees of the Resurrection Health Care system who are seeking to form a union so that they may have a voice in the decisions that affect their work lives and their ability to provide high quality care to their patients.

These union activists are motivated by a belief that a genuine voice for employees through a union will lead to higher quality, and ultimately more financially successful, hospitals.

It is in this spirit that AFSCME Council 31 urges the Board to demand more from Vanguard and Resurrection regarding the change of ownership of Westlake and West Suburban hospitals.

Employees of Westlake and West Suburban have worked, with little recognition and under increasingly difficult conditions, to provide the best possible care to residents of the West Suburbs and the West Side of Chicago. Today you will hear from many of these employees about why they deserve more from Vanguard and Resurrection than a mere sixty days of job security.

Employees will be joined by area residents who will testify that their communities deserve a full ten year commitment from Vanguard to keep the hospitals open. Vanguard has made this commitment in its application to acquire Detroit Medical Center. We urge the Board to make the corporation demonstrate the same commitment to Westlake and West Suburban.

Members of the community and AFSCME will also raise concerns about Vanguard's commitment to quality care at its Chicago-area hospitals and its capacity to invest in the kinds of bedside resources that will improve Westlake and West Suburban.

AFSCME Council 31 recognizes the challenges of providing health care in today's difficult market. But this deal between Resurrection and Vanguard places the burden of difficult times squarely on the shoulders of dedicated employees and patients.

AFSCME Council 31 urges the Board to guarantee that any transfer of ownership of Westlake and West Suburban include a ten year commitment to keep the hospitals open and a real commitment to the employees who make these hospitals run.

My name is Pat Shehorn. I am the Executive Vice President and CEO at Westlake
Hospital. I have been with Westlake Hospital for eleven years. I am here today to voice
my support for the transfer of ownership of Westlake Hospital from Resurrection Health
Care to Vanguard Health Systems, Inc.

Westlake Hospital has been serving Melrose Park, Maywood, Bellwood and Proviso Township for over 80 years. We are a community hospital at our core, a resource for the community, a neighbor and an employer for many residents. We are the kind of hospital that has seen generation after generation walk through our doors. We have been an employer for entire families at one point or another. We are a hospital with a long-term medical staff and employee workforce. Westlake is the kind of hospital that makes you feel welcome no matter who you are, where you come from or what language you speak. Over the years we have made great strides and strengthened our relationships with our community. We have been fortunate to have partnered with the Westlake Health Foundation and have been the benefactor of numerous grants. These grants have enabled us to implement innovative programs such as a certified medical interpreter program that has served as a model within Resurrection Health Care and throughout hospitals in the

Chicago land area. We have provided thousands of screenings and many programs for families in our community. We are always encouraged by the community's response to the many programs we have offered, programs that have made a difference in the lives of the people in the community, programs that have saved lives, programs that range from offering mammograms to uninsured women in Proviso Township to implementing nutrition and health programs in our local schools and within the Village to combat the nation's childhood obesity crisis.

Nonetheless, despite our many successes helping to improve the health of our community, our financial losses bring us to a crossroad in our history. We have been a part of Resurrection Health Care for 12 years and together have remained committed to serving our community. However, we are painfully aware that Resurrection Health Care can no longer sustain the financial losses at Westlake Hospital and its other entities and also re-invest in much needed facility infrastructure and technology.

We feel blessed that Vanguard Health System wants Westlake as part of its system.

Vanguard has expressed a commitment, just as they have for the past 10 years at

MacNeal, to strengthening Westlake so that we can continue working in our community
to improve the health and wellbeing of those who live here. Vanguard has committed to
keep our dedicated, caring, compassionate employees and physicians who care for the
people of our community as they would care for members of their own family. We are
confident that the transfer of ownership to Vanguard provides us with continued viability.

We have received a ground swell of support from community leaders, residents, our
medical staff and employees. We are dedicated to caring out our mission of care. We also

recognize that the livelihood of many employees, physicians and local businesses are at stake if the transfer of ownership does not take place.

I appreciate the opportunity to voice my support for the transfer of ownership of Westlake Hospital. My name is Shirley Brown. I have worked as a housekeeper at Westlake Hospital for almost 15 years. I also have been a patient at Westlake and I live in Bellwood, a part of Westlake's service area. So I speak as an employee, a patient and a resident of a neighborhood that relies on Westlake.

I urge the Board to require Vanguard Health Systems to keep Westlake Hospital open for a minimum of ten years. This is the only way the Board can make sure there will continue to be hospital services available to the thousands of people who come to Westlake every year for care.

It is important that the Board understand who Westlake serves. Twenty percent of Westlake patients are Latino and over 40 percent are African American. In 2008, 33 percent of our patients were on Medicaid. So Westlake serves a large share of minority and low income residents. They deserve a high-quality, well run conveniently located hospital.

But the terms of the sale of Westlake to Vanguard make that very uncertain.

Vanguard has failed to provide a commitment to keep the hospital open for more than two years. Two years is not a serious commitment to our hospital or our community.

As a for-profit corporation, Vanguard can more easily close or sell the hospital because it won't face review from the Attorney General. If Vanguard decides to close Westlake after two years it will be harder for state regulators to stop it. It may be too late. The Board needs to get a commitment now to protect patients.

In its deal to buy Detroit Medical Center, Vanguard has committed to keep the eight hospitals in the system open for ten years. If Vanguard can provide a ten year commitment in Detroit, why not in the Chicago area?

We also hope Vanguard will make a serious commitment to employees. In the agreement, employees have job security for only 60 days. In the Detroit Medical Center deal, Vanguard has offered to retain all employees at current wage levels, benefits and duties.

If Vanguard is serious about making Westlake a good and profitable hospital then they should sit down and talk with their employees. Because we ARE the front line and we

can help identify ways of saving money, improving quality and better serving our patients.

By respecting the voices of the employees that have been unheard for so many years, I feel that working together that we can make Westlake a great hospital for patients, employees, and the community.

Testimony from Brian Lemon Chief Executive Officer MacNeal Hospital

Hearing on a Certificate of Need Proposal to Transfer Control of West Suburban Medical Center and Westlake Hospital from Resurrection Health Care Corporation to Vanguard Health Systems

April 26, 2010

Good morning/afternoon. My name is Brian Lemon and I am the CEO of MacNeal Hospital, a community teaching hospital in Berwyn. MacNeal became part of Vanguard Health Systems in the year 2000. I have spent 23 of the last 27 years as a member of the management team at MacNeal, including 17 years prior to its becoming part of Vanguard and 5 years following. So I know and have known MacNeal Hospital directly and intimately both before and after its conversion from a freestanding, not-for-profit hospital to being part of a multi-hospital investor-owned system. I also live in the community served by MacNeal, less than a mile from the hospital, and have since 1990.

My point in giving you this background is that I have direct experience and a personal stake in some of the issues or concerns that have been raised about West Suburban and Westlake becoming part of Vanguard Health Systems.

The concern that I would like to address at this hearing has to do with Vanguard's commitment to charity care. By "charity care" I mean health care services provided to folks who have no health insurance or inadequate health insurance, and cannot pay for the services they receive. The amount of charity care provided by hospitals has been a topic of great interest, debate and concern for a number of years now. Tax exempt hospitals have been criticized for not providing enough charity care to justify the privilege of not paying property taxes. And on the flip side, investor owned hospitals that do pay property taxes are incorrectly perceived as not providing charity care.

The notion that investor owned hospitals turn their backs on people in need, and refuse to provide free care, is one of the most damaging and widely held misperceptions out there. Some people seem to take great personal satisfaction in sneering at an organization like Vanguard and promoting the notion that a "for profit" company will, by definition, not provide free care to those in need. The reality is that hospitals – all hospitals, whether organized as not-for-profit or as investor-owned – are organizations of, by and for the communities they serve. Our mission at MacNeal and Vanguard is simply stated: "To Help People Achieve Health for Life". Crucial to our success in delivering on this mission is that we make a commitment to our communities. Key to that commitment is being part of the social services and health care fabric that takes care of people in need.

I would like to now share some facts with you. Three and a half years ago, in December of 2006, the Congressional Budget Office published an analysis of the rates of uncompensated care provided by nonprofit hospitals as compared to investor owned hospitals. The CBO study found a difference of only six-tenths of one percent – in other words, virtually no difference in the amount of uncompensated care provided by the two types of hospitals. And six months ago, Crain's Chicago Business published this article that analyzed the rates of charity care provided by Chicago-area non-profit hospitals and investor owned hospitals. Crain's highlighted the fact that local investor-owned hospitals provide as much – and often more – charity care as their nonprofit peers. A final fact I can share with you is that at MacNeal, the amount of charity care we provide has actually increased during the years that MacNeal has been part of Vanguard Health Systems. In our current fiscal year ending this June 30th, I expect MacNeal to provide approximately \$3.6 million in charity care. This figure is stated at cost – in other words it is the cost of the free care we will provide.

So will having West Suburban and Westlake become part of Vanguard Health Systems result in a decrease in the charity care these hospitals provide to their communities? It should be clear from these facts that the resounding answer is "NO".

# **Exchanges exchanging glances**

CME floats proposal to buy CBOE in possible \$5-bil. deal

CME Group Inc. is putting out feelers to the Chicago Board Options Exchange about a takeover that would value the biggest U.S. stock-options market at as much as \$5 billion.

Acting through intermediaries, officials at the exchanges have held informal discussions over the past month about a combination, sources tell Crain's. No formal bid

is on the table, and further CBOE Chairman William Brodsky talks are on hold until after Wednesday, the last day for filing appeals in a lawsuit that must be resolved before any deal can be cut.

Adding CBOE to CME's stable would put Chicago's three biggest exchanges under one roof, bolstering the city's po-sition as a center of trading and finance. It would give CME, already the largest futures exchange company, a dominant position in stock options.

A deal also would mean a big payday for CBOE members, who have watched members of nearby exchanges cash out already. A \$5-billion price

# Non-profits no better on charity care

For-profit hospitals give just as much-and pay taxes, too

With non-profit hospitals under pressure to justify their tax breaks by providing more charity care, a Crain's analysis shows that local for-profit hospitals provide as much-and of-

Chicago-area Six hospitals are for-profit and pay taxes. Yet all of them spent a bigger chunk of their revenue last year on a combination of charity care and treatment of public-aid

patients compared to the majority of the area's 20 largest non-profit hospitals, ac-cording to a review of data from the Illinois Department of Public Health.

"There is some degree of an unlevel playing field in the relationship between charity and tax status," says Brian Lemon, CEO of MacNeal Hospital in Berwyn, which is owned by a for-

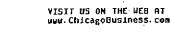
from Mr. Segal's conservative approach to

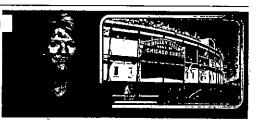

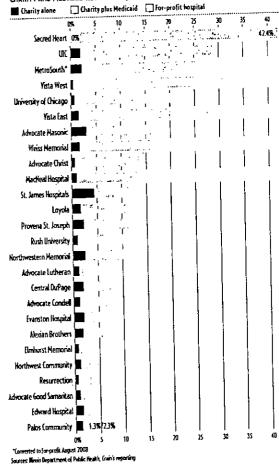

profit, Tennessee-based hospital chain and provided \$2.2 million in free care last year. "In terms of our mission, there's no difference."

Critics contend that non-profit hospitals aren't doing enough to earn their tax breaks, which shield them from property and income taxes and allow them to issue tax-free bonds and receive deductible donations. The blurred line between tax-exempt institutions and their for profit competitors underscores the need for clearer criteria for determining tax exemptions, some experts say.

"I definitely think it argues for a finer point on what charity is, and I think we're grinding toward that," says Beaufort Longest, director of the Health Policy Institute at the University of Pittsburgh.

Illinois has been a flashpoint in a national debate over charity care ever since Champaign County officials stripped Provena Covenant Medical Center of its exemption in 2003, determining its charity care of less than 1% of revenue wasn't enough. The case is now in the hands of the Illinois Supreme Court, which heard arguments last month and is expected to rule in coming months.

Federal law requires hospitals to provide a "community benefit" in exchange for tax exemptions. Among other things, hospitals point to the free or discounted care they provide to poor people, as well as the losses they absorb from treating patients on Medicaid, the health plan for the indigent that generally doesn't cover treatment

Experts say it's no surprise that for-profit hospitals offer free care. Like their non-profit brethren, they are required by law to treat patients who end up in their emergency rooms, regardless of ability to pay. And many Chicago-area non-profits have above-average Medicaid loads because they are in low-income areas.

### MORE FREE CARE

In many cases, local for-profit hospitals dole out more free care and public aid than non-profits. Weiss Memorial Hospital in Uptown and Vista Medical Center East in Waukegan each spent 1.6% of patient revenue on charity last year. That's higher than half of the area's 20 largest hospitals, including Resurrection Medical Center (0.5%); Northwest Community Hospital (1.1%), and Palos Community Hospital (1.3%).

Yet Weiss paid about \$2 million in property and sales taxes last year, while Northwest Community's tax exemption helped it avoid \$11.2 million in taxes, according to the Chicago-based Center for Budget and Tax Accountability. Palos' exemption was worth \$12.8 million, the group says.

Weiss also had a bigger Medicaid load relative to its size: 14% of its revenue came from the publicaid program, vs. 3.5% for Northwest Community's and less than 1% for Palos.

An April study from the Center for Budget and Tax Accountability said that 47 local hospitals earned \$489.5 million in property and sales tax breaks while providing only \$175.7 million in free or discounted care to the poor. The hos-

pital industry calls the study flawed.

Howard Peters, senior vicepresident of the Illinois Hospital Assn., says it's inappropriate to compare non-profit and for-profiti hospitals, in part because they bave different ownership structures. Investor-owned hospitals aim to return profits to shareholders, whereas at non-profits, "any excess revenues go back into the enterprise."

He calls charity care "the narrowest definition" of the benefits hospitals provide their communities. He says Medicaid as a percentage of revenue isn't a good benchmark of charity because hospitals' losses from the program vary depending on their cost structure. He says non-profit hospitals on average likely lose more money on Medicaid than for-profit institutions, although those figures aren't publicly available.

"Whether investor-owned or not-for-profit, hospitals across the board are doing a lot of good things in a tough environment to meet the needs of their communities," Mr. Peters says.

The only local hospital to report no charity care spending last year was Sacred Heart Hospital, a for-profit on the West Side with a heavy Medicaid load. CEO Edward Novak says the hospital provides plenty of free care, but it doesn't track or report it. He sees on difference between his hospital and tax-exempt competitors.

"If you look like a business and act like a business, how do you call yourself a charity?" he says.

India who was a computer consultant in New York before moving to Peoria three years ago to live closer to his parents.

Harvesting will use existing farm equipment. "The only investment the farmer has to make is to buy duct tape," says Peter Johnsen, BMI's chief technology officer. Farmers need only patch holes or cracks in hins and trucks to keep the tiny seeds from falling through.

Making biodiesel from soybeans is barely profitable at current oil prices, even with a \$1-per-gallon federal subsidy, but it will cost about 50 cents a gallon less to make it from pennycress. Within five years, it could be profitable even without subsidies, says BMI's Mr. Seth, as farmers learn how to

grow more pennycress per acre and reduce its cost.

But it's no simple matter to turn a weed into a cash crop. First,

you need seeds. BMI has enough to plant 1,800 acres of pennycress, but its biodiesel plant eventually will require 500,000 acres to supply its needs. Lousy weather has delayed harvesting of this year's crop of corn, and it will soon be too cold for pennycress to germing

nate and take root before winter.

Beyond that, "farmers won't take the risk of planting a crop they can't get insured," says Peo-

ria's freshman Republican congressman, Aaron Schock. Weeds don't qualify for federal crop insurance, but he's been urging the U.S. Department of Agriculture to cover it under the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program.

If pennycress takes off, engineering a better variety should be worth the cost. Pennycress is a cousin of the much-studied mouse-ear cress, the first genetically mapped plant due to its simplicity. "It's the fruit fly of the plant world," says Jason Hill, resident fellow at the University of Minnesota, who did his doctoral thesis on it. "It's an easy plant to modify."

Mr. Hill also co-authored a National Science Foundation paper on the total life-cycle costs and benefits of alternative fuels, which concluded that com-based ethanol creates only 25% more energy than it takes to produce, while soy-based biodiesel creates 93% more. Using pennycress, he says, could be even more cost-effective.

"I certainly applaud them for

looking at ways to use our cropland more efficiently," Mr. Hill says. "But how is it going to scale up?"

That's where Mr. Barton lends

BMI credibility, he adds. "It doesn't get much bigger scale than Caterpillar."

# Frank Molinaro Chief Executive Officer, Weiss Memorial Hospital Public Hearing Statement April 26, 2010

My name is Frank Molinaro. I am the Chief Executive Officer at Weiss Memorial Hospital. Over the last six years it has been my privilege to see the collaborative efforts between Vanguard Health Systems as the owners of the physical assets of Weiss and the medical staff and employee workforce at Weiss who are the owners of the heart and soul of Weiss. This collaboration has transformed Weiss over the last several years from a hospital struggling to survive into a vibrant leader in the community with a very positive future.

Over the last eight years, Vanguard has provided Weiss just under \$60 million in total funding to stabilize and improve the facility and its operations. More importantly, Vanguard has given Weiss a long range vision, a set of values to operate under and the freedom to the physicians and employees to make Weiss a place that we are all very proud of. At the same time, our employees and physicians have assumed ownership of the culture at Weiss which has resulted in major advancements in our safety, quality and service levels. So much so that we now are recognized as having industry best practices in many different areas.

Recently, concerns were raised regarding the "deemed" status of MacNeal and Weiss. MacNeal nor Weiss has ever been limited in their ability to admit and treat Medicare or Medicaid patients. Nevertheless, I want to take this opportunity to address any confusion regarding the deemed status of the two facilities.

In order to remain qualified to receive payments from the federal government for their services to Medicare and Medicaid patients, all hospitals must meet the "Medicare Conditions of Participation" as established by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). A hospital may demonstrate its compliance with the Medicare Conditions of Participation by undergoing a survey of accreditation by the CMS or a state survey agency (SSA) such as IDPH. A third option available is to seek "deemed status" accreditation through CMS approved accrediting institutions who have received special designation from CMS—the most recognized of which is the Joint Commission. Because of the limited resources of CMS and state survey agencies they tend to limit their top priorities to complaint investigations, validation surveys and infrastructure work. This leaves the "deemed status" organizations designated by CMS as the preferred accreditation path for most hospitals. Simply put, a hospital operating under "deemed status" is surveyed under an approved non-governmental entity such as the Joint Commission in place of CMS or a state survey agency.

If at any time a hospital does not meet all of the Medicare Conditions of Participation, that hospital's survey jurisdiction can revert back to CMS or a State survey agency such as IDPH. This means that the hospital does not have "deemed status" during the time the deficiencies with the building or operations are addressed. I have found this to be a

fairly common occurrence here in Illinois. As a matter of fact on April 7, 2010 over 20% of the hospitals in Illinois were under the survey jurisdiction of IDPH including some of the most highly regarded facilities in the state. Because of the age of many of the hospitals in Illinois and the significant cost of getting the hospitals compliant with the most recent fire codes and other regulations it can often take months to years to address all of the deficiencies. Typically, hospitals submit corrective action plans with timetables of completion to IDPH. Once IDPH chooses to accept the action plans, they will conduct periodic on-site surveys over the time period to validate the hospital's progress on its action plan. Once IDPH has verified full completion of the action plan, they will notify CMS and deemed status will be restored. As long as hospitals achieve the progress stated on their action plans, CMS allows them to remain full participants in the federal Medicare program. Most hospitals choose to maintain their voluntary survey participation with the Joint Commission while at the same time working to complete their action plans under the survey jurisdiction of IDPH.

With regard to the specifics of MacNeal's and Weiss' deemed status:

MacNeal Hospital was surveyed by IDPH in May of 2009. There were deficiencies noted by the surveyor that stemmed from a 1983 building being reviewed against updated Life Safety Codes for the first time in 2009. The plan to address those deficiencies has been approved by IDPH. The expected cost is \$900,000 and the expected completion date is July 2011. Once IDPH has verified to CMS that those corrections have been completed as per the corrective action plan, it is expected that MacNeal's deemed status will be returned.

Prior to its acquisition in 2002, Weiss hospital was owned and operated by the University of Chicago. During a survey conducted by IDPH in May of 1998, over 400 deficiencies were identified. Most of the deficiencies were related to building improvements. As a result of the deficiencies, survey jurisdiction was moved to IDPH and the responsibility of carrying out the corrective action plan was assumed by Vanguard Health Systems when it acquired Weiss hospital in 2002. Vanguard Health Systems has invested \$26 million since 2002 in the facility to bring it up to code; however further deficiencies have been discovered during these efforts and as a result the facility has been under the survey jurisdiction of IDPH on three occasions since it was acquired in 2002 with the most recent being in April 2009. The current plan of correction for further building improvements is scheduled to be completed by November 2010 at an estimated cost of \$120,000. IDPH has accepted our plan of correction and is monitoring our progress.

Key points 1'd like to reinforce include:

1. At no time since acquisition has Weiss or MacNeal been excluded from participation in the Medicare program. More than 34% of MacNeal's admissions are Medicare patients and more than 80% of the patients Weiss serves are either Medicare or Medicaid

2. Both Weiss and MacNeal have maintained their accreditation with the Joint Commission. They are currently both fully accredited and compare favorably with state and national benchmarks

I appreciate the opportunity to address any confusion about the "deemed" statuses at Weiss and MacNeal and look forward to welcoming West Suburban and Westlake into Vanguard's Chicagoland family.

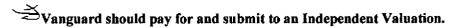
Re: Vanguard Health Systems applications to acquire West Suburban Medical Center (10-014), Westlake Hospital (10-013) and related facilities

Dear Mr. Galassie:

We write this letter to comment on the proposed sale of two Resurrection Health Care Hospitals and an outpatient facility to Vanguard Health Systems Inc. Consumers Union, the nonprofit publisher of Consumer Reports® magazine, is a national consumer advocacy organization that has monitored the conversion of nonprofit hospitals, HMOs, and insurance companies (such as Blue Cross and Blue Shield) to for-profit status over twenty years. We seek to ensure that charitable assets are fully preserved and that health care services are appropriately maintained when these transactions occur.

In a letter we sent last month, Consumers Union urged the Illinois Attorney General to exercise oversight in this important transaction to ensure that the public is receiving fair market value, and the health of the community is protected. We now urge the HFSRB to apply the review criteria provided for under the Illinois Health Facilities and Planning Act to the pending Certificate of Need applications for change of ownership of the Resurrection facilities and to approve these CON applications only if Vanguard agrees to specific provisions to protect the interests of patients, employees and the communities these hospitals serve.

Specifically we believe the CON Applications should only be approved if Vanguard complies with the following conditions:



HFSRB should contract with an expert to conduct an independent valuation. HFSRB will collect the cost of this valuation from Vanguard. Vanguard must pay the full fair market value for the assets they are purchasing, the good will, including names and trade names, and Resurrection's actual and potential market share. Without an independent valuation or truly competitive bidding process, there is no independent yardstick by which to measure if the hospital board met its fiduciary obligations, and most importantly, whether the public is getting full fair market value for the asset it built.

### The applicants should create an independent foundation with the sale proceeds

The community should be able to share in Vanguard's success. A nonprofit independent foundation should be created to continue the nonprofit mission of Westlake, West Suburban, and River Forest. The foundation should receive stock options in Vanguard in addition to the other payments as part of this transaction. This model has been used in many transactions regarding the sale of nonprofit charitable health corporations including Blue Cross of California, and Blue Cross Blue Shield of Missouri.

### Vanguard should pay for an independent Health Impact Analysis

HFSRB should contract with an expert to conduct an independent health impact analysis. Vanguard must reimburse HFSRB for the cost of this analysis. According to the Lewin Group, a nationally renowned health care policy group, the most likely scenario in this type of transaction is that the for-profit will "eliminate those specific services that operate at a loss or that are not in some way inextricably linked to the hospital's financial or operational viability." Vanguard should be required to maintain certain minimum levels of essential services in perpetuity.

## Vanguard should be required to make concrete commitments to provide for the health care needs of the uninsured and patients on Medicaid

Vanguard must make strong commitments regarding Medicaid and charity care to minimize the potential negative health impact on the community and the state. Provisions in the agreements need to be clear that Vanguard will guarantee a continuation of services to Medicaid recipients. At a minimum, Vanguard must commit to providing the Cook County average of charity care (which does not include Medicaid, county indigent funds or bad debt) at these facilities. If Vanguard fails to provide this level of charity care, the local primary care clinic, the Illinois taxpayers and the local community will be forced to take on this burden.

### Vanguard should be required to maintain current staff and compensation packages

Vanguard must commit to continue the employment of current employees and the current staffing levels. If Vanguard eliminates any of the current jobs, or reduces staffing levels, there may be a significant impact on the operation of the hospital, patient care and the local economy.

In conclusion, we urge you to hold a thorough and transparent review process, and impose the conditions necessary to protect the charitable assets and the health of the community.

# Testimony on behalf of AFSCME Council 31 to the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board Public Hearing Monday, April 26

Re: Vanguard Health Systems applications - Westlake Hospital (#10-013) and West Suburban Medical Center (#10-014)

The purpose of the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act is to "guarantee the availability of quality health care to the general public; maintain and improve the provision of essential health care services and increase the accessibility of those services to the medically underserved and indigent."

To fulfill that purpose, the Act empowers the Health Facilities and Services Review Board to thoroughly review the record of any applicant seeking to acquire a community hospital.

We believe the record on Vanguard raises a number of serious questions. On three key review criteria the applicants have failed to demonstrate that the proposed sale conforms to the regulations or the broader purpose of the law.

The Planning Act rules require the board to consider the applicant's plans for discontinuing services and for ensuring access to care:

The regulations require the Board to verify "that the applicant intends to maintain ownership and control of the facility for a minimum of three years." Yet Vanguard commits to continue operation of West Suburban and Westlake for only two years. In order to ensure compliance with the law's purpose, Vanguard should be required to operate both hospitals for at least ten years.

Access would be further compromised by the fact that the sale would allow Vanguard to control 47% of all short-term acute care hospital beds in the planning area, creating the conditions for the system to significantly raise prices.

State regulations also require the Board to consider whether "adverse action has been taken against the applicant, or against any health care facility owned or operated by the applicant."

Vanguard's two Illinois hospitals are currently under state monitoring for serious violations of the Medicare Conditions of Participation.

The hospitals were cited by public health authorities for failures related to patient safety, infection control and cleanliness - violations clearly related to short staffing for nurses, nurses' aides and techs, and housekeepers.

Specific violations included:

- Understaffing in the labor and delivery unit
- · Infection control violations in the operating room and
- Unsanitary conditions in the emergency room

Regulations require the applicant to demonstrate that it has the "financial resources to adequately provide a proper standard of healthcare for the community."

In Illinois, Vanguard's two hospitals lost over \$69 million over the past three years.

Vanguard's disclosures to investors state "our high level of debt may adversely affect our operations." The low cushion ratio reported in the CON applications is further indication that the system is stretched thin and may not have the resources to invest in these struggling hospitals.

Vanguard's plans to spend \$1.5 billion to acquire the Detroit Medical Center system and up to \$115 million to build a new hospital in Texas are likely to further strain its finances.

We urge the Board to require Vanguard to address the deficiencies in its applications in these three areas.

We would also like to take this opportunity to note that Senator Kim Lightford has sent AFSCME a letter of support regarding the transfer of ownership of Westlake and West Suburban hospitals. She urges inclusion of a 10 year commitment to keep the hospitals open. We are submitting a copy of the letter to the Board.

Good morning/afternoon my name is Esther Corpuz and I am the Executive Director for External Affairs at MacNeal Hospital. Thank you for allowing me to testify today in support of the Certificate of Need application.

I work with community based organizations, residents, business, faith leaders and elected officials. I was originally hired by MacNeal prior to the change of ownership to Vanguard Health Systems and recently celebrated 15 years of service with the hospital. I understand and respect the opportunity these hearings give to the communities who care about their hospitals and appreciate so many people coming out for the hearing.

Growing up in the Pilsen neighborhood, I was proudly raised in a traditional Mexican household. I have dedicated my professional life to health care that is centered in the community. I believe in institutions that set high standards of care for all individuals and who are treated with respect and dignity, without regard for their ability to pay for service.

Working at MacNeal has been an extension of this commitment. Like the entire Vanguard network nationwide, we are focusing on earning life-long relationships with our patients and helping them stay healthy throughout every stage of their lives. We also recognize the unique differences of each and every community we serve and work tirelessly to meet their needs.

For example, MacNeal recognized the need to address the changing demographics of its rapidly emerging Latino-Mexican patient population. The hospital has continually demonstrated its commitment to serving the needs of its patients and families by funding community based organizations and working to increase the bilingual, bicultural workforce that reflects the makeup of the patients we serve. At the same time, for hard to fill positions, MacNeal utilizes on site paid, professional medical interpreters to assist with communication needs for patients, families and visitors, an investment that many hospitals still do not provide.

Over the years I've participated in many projects that have advanced MacNeal's mission – which I personally share — of giving back to the community we serve.

For example, these past several years I have served on the Executive Board of Directors for Alivio Medical Center, an organization which MacNeal partnered with in 2008 to expand and open a new community health center in Cicero. MacNeal paid for the renovation of the facility and paid the first year lease expense. Alivio is committed to caring for Chicago's uninsured and

underinsured and serves over 21,000 patients each year. We will continue to work and support Alivio and our shared mission for providing healthcare to our community. Early plans for a new healthcare center on the campus of MacNeal and Weiss hospitals are underway. This year, Alivio Medical Center celebrated its 21st anniversary and MacNeal looks forward to a healthy partnership for years to come.

Another project I feel personally connected to is the launch of a health careers program at the National Latino Education Institute, which I serve as the board chair. In fact, with us today are 42 medical assisting students who are attending today's hearing as part of their medical law and ethics class. The school provides career training and job placement for the Latino community. Under Vanguard's ownership, MacNeal assisted with securing a \$125,000 grant to build the clinical lab to get the program off the ground. Today, MacNeal physicians and nurses regularly lecture at NLEI and provide career guidance and coaching to students, many of whom eventually secure jobs at MacNeal. The partnership is extremely beneficial for both MacNeal and the Institute. Together we hope to continue to grow the much needed bilingual bicultural workforce in hospitals throughout Chicagoland.

- The \$21,000 that hospital employees raised for the American Heart Association, and the over \$6,000 for the American Cancer Society.
- Sponsoring numerous neighborhood events such as the Roosevelt Road Street Fair, Octoberfest, Latino Book and Family fair, and annual fundraising dinners for local church and community groups.

And in the coming months, MacNeal will join First Lady Michelle Obama, community leaders, teachers, doctors, nurses, moms and dads in a nationwide campaign to tackle the challenge of childhood obesity.

My name is Caren Perlmuter, and I am Vice President of Development and Community at Weiss Memorial Hospital. ### Testimony of Carmen Velasquez Executive Director, Alivio Medical Center

My name is Carmen Velasquez, and I am the Executive Director of the Alivio Medical Center.

Alivio Medical Center is a bilingual, bicultural organization committed to providing access to quality cost-effective health care to the Latino community, the uninsured and underinsured, and not to the exclusion of other cultures and races. For over two decades we have committed ourselves in our mission and our practice to serving Chicago's immigrant community – including the undocumented – and those who all too often go neglected and ignored.

Since first establishing the Alivio Medical Center in 1989 in Chicago's largest Latino and predominately Mexican communities of Pilsen, Little Village, Back of the Yards - and now operating in the Berwyn Cicero neighborhood - I have seen a lot of people come and go who say they care about our community. But when we need them, they're usually nowhere to be found.

When we hear about hospitals changing hands and companies pledging to invest in our community, it is understandable for people to be skeptical. And, frankly, I am usually one of them. But that is not the case today.

I am here to express my support for the pending Certificate of Need (CON) application recently submitted by Resurrection Care to transfer control or West Suburban and West Lake hospitals to Vanguard Health Systems.

I want to talk a little bit about my personal experience with Vanguard and one of its hospitals already doing great work here in Chicago with my organization.

As some of you may know, Alivio Medical Center has a strong partnership with MacNeal Hospital in Berwyn. We have worked together in recent years to provide healthcare for the uninsured and needy. I know that we always have a partner in MacNeal because the hospital doesn't have just a presence in our community – it has permanence.

We all know hospitals have different models of care and community health centers are distinct. None of us are stand alone, and all of us should come together to address patient care.

I have seen firsthand through the work that we have done and the commitment of the staff and administration at MacNeal have to our neighborhoods and residents.

I'd like to share a couple examples with you.

Until recently, MacNeal did not allow the practice of midwifery, a model of care that many of our patients prefer over the traditional OBGYNs. At the time, MacNeal had no accredited midwifery providers and we approached the administration about expanding their level of service to pregnant women and their families to include midwifery. MacNeal recognized the importance of this practice and worked with us to credential

providers. We proudly became the first accredited midwifery program at MacNeal just in the last few months.

Women should have the ability to choose type of care and the provider, and MacNeal's recognition of this important service and willingness to offer services that community residents ask for is reflective of the approach they and Vanguard take to meeting the needs of patients.

MacNeal is also a trusted partner of the Alivio Medical Center. They share their resources and work with us to train our medical and professional staffs, making us all more effective care givers.

Finally, and perhaps most importantly, MacNeal works tirelessly with groups like mine to help patients find a medical home. This is especially true for those who have no alternative but to use the emergency room for their primary care needs.

I view Vanguard's desire to purchase West Suburban and West Lake as a welcomed investment in our community and a sign of the system's continued commitment to Chicago. I know what the system is capable of and am excited that the neighbors and patients of West Suburban and West Lake will experience the same types of benefits that we have because of MacNeal.

From where I come, we look for people to not only say the right things, but more importantly, do the right things. Vanguard has stepped up to the plate to meet the needs of patients. I urge the Board to do the same and approve this application. Our neighborhoods can not afford to lose hospitals like West Suburban and West Lake. Too much is at stake for us not to do the right thing.

Remarks of Elba Aranda-Suh, Executive Director, National Latino Education Institute

My name is Elba Aranda-Suh and I am the Executive Director of the National Latino Education Institute (NLEI) formerly the Spanish Coalition for Jobs, Inc. The National Latino Education Institute thanks the Board for the opportunity to share our testimony.

NLEI is a nonprofit (501) (c) (3) community organization that was founded in the late 1960s in response to the Latino community's urgent need for equal employment opportunities.

Our mission puts us at the crossroads of education and employment in our communities. It is from this platform that we support partners who have proven their commitment to community development and economic empowerment, such as Vanguard Health System's MacNeal Hospital.

Our job training, educational programming and workforce services include several healthcare training programs, among others. Every year, our constituency is equipped with the tools necessary to succeed in an increasingly competitive, multicultural and service-oriented economy.

Through our programs many have achieved an enhanced quality of life and enjoy new careers in healthcare, affording them the ability to provide better education, shelter, and medical care for their families--ceasing the cycle of poverty. These programs would not have been made possible without the support of loyal partners, such as MacNeal Hospital.

MacNeal Hospital has established close and meaningful relationships with the communities it serves. Decision makers at MacNeal have made serious commitments reflecting their strategic investment of resources and their personal involvement as volunteers within our communities.

One of MacNeal's notable and demonstrated contributions to our community was their leadership in ensuring accessibility of quality training for disadvantaged Latinos in a sector that actually showed job and career growth promise – healthcare. MacNeal understood the need and importance in equipping the Latino community for this rapidly growing sector as they provided the seeds for the construction of a healthcare training lab that would launch the first Bilingual/Bicultural Certified Medical Assistant Education Program in Chicago. MacNeal's campus served our students as a learning site where students were able to utilize the library, met with MacNeal volunteer healthcare professionals to understand career paths, and began their clinical training.

This institution has invested in the training and development of their incumbent workforce ensuring that patients and their families are able to communicate their health needs and services are well understood. This factor is vital in receiving quality healthcare.

Today, our healthcare training and education offerings have blossomed because of the seeds MacNeal planted for our Bilingual Medical Assistant Program as the demand for these skills continues.

For our communities to thrive, we must educate and empower our community to work in fields that promise growth. This has been possible through the partnership with institutions, such as MacNeal, who have been at the forefront of serving Cook County through innovative and collaborative community-focused service delivery.

Good morning.

I am Jeannie Carmedelle Frey, Senior Vice President of Legal Affairs for Resurrection Health Care Corporation. I am also the corporate Secretary of Westlake Hospital. On behalf of Westlake Hospital and all of Resurrection Health Care, I would like to express our gratitude to the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board for giving us and the many supporters of this application the opportunity to speak at today's public hearing. We also would also like to acknowledge the conscientious work done at this hearing by both the hearing officer and the court reporter.

Resurrection appreciates that some may have sincere concerns regarding the proposed sale of this hospital. I believe that any such concerns have been well addressed, sometimes quite eloquently, in the testimony of the numerous individuals who have spoken here today in favor of this sale,

including community members and community leaders, physicians, employees, government officials, members of the clergy, leaders of other nearby community hospitals and health providers, as well as Vanguard Health Systems. Inherent in the testimony of all such speakers is a recognition that this transaction is critically important to the future of the hospital and the community it serves. Their testimony today clearly illustrates the strong, broad-based support for a transition that while difficult, makes sense for this community.

It has been a full morning. I will therefore reiterate and clarify just a few key points:

First, all of us at Resurrection Health Care are heartbroken that this sale has become necessary. Since making Westlake part of the Resurrection system in 1998, its employees have become our colleagues and our friends, while the members of the community became part of our extended family of care. We at Resurrection can assure this community, and the Board, that we have not come to this point lightly. We knew when Westlake joined Resurrection that it faced real operational challenges. However, we also knew that the community needed Westlake Hospital, and as an organization we put our

heart and soul, as well as the system's financial resources into helping this hospital serve that community. Although the hospital has lost money for many years, we tried many things, and considered many alternatives, before concluding that we had done all that we could, and that it was time to pass the torch to another system.

Our sadness at the prospect of Westlake Hospital no longer being part of the Resurrection family is tempered by the belief that as part of the Vanguard Health System, Westlake will have the support of a committed health care provider with a proven track record of meeting community needs and operating quality hospitals in Illinois, Arizona, Texas and Massachusetts.

Second, while we know that in pure financial terms, of simple economic market value, this hospital is not considered "worth" very much, we know that in human terms, this hospital is incredibly valuable. You have heard testimony from a large number of individuals who have given witness to that value from a wide variety of different perspectives. We at Resurrection are proud to have contributed to that value over the past 12 years. measure of reluctance and sadness, Resurrection recognizes that it is time to

turn over the future of Westlake Hospital to another qualified organization.

However, we do so in the belief that this is in the very best interests of

Westlake Hospital, its employees and its staff, as well as the many people

Board to approve this application.
