Page 2 (START TIME 10:00) Ι MR. RYAN: We are about to get underway. 2 The Administrator for the Illinois Health Facilities 3 and Services Review Board is here. We will be 4 distributing through the crowd and we will have 5 people bring it around so everybody doesn't have to 6 go to the back. There are people who will be testifying and there are a lot of people here who 8 are testifying. Those people will sign in on the 9 testimonial page and there will be two pages. 10 for "for" and one for "against" and there will also 11 be a page for people to sign in for attendance. 12 Courtney Avery, who is the Administrator is here. 13 MS. AVERY: Good morning, everyone. 14 Courtney Avery from the Illinois Health Facilities 15 and Services Review Board and I am here today to act 1.6 as a public hearing officer and facilitator for the 17 meeting. Unfortunately, I cannot respond to any 18 questions or give you any feedback on the . 1.9 application, so we're just going to have it on the 20 court record and the full Health Facilities Clinic 21 Board will review all of the testimony that's given 22 here today. So I will read into the record what we 23 are here today to do. 24 Our purpose here today is to listen to 25

1.	Page 3 opposition, support for the Project Number 10-081,
2	Holy Cross Hospital in Chicago, Illinois, which is
3	proposing to transfer ownership to Vanguard Health
4	Systems, Incorporated. As part of the rules of the
5	Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review
6	board, I would like to read the previously posted
7	legal notice into the record. So you will hear
8	dates that have passed us, but this is how it
9	appeared and must be done per the rules.
10	A Notice of review and opportunity for
11	public hearing and written comment, Project Number
12	10-081, Holy Cross Hospital, Chicago, Illinois. In
13	accordance with the requirements of the Illinois
14	Health Facilities Planning Act, notice is given of
15	receipt to transfer ownership of an acute hospital,
16	Project 10-081, Holy Cross Hospital located in
17	Chicago, Illinois. Applicants are Vanguard Health
18	Systems, Incorporated; Vanguard Health Management,
19	Incorporated; Vanguard Health Financial Corporation,
20	LLC; Hospital Development Company Number Two,
21.	Incorporated and Holy Cross Hospital.
22	The applicants propose to transfer
23	ownership of the 274-bed hospital located at 2701
24	West 68 Street, Chicago, Illinois. The project cost
25	is \$19,355,000.

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1.	A public hearing is to be held by the
2	Illinois Department of Public Health pursuant to the
3	Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act. The
4	hearing is open to the public and would afford on
5	opportunity for parties with interest to present
6	written and oral, verbal comment relevant to the
7	project. All allegations or assertions should be
8	relevant to the need for the proposed project and be
9	supported with two copies of documentation or
1.0	materials that are printed or typed on paper size 8
1.1	and a half by 11-inches. Consideration by the State
12	Board has been tentatively scheduled for March 22,
13	2011, the state board meeting.
14	The public hearing will take place
15	pursuant to part 1130.910. The hearing is scheduled
16	for 10:00 a.m. January 28, 2011 located at Marquette
17	Park Field House, 6734 South Kedzie, Chicago,
18	Illinois 62629. For additional information, call
19	217-782-3516, TTY number 800-547-0466, which is used
20	for impaired hearing only.
21	Any persons wanting to submit written
22	comment on this project must submit these comments
23	by 9 a.m. on March 2, 2011.
24	Right now, I don't know if everyone has
25	had the chance to sign in, but there are sheets that

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1	will be circulated. If you have not done so when
2	the sheets are circulated, the green form is for
3	those individuals who would like to provide
4	testimony in support of the project. The blue is
5	for those who would like to provide testimony in
6	opposition of the project. The yellow form is for
7	those individuals who would like to register their
8	attendance, but do not wish to provide any
9	testimony.
10	To insure that the State Board's public
11	hearing will protect the privacy and maintain the
12	confidentiality of an individual's health
13	information and covered entities, as defined by the
1.4	Health Insurance Portability Act of 1996, such as
15	facilities, hospital providers, health plans and
1.6	health clearinghouses submitting oral or written
17	testimony that discloses protected information of
18	individuals should have a valid written
19	authorization from that individual. The
20	authorization shall allow the covered entities to
21	share individual's protected health information at
22	this hearing.
23	If you have prepared text and you want to
24	submit it, please do so. We will take those copies
25	and give it to the court reporter. If you give oral

1	testimony, please be as brief as possible so that we
2	can give everyone an opportunity to participate and
3	we will have to limit you to, at least, five
4	minutes. If you want to speak more than five
5	minutes, you can do so after everyone has had the
6	opportunity to do. The notice asked that you
7	provide the two copies. If you don't have them and
8	can send them to us later, please do so, and there
9	is also a flyer that is being circulated with the
10	next meeting date, location and time. It also has
11	information on where to submit your written
12	comments.
13	We will do our best to take everyone in
14	the order that is on the forms, but we may get a
1.5	little out of order, so please be patient with us.
16	At this time, I would ask that anyone from
17	the applicant who would like to give testimony
18	first, to please do so.
19	BY SISTER REGINA DUBICKAS: I am Sister`
20	Regina Dubickas, and I am a member of the
21	congregation of the Sisters of St. Casimir of
22	Chicago. I have served on Holy Cross Hospital's
23	Board of Trustees for the past 13 years. I am
24	pleased to see the many supporters of the
25	certificate of need and who have taken time out of

1	their busy schedules to be here with us today.
2	The Sisters of St. Casimir have ministered
3	to the people of Chicago since as early as 1909.
4	Over the years, we have carried out our mission of
5	teaching and evangelizing, caring for the sick, the
6	aging and sharing Christ's special love for the poor
7	through ministries in education, health care and
8	community development. Holy Cross Hospital has
9	served as one of the primary vehicles through which
10	we have carried out these ministries for the past 83
11	years.
12	The Sisters of St. Casimir began their
13	ministry of Holy Cross Hospital in 1928. Holy Cross
1.4	has always operated as a stand-alone hospital
15	without the financial support of a larger health
1.6	system. Over the past 20 years, due to the
17	increasing number of low income and uninsured
18	patients served by the hospital, we have struggled
19	to keep Holy Cross Hospital's doors open.
20	Let me be clear, the Sisters love Holy
21	Cross Hospital. We care deeply about the community
22	that we serve, the people that we employ, the
23	doctors who care for our patients. The decision to
2.4	transition the ownership of Holy Cross to Vanguard
25	was not one that came lightly, nor is it one that

1.	did not involve extensive investigation, due
2	diligence and prayer. We are absolutely convinced
3	that, through our collaboration with Vanguard, Holy
4	Cross will thrive, continuing to serve the community
5	that counts on us to be there for them.
6	In making the difficult decision to
7	initiate the sale of the hospital, the following
8	were key considerations that we identified in
9	looking for a potential purchaser: Insuring that
10	Holy Cross Hospital maintain its commitment to
11.	Catholic health care; the ability of Holy Cross
12	Hospital to have access to capital for needed
13	improvements; the ability of the purchaser to
14	continue the day-to-day operations of Holy Cross
15	Hospital; maintaining the jobs of Holy Cross
16	Hospital's current employees; allowing the Sisters
17	of St. Casimir to maintain active at the hospital
18	and retaining responsibility for the Catholic
1.9	aspects of the hospital's operations. Finally,
20	enhancing the ability of Holy Cross Hospital to
21	continue to provide quality health care to the
22	community and to continue to actively reach out to
23	and participate in addressing the needs of the
24	surrounding community.
25	For many years, we have explored a number

1.	of options and engaged in an extensive process to
2	find a suitable partner that would satisfy these key
3	considerations. After long and diligent efforts, we
4	found Vanguard to be the best option to ensure the
5	viability of the mission of Holy Cross Hospital into
6	the future
7	As part of the transaction, Vanguard will
8	enter into a Stewardship Agreement with the Sisters
9	of St. Casimir whereby Vanguard agrees to keep the
10	hospital Catholic and will continue to follow the
11	Catholic directives.
1.2	Under the Stewardship Agreement, the
13	sisters will continue to provide oversight and
14	monitoring services to strengthen the Catholic
15	identity and the mission of the hospital.
16	Additionally, the sisters will have the following
17	rights: To nominate members of the hospital's
18	advisory board; approval of the appointment of all
19	members of the ethics committee; approval of the
20	mission, philosophy and value statements of the
21.	hospital; to be consulted by Vanguard regarding the
22	selection of the CEO; approval of the vice-president
23	of mission effectiveness; ability to remove the
24	vice-president of mission effectiveness and approval
25	of the hospital's charity care policy. An

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1	independent ethical review, along with Cardinal
2	George's own analysis, affirm that through the
3	protections that have been initiated and others, the
4	Catholic mission of the hospital would be protected.
5	In addition to the commitment to keeping
6	Holy Cross Catholic, Vanguard has agreed to assume
7	the hospital's pension liability which is well into
8	the millions. This is especially important because
9	it ensures that we will have sufficient funds in
10	place for our employees when they retire. Only a
11	large health system, such as Vanguard, will be able
12	to assume a liability of this magnitude.
13	By agreeing to operate the hospital,
14	Vanguard is assuring that the jobs of Holy Cross
15	Hospital, approximately 1,200 employees, will be
16	preserved. This provides security for both our
17	employees and the residents of the community they
18	serve.
19	In addition, Vanguard has agreed to make a
20	significant capital investment over the next five
21	years which will be used to help Holy Cross Hospital
22	make much needed capital improvements. This is well
23	beyond the hospital's historic ability to replenish
24	capital.
25	In summary, with Vanguard purchasing Holy

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1	Cross Hospital, we are assured that the hospital
2	will remain Catholic; that our employees' jobs are
3	secured; that the hospital will receive the capital
4	that it needs and that the Sisters of St. Casimir
5	will continue their ministry and remain an active
6	part of Holy Cross Hospital. This transaction will
7	insure that the mission of Holy Cross Hospital and
8	the mission of the Sisters of St. Casimir will
9	continue to have a positive impact on the community
10	surrounding Holy Cross Hospital.
11	The Sisters of St. Casimir have over 100
12	years of leadership in serving the needs of those
13	who have come to our door, our emergency room and
1.4	our Maria High School looking for comfort, support,
15	a helping hand, health care or an education. We are
16	the bedrock of our community and we embrace our role
1.7	of serving all, but especially the vulnerable and
1.8	those in need. Our main priority has always been to
19	keep Holy Cross Hospital open and operating as a
20	Catholic institution. The action that we are
21	requesting today is a right decision for the right
22	time.
23	Thank you for holding this hearing today
24	and allowing us to share our story with you.
25	MS. AVERY: Thank you. I also ask for the

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1	benefit of the court reporter that you give the
2	spelling of your name. The next speaker will be
3	Sister Margaret Zalot.
4	BY SISTER MARGARET ZALOT: This is a letter
5	from Cardinal George.
6	I am writing this letter to express my
7	support of the transition of Holy Cross Hospital to
8	ownership by Vanguard Health System. By virtue of
9	this unique partnership between the Sisters of St.
10	Casimir and Vanguard, Holy Cross Hospital will
11	continue to be a vital Catholic presence serving the
12	people of southwest Chicago.
13	For more than a century, the Sisters of
14	St. Casimir, through their health care and
15	educational ministries, have served the people of
16	Marquette Park and surrounding neighborhoods.
17	Various demographic changes and economic hardships
18	have often made this work challenging. Through
19	their compassionate presence among the poor and
20	underserved, the Sisters have been a stable beacon
21	of faith, hope and love.
22	For many years, Holy Cross Hospital has
23	faced significant financial difficulties, at times
24	coming close to closure. After a thorough search of

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all possible alternatives, the Sisters came to me

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1	with a new approach that would allow them to extend
2	their charitable and spiritual mission of health
3	care. I am convinced that their desire to partner
4	with Vanguard Health System is the best way to allow
5	Catholic health care to continue at Holy Cross
6	Hospital.
7	While a for-profit Catholic hospital may
8	appear to be counter-intuitive concept, Holy Cross
9	will not be unique in adopting this approach. Since
10	2005, Vanguard's St. Vincent Hospital in Worcester,
11	Massachusetts has operated as a genuinely Catholic
1.2	for-profit, yet charitable institution under the
13	oversight of the Diocese of Worcester. The Sisters
14	of St. Casimir will oversee the Catholicity of Holy
15	Cross and have reserve powers to assure continuation
16	of the hospital's Catholic's mission.
17	Ethicists of the Archdiocese of Chicago
18	have reviewed the Sisters' proposal and found it to
19	be ethically and spiritually sound. The Archdiocese
20	and the Sisters have received the approval of the
21	Holy See, which is required by church law, to enter
22	into this transaction with Vanguard. This
23	partnership will assure quality health care in a
24	neighborhood that would otherwise not be served.

2	MS. AVERY: Thank you.
3	MR. PILGRIM: Good morning. My name is Trip
4	Pilgrim. I'm Senior Vice-president and Chief
5	Development Officer with Vanguard Health Systems.
6	I've worked with Vanguard in various capacities over
7	the last ten years and currently the company's point
8	person in transaction with Holy Cross.
9	First, I want to thank you for the
10	opportunity to speak today to the Illinois Health
11.	Facilities and Services Review Board, and as they
12	consider transfer the proposed transfer of ownership
13	from Holy Cross to Vanguard. I deeply appreciate
14	the many community organizations, elected officials
15	and regular citizens who have already expressed
16	their support for those applications. A special
17	thanks to all of you who chose to attend today and
18	wearing the yes buttons.
1.9	I'm deeply appreciative also of Cardinal
20	Francis George and his staff for their support for
21	the proposed transaction and the Cardinal's interest
22	in working with Vanguard to keep Holy Cross open and
23	a Catholic institution.
24	Our company provides health care services
25	to a diverse group of patients and communities

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1	serving 26 hospitals located in five states,
2	including four facilities here in the Chicago land
3	area. We have nearly 30,000 employees and almost
4	6,000 employees here in Chicago that we bring to the
5	table with a broad spectrum of experience from
6	clinical care, operations, contracting, financial,
7	purchasing, finance, human resources.
8	Our company also has a track record of
9	investment and growth. Over the last five years,
10	Vanguard has funded capital expenditures in excess
11	of a billion dollars and we've increased our work
12	force by more than 15,000 employees. We embrace the
13	communities in which we serve and assure that
14	residents never have to leave their communities to
15	have access to the highest level of care and
16	services. This is our philosophy and that is the
17	level of service we provide.
18	While Vanguard may own the physical assets
19	of our four Chicago hospitals, it is our teams of
20	local administrators and medical professionals and
21	employees who own the operations, set the policies
22	and help make these hospitals successful. We bring
23	the same philosophy to Holy Cross because we know
24	this model works and it's worked for us across the

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company in our other markets.

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1	Vanguard has a long track record of
2	success and strengthening the hospitals we own
3	through significant capital investment and thought
4	leadership. This approach enhances their efficiency
5	and, most importantly, improves clinical care and
6	experience with the patient and the patient's
7	family. The communities we serve have seen health
8	care improve as a result of our efforts. Simply
9	put, we don't buy hospitals to maintain the status
10	quo or to close them.
11	We are committed to developing urban-based
12	integrated delivery systems. Therefore, we purchase
13	hospitals as a part of our desire to develop these
1.4	regional systems, to improve their clinical care,
15	enhance the quality of services, increase patient
1.6	experience and grow the number of patients that we
17	actually serve.
18	Our commitment to the Chicago region began
19	in 2000 with the acquisition of MacNeal Hospital in
20	Berwyn. It continued in 2002 with the purchase of
21	Weiss Memorial on the north side and just last
22	summer we added Westlake and West Suburban Hospital
23	to our Chicago land market.
24	I am proud also to be here today to talk
25	about Vanguard's desire to expand the services we

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1	provide in the region through the purchase of Holy
2	Cross Hospital. We share the views of many in this
3	room that this partnership will provide the
4	stability and assurance for Holy Cross' patients,
5	employees, doctors, neighbors and partners that have
6	been missing for a number years.
7	We recognize the critical role of the
8	hospital and the Sisters of St. Casimir have played
9	on Chicago's south side for nearly a century. They
10	have done absolutely amazing work under
11	exceptionally difficult circumstances in the face of
12	some enormous challenges.
13	Holy Cross, like our other institutions in
14	Chicago, is more than just a hospital. It is a
15	community foundation in which many depend. We
16	embrace this responsibility that comes along with
17	owning and operating Holy Cross and continuing its
18	legacy.
19	As you've heard, Vanguard has reached an
20	agreement with Cardinal George to continue operating
21	Holy Cross as a Catholic institution. Under this
22	agreement, the hospital continues to follow the
23	ethical and religious directors of the Catholic
24	Church, provide active pastoral care to patients and
25	be listed amongst other Catholic institutions.

1	Page 18 The Sisters of St. Casimir will be seated
2	in the hospital's advisory board and will maintain a
3	reserve authority on matters of Catholicity. This
4	is something we have experienced. As mentioned in
5	2005, we acquired St. Vincent Hospital in Worcester,
6	Massachusetts. It was a Catholic institution and
7	remains so today. In keeping with that hospital's
8	faithful history, Vanguard entered into a legal
9	agreement with the Bishop of Worcester to preserve
10	St. Vincent's as a Catholic institution. The bishop
1.1	has moral and spiritual authority over the actions
12	of the hospital. This includes insuring hospital
13	operations and practices to conform to the Catholic
14	Church's ethical and religious directives for
15	healthcare services.
16	As part of our commitment to provide
17	spiritual and emotional support to patients and
18	families, a hospital chapel is staffed by religious
19	order priests under the supervision of the Bishop
20	where daily mass is offered and I know the Sisters
21	of St. Casimir visited St. Vincents in Worcester and
22	we appreciate that.
23	Annually, St. Vincent's spends about 2.3
24	million on charity care and almost 300,000 in other
25	community programs. We also own other hospital

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1	systems in the country that have a faith-based
2	history.
3	I served as president and CEO of the
4	Baptist Health System in San Antonio, Texas, which
5	is owned by Vanguard and it has been affiliated with
6	the Baptist General Convention of Texas since 1952.
7	Today, the Baptist General Convention of Texas holds
8	the Baptist Health System in San Antonio out as a
9	model of how you do faith-based care under the
10	Baptist mission.
1.1	Here in Chicago, West Suburban and
12	Westlake Hospitals, which we acquired last summer,
13	both continue to follow the guidelines under
1.4	Catholic health care.
15	In all of these institutions, Vanguard has
16	been able to maintain the religious identities of
17	the hospitals while providing a robust level of
18	charity care, filling strong, reliable community
19	partnerships and providing high level care to our
20	patients, their families which includes largely
21	underserved populations.
22	Vanguard recognizes the role we play in
2 3	these communities. Since 2010, our hospitals
24	provided almost 100 million in charity care and
25	there were 450 million in uncompensated care

1.	nationwide.
2	Here in Chicago, among the region's
3	largest hospitals, including not for profits, a
4	recent Crain's business analysis ranked MacNeal and
5	Weiss in the top percentile of hospitals providing
6	charity here. MacNeal was one of six Chicago area
7	hospitals that pays taxes, but also had a high rate
8	of charity care and public aid compared to the
9	majority of the 20 hospitals in the Chicago area,
10	which are the large not for profits. The same data
11	indicates Weiss also spent more on charity care than
12	half of the area's 20 largest hospitals. We are
13	constantly looking for ways to further engage our
14	work force to improve our hospitals.
15	As mentioned earlier, our one asset is our
16	work force. Here in Chicago our employee engagement
17	scores rank in the 82nd percentile among the Gallup
18	health care database. Our hospitals are proud
19	partners with the communities in which we operate.
20	Our doctors, our nurses and staff serve on the board
21	of neighbored charities, schools, community
22	organizations and religious groups. This is a model
23	that Holy Cross also follows and it is our hope to
24	transition for hospital employees and community
25	partners will be seamless.

1	We believe Holy Cross has a reason to
2	exist and continually to serve the city's south
3	community for years to come. We also believe, given
4	Holy Cross's proximity to other Vanguard hospitals,
5	the countless patients and medical staff Holy Cross
6	shares with MacNeal that there are opportunities to
7	gain additional efficiencies.
8	As the process moves forward, we welcome
9	to opportunity to welcome Illinois Facilities and
10	Services Review Board, appropriate state agencies
11.	and the communities of southwest Chicago to ensure
1.2	the work done by Holy Cross Hospital and the legacy
13	of the Sisters of St. Casimir continues. Thank you
14	very much.
1.5	MS. AVERY: Thank you. We next have
16	Dr. John Ball.
17	BY DR. JOHN BALL: Good morning. I'm John
1.8	Ball. I'm a physician and former hospital executive
19	and I'm currently the vice chair of Holy Cross
20	Hospital Board of Trustees. Due to a scheduling
21	conflict, Dr. Diane Howard, the board of trustees
22	chair, is unable to testify today, so I will speak
23	on behalf of the board.
24	Over the past decade, the over 80-year
25	mission of Holy Cross Hospital has been severely

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1.	Page 22 challenged by the dramatic socio-economic changes of	
2	the communities of which it serves. On many	
3	occasions, the hospital administration has sought	
4	and often received significant state, Federal and	
5	philanthropic assistance to maintain desperately	
6	needed hospital services.	
7	With a dedicated stewardship and financial	
8	assistance of the Sisters of St. Casimir, the	
9	hospital has survived and in some very important	
10	ways become more responsive to community needs.	
11.	However, it became obvious to the Sisters and to the	
12	board that a more viable, long-term solution should	
13	be sought due to the lack of necessary capital, the	
14	likelihood of an increasingly challenging health	
15	care environment and the diminishing resources of	
16	the Sisters of St. Casimir.	
17	After seeking many options for a stronger	
18	and viable partner, the Sisters brought a solid	
19	acquisition offer from Vanguard Health Systems to	
20	the board. This affiliation provides all of the	

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fundamental elements that the board feels are

essential in an agreement that will maintain the

it serves and builds a more financially stable

mission of Holy Cross Hospital for the communities

future.

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	Page 23
1	The Vanguard affiliation will bring
2	improved quality development, necessary capital,
3	more sophisticated management systems, a larger
4	referral network, economies of sale and a more
5	stable environment for both the physicians and the
6	work forces.
7	In a diligent assessment by the Board of
8	Trustees, Vanguard Health Systems has demonstrated a
9	commitment to quality improvement, charity care,
1.0	employee development, solid financial management and
11.	responsiveness to community needs. In addition to
12	making certain that Holy Cross maintains a Catholic
13	identity, all of these elements help to match the
1.4	past hospital mission with future objectives.
15	I'm pleased to state that the Holy Cross
16	Hospital Board of Trustees is happy to support the
17	decision to sell Holy Cross Hospital to become part
18	of Vanguard Health Systems. Thank you.
19	MS. AVERY: Thank you. Next, Dr. Wayne
20	Lerner.
21	BY DR. WAYNE LERNER: Good morning. My name
22	is Wayne Lerner. I've been the Chief Executive
23	Officer of Holy Cross Hospital since October of
24	2007. I'm here today in support of the transfer of
25	Holy Cross Hospital to Vanguard. Since I joined the

1	Page 24 Holy Cross Hospital family, it has been an uphill
2	battle to keep the hospital open. We have had to
3	make very difficult decisions such as laying off
4	employees, suspending OB services, freezing
5	salaries, implementing pay cuts, and drastically
6	reducing the amount of capital improvements just in
7	order to keep the hospital open.
8	The Sisters of St. Casimir have been
9	critical in supporting Holy Cross Hospital through
10	the recent years of significant financial stress.
11	This stress has been caused by, among other things,
12	a large and increasing number of uninsured patients
13	receiving care at the hospital.
14	In 2008, the hospital had only four days
15	cash on hand and was in danger of closing. The
16	Sisters of St. Casimir helped to continue the
17	mission of the hospital by loaning \$2.5 million
18	dollars to keep the hospital open. The Sisters
19	subsequently forgave the loan so that the hospital
20	could use its scarce resources to continue to
21	provide care to the community.
22	In addition to the support of the Sisters,
23	Holy Cross Hospital has relied heavily on the work
24	of its senior management in obtaining both state and
25	Federal funding for the basic operations of the

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1.	hospital. However, to address necessary problematic
2	expansion and facility improvements at the hospital,
3	Holy Cross needs permanent financial support. It is
4	unlikely, given the financial status of the State of
5	Illinois, that Holy Cross Hospital could expect
6	emergency special funding from the Illinois
7	legislature.
8	The sale of Holy Cross Hospital to
9	Vanguard will address these serious financial
10	issues. Vanguard has the operational expertise, the
11	capabilities and the financial capacity to address
12	Holy Cross Hospital's needs. Towards this end,
13	Vanguard has agreed to make a multi-million dollar
14	capital commitment to Holy Cross over a five-year
15	period. With its financial struggles, Holy Cross
1.6	has historically only been able to allocate
17	approximately \$3 million per year for capital
18	improvements. Last year, we had to reduce it to
19	approximately \$1 million in order to preserve cash.
20	The commitment by Vanguard will allow the
21	hospital to make much needed capital improvements
22	and service enhancements. In addition to the
23	capital commitment, as Sister Regina just mentioned,
24	Vanguard has agreed to assume the liability for the
25	under funding of Holy Cross Hospital's pension

1	Page 26 program. This huge liability, also many millions of
1	
2	dollars, has a direct impact on the future of our
3	employees. Without Vanguard assuming this
4	liability, the stability of our long-term employees
5	retirement fund would be uncertain at best.
6	The sale of the hospital to Vanguard also
7	provides our employees with the job security they
8	have not had for a very long time. I'm often
9	approached by members of the staff who voice their
10	concern about the hospital's financial situation and
11.	how long the hospital will be able to remain open.
1.2	Since the sale of the hospital has been
13	announced, many employees have told me that they can
14	now breathe a sigh of relief because their jobs are
1.5	considerably more secure being part of a large, high
16	quality system. The sale of Holy Cross to Vanguard
1.'7	provides Holy Cross Hospital with the resources it
1.8	desperately needs to thrive in this community. The
1.9	Vanguard Holy Cross partnership will allows us to
20	continue our mission of providing compassionate
21	health care to those in our community. For these
22	reasons and many more, we fully support the sale to
23	Vanguard.
24	MS. AVERY: Thank you. Next, we will have
25	Senator Jacqueline Collins.

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1	BY MS. COLLINS: Good morning. I am
2	Illinois State Senator Jacqueline Collins and I
3	serve the 16th Legislative District. For many years
4	I have been a strong advocate for the ministry of
5	the Sisters of St. Casimir and the vital mission of
6	Holy Cross Hospital. The hospital is in my district
7	and, moreover, I am acutely aware of the tremendous
8	health care needs and the frail support available
9	for the nearly half million people that live in the
10	Holy Cross service area.
11	On many occasions over the years I have
12	led coalitions to rally around and reinforce Holy
13	Cross Hospital. At several times, it seemed that
14	the hospital might not survive. Given this dire
15	reality, elected officials at every level of
16	government have come to recognize the multi-level
17	disaster, that failure of this hospital would
18	create. We have acted collectively and against many
19	odds to maintain hospital services and support
20	quality care.
21	The Sisters of St. Casimir have been our
22	trusted and endearing partners in the shared mission
23	of health care. At many times over many decades,
24	the Sisters have put their energy, actions, prayers
25	and financial resources into the fight to both

Page 28 provide necessary services and to work as a 1 religious relentless force for community 2 stabilization, respect and the valuing of diversity. 3 The Sisters' witness has served as an example and a 4 living testimony of the power of faith field service 5 in times of adversity. Now, given an aging 6 membership and lessened capacity, the Sisters have 7 chosen to partner their mission with Vanguard Health 9 Systems. This partnership will keep Holy Cross 10 Hospital a Catholic institution and it will provide 11 the commitment to charity care, faith based ethical 12 standards and the compassionate service we have come 13 to expect and value at Holy Cross Hospital. This is 14 a commitment that will keep alive the faith, value 15 of caring for those who are the most vulnerable in 16 society, the least, the last and the lost. 17 Additionally, Vanguard Health Systems will 18 contribute funding for much needed capital 19 improvements, maintain the jobs of a large, skilled 20 work force and continual outreach for community 21 22 support. I look forward to the continued 23 improvement of Holy Cross Hospital and I strongly 24 support the affiliation. Thank you very much to the 25

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- 1 Illinois Department of Public Health and the Board
- 2 for this hearing and my opportunity to speak. I
- 3 would think assertively, aggressively in support of
- 4 the partnership between Vanguard and Holy Cross
- 5 Hospital. Thank you.
- 6 MS. AVERY: Thank you. Senator Martin
- 7 Sandoval.
- 8 BY MR. SANDOVAL: Good morning. My name is
- 9 State Senator Martin Sandoval. It's a proud day to
- 10 be here today with all of you in the neighboring
- 11 districts that I serve. I represent the 12th
- 12 Legislative District in the Illinois Senate next
- door and I'm here to proudly support the transfer of
- 14 control of the Holy Cross Hospital to Vanguard
- 15 Health Systems. Vanguard's MacNeal Hospital in
- 16 Berwyn is in my district and several of my
- 17 constituents attend Holy Cross, so this hits close
- 18 to home for me.
- Just as a side, it's good to be here with
- 20 the Sisters of St. Casimir. This is home for me.
- 21 Many of you should know that I am a product of the
- 22 Sisters of St. Casimir. In fact, my second grade
- 23 teacher is sitting in the seats here and I would
- 24 like to recognize her, Sister Margaret Zalot. So
- 25 don't blame her for my politics. You can blame her

- 9 student at Maria High School and today there is a
- 10 beautiful school park campus named in her honor.
- 11 She died in a tragic car accident some years ago,
- 12 but she was also a product of the Sisters of St.
- 13 Casimir. My sister, Judy, also a graduate of Maria
- 14 High School, a nurse, a product of the Sisters of
- 15 St. Casimir. And my daughter, Angle, a Junior at
- 16 the University of Illinois at Chicago, an education
- 17 major, a future teacher, also a product of Maria
- 18 High School, a product of the Sisters of St.
- 19 Casimir. So the Sandovals, in large part, owe our
- 20 commitment and our dedication and our spirit of
- 21 social justice in giving to the Sisters of St.
- 22 Casimir.
- 23 So it's an honor to be here in joining the
- 24 Sisters of St. Casimir as they engage in this future
- 25 partnership of Vanguard Health System.. I also

1	would like to recognize our good family friend and
2	leader, Father Pizzo, who most recently served as
3	presiding priest for the funeral of my mom just a
4	few months ago. Father, thank you for being here
5	providing testimony to this partnership.
6	When I testified last spring in support of
7	the transfer of West Suburban and Westlake Hospitals
8	to Vanguard Health Systems, I spoke about my belief
9	in the promises Vanguard made to both of the
10	facilities and communities. As I stand here today,
11	less than six months later, I can probably say that
1.2	I am speaking based not just on promises made, but
1.3	on promises kept and Vanguard is not just talk about
14	what needs to be done to improve its Chicago
1.5	hospital, but they get it done. They get to work.
16	We have already seen increases in capital
17	and investment and community involvement at both
18	Westlake and West Suburban and many more projects
19	are underway. Vanguard's Chicagoland network is
20	growing and people of our city are reaping the
21	benefits as they will here on the southwest side of
22	Chicago. Even more importantly, the transfer and
23	control of Vanguard will insure that Holy Cross
24	Hospital stays open and continues to serve the
25	people of the southwest side.

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1	We cannot afford to close hospitals,
2	particularly, in our most underprivileged
3	communities during these most crucial economic times
4	in this country. The southwest side is a densely
5	populated area with a few hospitals in reasonable
6	distance. This hospital must stay open and will
7	stay open after the approval of the sale and we will
8	make sure that it doesn't close its doors.
9	My experience, along with the experiences
10	I hear about from my constituents every day and my
1.1.	colleague, Senator Jackie Collins, demonstrate
12	Vanguard's commitment to serving working families
13	and the underprivileged.
14	The idea that because Vanguard is a
15	for-profit company, its hospitals will deliver less
16	than charity care and serve fewer Medicaid patients
17	is preposterous and ridiculous. It has been proven
18	wrong time and time again as charity care and
19	Medicaid numbers at each Chicago Vanguard hospitals
20	have either increased or remained the same and
21.	Senator Collins and I continue to keep watch to
22	insure that Vanguard continues to provide charity
23	care to this region and to the constituents here on
24	the southwest side.
25	For both its words and, more importantly,

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- 1 its actions, Vanguard has demonstrated a firm
- 2 commitment to the Latino community, working families
- 3 and the underserved. This is consistent with my
- 4 values and the values of my constituents. We have a
- 5 responsibility as a community to provide quality
- 6 health care to all patients in need. My
- 7 constituents and I have seen this over ten years
- 8 that Vanguard has owned MacNeal Hospital in my
- 9 district and we have seen it in less than six months
- 10 since Vanguard took over West Suburban and Westlake
- 11 Hospitals. We look forward to seeing this same
- 12 dedication when Holy Cross joins the network in the
- 13 coming months. Anyone speak Spanish? I will be

- 18 BY MS. TOWNS: Hello. My name is Thyatiria
- 19 Towns. I bring you greetings from the Office of
- 20 U.S. Congressman Bobby Rush who couldn't be here
- 21 today because he is in Washington D.C. and I have a
- 22 small little testimony about Holy Cross Hospital on
- 23 a personal note.
- 24 I lost my grandmother three years ago and
- 25 I received a phone call to my office saying that my

Page 34 grandmother was sick and she was at Holy Cross 1 Hospital. Immediately, because of the relationships 2 that we have within our office, I picked up the 3 phone and I called Dennis Ryan and I said, I'm on my way, my grandmother is in the hospital and I don't 5 know what's going on because my aunts, they were 6 7 literally all over the place. When I made it to the hospital, I saw my 8 grandmother. She was laughing and talking and 9 saving she had a great time, but Dennis came over to 10 me and he said I want to talk to you outside. He 11 told me that my grandmother, her condition was 12 serious, and she was going to expire. We didn't 13 know the time and day because we don't know that. 14 I can truly say that the entire time my 15 family was at Holy Cross Hospital, my grandmother 16 was so happy with the service that she received 17 until the time when it was time for us to move her 18 down to hospice and I told her that we are going to 19 take you away from this room, we are going to 20 another place and she was so excited. 21 allowed me to bring a little table top Christmas 22 tree. We had her Christmas tree sitting there. Ιt 23 was in December after Christmas, had her tree 24 sitting on her little desk and she said she was 25

Page 35 going downstairs. 1 The ladies in hospice, they gave us a 2 wonderful little book. That little book prepared me 3 of the transition my grandmother was going to go 4 5 through and that transition, everything that was in the book definitely happened. But my grandmother 6 was so at peace, she was so warm and welcomed. 7 entire staff welcomed and just helped my entire 8 family and I know it wasn't because of the position 9 working for Congressman Rush, because being in 10 hospice for about a week, we met like almost 11 everybody on the floor and the entire staff was 12 truly, truly a wonderful welcoming to my entire 13 family. 14 I felt that, once my grandmother expired 15 and she expired on New Year's Eve around 8:00 that 16 night and, once it happened, the family went through 17 their transition, but I was happy because I had that 18 book and we went through the whole process, but 19 that's my personal story that happened with me at 20 Holy Cross Hospital. So before I read the remarks 21 of the Congressman, I just wanted to say thank you 22 to the Sisters of Casimir and all the faculty and 23 staff at Holy Cross Hospital, thank you on behalf of 24 25 my family.

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1	Now, I'm reading remarks from Congressman
2	Bobby L. Rush. Congressman Bobby L. Rush is in
3	support of the transition. As U.S. Representative
4	of the First Congressional District of Illinois, I'm
5	acutely aware of the importance of local health care
6	resources in the many neighborhoods that make up my
7	district. In addition to observing the strains that
8	are already hurting hospitals and communities are
9	experiencing as a result of this nation's deep
10	financial meltdown, I am actively committed to
11	making the necessary and vital communities to give
1.2	the support and the function at their best.
13	The hospital and their services are a very
14	valuable part of the fabric that binds and holds the
1.5	well being of the people of my district. On many
16	occasions, I visited Holy Cross Hospital, taken a
17	keen interest in their mission and joined the
18	efforts with them to become more valuable and more
19	responsive to community needs.
20	I know and have seen the Sisters of St.
21	Casimir and the hospital's leadership reach out to
22	form a new bond with the people that needs their .
23	help and their services. Because of the profound
24	mission and the hospital's good effort, I worked
25	with Federal government to obtain grants and have

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- 1 improved the patient care environment, helped the
- 2 way with safety upgrades and reduced long-term
- 3 energy consumption expenses.
- 4 Over the years, Sisters of St. Casimir
- 5 have stayed in a changing and challenging community.
- 6 They have long been a force of good. Now, as their
- 7 numbers diminish, it is time for them to step back
- 8 and support the new leadership that will continue
- 9 their mission of healing.
- 10 As a strong advocate of Holy Cross
- 11 Hospital's mission, I will continue to support the
- 12 sisters and the community as they launch the
- 13 foundation for a strong future with Vanguard Health
- 14 Systems. And this is just a snippet. The
- 15 Congressman would like to submit additional remarks
- 16 at a later time and I think we should have it within
- 17 the end of the week.
- 18 MS. AVERY: By March 2. Thank you. Next we
- 19 will have Commander John Kupczyk.
- 20 BY MR. KUPCZYK: Good morning. My name is
- 21 Commander John Kupczyk from the Eighth District of
- 22 the Chicago Police Department. We are located now
- 23 in the Eighth District. The hospital is located in
- 24 the Eighth District and I'm proud to say I'm a
- 25 product of the Eighth District. I was born and

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- 1 raised in this district. I grew up in Marquette
- 2 Park.
- 3 I've been associated the hospital. I was
- 4 a klutzy kid. I broke my arm when I was 12 and they
- 5 set it there. I have family and my wife attended
- 6 Maria High School and 40 years later I get to stand

- 14 Holy Cross Hospital has one of the busiest
- 15 emergency departments and receives the most
- 16 ambulances of all the hospitals in the State of

- 19 City of Chicago. I speak for all of the surrounding
- 20 police districts in affirming that we rely
- 21 unequivocably on the close and responsive
- 22 partnership with Holy Cross Hospital, especially the
- 23 emergency room department. That is where the
- 24 majority of people we serve and protect are brought
- 25 for care. It is where our forensic patients are

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1.	often treated. It is also where our own officers
2	and staff are often seen and given emergency care.

14	advocated for resources to keep the hospital
15	services viable for our community.
16	The affiliation of Vanguard Health Systems
17	with Holy Cross Hospital is regarded by the police
18	department as a viable way of keeping this great
19	community asset sustained and strong. In addition,
20	through our deep values for the commitment of the
21.	Sisters of St. Casimir, what they have demonstrated
22	their sponsorship to the hospital and to the
23	community in establishing a stable new future.
24	Thank you.
25	MS. AVERY: Thank you. Next we will hear

Page 40 from Dr. Earl Frederick. 1 BY DR. FREDERICK: Good morning. 2 Dr. Earl Frederick from Department of Emergency 3 Medicine at Holy Cross. Forgive my cold, but I 4 wanted to come and testify in support of the merger. 5 As the officer pointed out, we have the 6 busiest emergency department in the state. It is a 7 place where at any given time critically ill 8 patients, critically injured patients are cared for 9 and treated with care and compassion. However, we 10 have been strapped for resources and, because of our 11 need for resources, this merger makes a lot of 12 13 sense. I've been a former chairman of the 14 emergency department and currently I'm the Regional 15 Director for the Emergency Staffing Group that runs 1.6 the ED. I also sit on the hospital's Quality 17 Committee and chair the Joint Quality Committee. We 18 report to the board on quality initiatives and 19 things that we need to get done from a quality 20 perspective and we've identified the fact that we 21 need additional resources to get a lot of these 22 things done. 23 Frequently, our hospital is subject to 24

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additional patient loads when other hospitals go on

25

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1.	bypass or ambulance diversion where ambulances are
2	diverted to other places and so I just wanted to
3	support on a personal level and also from the
4	perspective from the hospital and our physician
5	group this merger. We think it is very important.
6	Thank you.
7	MS. AVERY: Thank you. Vera Bonds from
8	Commissioner Steele's office.
9	BY DR. BONDS: Good morning. Beautiful day.
10	I am Dr. Vera Bonds, Special System to Cook County
11	Board of Commissioners representing Commissioner
12	Robert Steele, Second District.
1.3	To the Illinois Health Resources and
14	Services Review Board, I am Robert Steele, Cook
15	County Commissioner for the district that is home to
16	Holy Cross Hospital. I would like to express my
1.7	support for the affiliation of Holy Cross Hospital
1.8	with Vanguard Health Systems. The Cook County Board
1.9	is well aware that the southwest side of Chicago is
20	severely challenged with low average health indexes
21	and limited medical resources.
22	Through the recent extremely turbulent
23	economic downturn, already fragile hospitals in this
24	area have seen increased numbers of underfunded

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patients and higher incidence of health and disease

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1	complications. It has become increasingly clear
2	that the best practice health care requires access
3	to capital, sophisticated technology, advanced
4	information systems and more expensive access to
5	medical professions.
6	It is my understanding that the Sisters of
7	St. Casimir, the sponsors of Holy Cross Hospital
8	with considerate foresight, strategically sought and
9	now have obtained a partner to continue the hospital
10	mission into the future. Vanguard Health System has
11	agreed to buy the hospital, invest heavily in
12	equipment infrastructure, staff and community
13	services. In addition, the hospital, while
14	continuing as a Catholic hospital, will be for
15	profit and pay taxes.
16	As the resources available to county
1.7	government become stretched more than then, it is
18	through collaborations like the Sisters of St.
19	Casimir, Holy Cross Hospital and Vanguard Health
20	Systems that improve health care and will be
21	possible. I support this affiliation and will
22	encourage Cook County leadership to do the same.
23	Thank you, Commissioner Robert Steele, Second County
24	District.

2	don't know if I can match all the previous people
3	that came ahead of me. I am Dr. Pierre Wakim and I
4	am the President of Emergency Care Providers, a

7	services to Holy Cross Hospital for almost a decade
8	now and also at Weiss Hospital, which is owned by
9	Vanguard Health Systems.
10	We have provided emergency specialist
11	physicians at both Holy Cross and Weiss Hospitals.
12	The sale of Holy Cross Hospital to Vanguard will
13	provide, in my experience, improved systems,
14	technology and support services and will attract
15	increasingly capable staff.
16	Holy Cross Hospital has one of the busiest
17	EDs and the highest EMS ambulance runs in the state

19	with are both expensive and very complex. In the
20	years that I have been at Holy Cross Hospital, there
21	have been opportunities where better access to
22	capital could have brought improved technology,
23	equipment and systems for more efficient and
24	effective operation.
25	At Weiss Hospital, Vanguard Health Systems

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1.	has been an excellent partner and has assets to
2	provide for improved quality, efficiency and support
3	resources. While deeply appreciative of the
4	generous and dedicated support the Sisters of St.
5	Casimir have given the Holy Cross Hospital mission
6	through the years, I know that the larger and
7	stronger partner is a necessity.
8	I am very happy and I encourage this
9	affiliation with Vanguard Health Systems and our
10	group or emergency specialist physicians is very
1.1	willing to add their strong support. Thank you for
12	seeking professional input in this important
13	transfer. Thank you.
14	MS. AVERY: Thank you. Dr. Satya Ahuja.
15	BY DR. AHUJA: Good morning. Madam Hearing
16	Officer, Ladies And gentlemen, my name is Satya
17	Ahuja. I'm the Vice-president of the Holy Cross

14	of the neighborhood that I am honored to serve.
15	Thank you very much.
16	MS. AVERY: Thank you. Next, is Elba
17	Aranda-Suh.
18	BY MS. ANRANDA-SUH: Good morning. My name
19	is Elba Aranda. I am the Executive Director of the
20	National Latino Education Institute, formerly the
21	Spanish Coalition for Jobs. The National Latino
22	Institute thanks the board for the opportunity to
23	share our testimony today.
24	NLEI is a non-profit 501C3 community
25	organization founded in the late 1960s in response

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to the Latino community's urgent need for equal 1 employment opportunities. Our mission puts us at 2 the crossroads of education and employment for our 3 communities. Our job training, educational 4 programming and work force services include several 5 health care training programs among others. Every 6 year our constituency is equipped with the tools 7 necessary to succeed in an increasingly competitive 8 multi-cultural and service-oriented economy. 9 Through our programs, many have achieved 10 an enhanced quality of life and enjoyed new careers 11 in health care. This affords them the ability to 12 provide better education, shelter and medical care 13 for their families, ceasing the cycle of poverty. 14 These programs would not have been made possible 15 without the support of loyal partners such as 16 Vanquard, Holy Cross and the Sisters of St. Casimir. 17 For many years NLEI has worked with these 18 institutions to strengthen and promote our mission 19 of Latino education through personal involvement and 20 in investment to prepare individuals for working in 21 the health care sector. Vanquard has already 2.2 demonstrated commitment to the communities it is 23 part of and for other hospitals in the Chicago area 24 where the positive effects are undeniable. 25

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1	Since NLEI already has an established
2	relationship with Vanguard, Holy Cross and the
3	Sisters of St. Casimir, the synergy of this new
4	partnership will create an even stronger alliance.
5	I want to share that I can truly speak about these
6	very important partners of this new alliance.
7	I was born at a Vanguard hospital and I
8	was raised and educated by the Sisters of
9	St. Casimir and I volunteered as a teenager at Holy
10	Cross Hospital. I am a product of this community
11	and I can speak personally about the values of the
1.2	institutions involved and it gives me comfort to
13	know that the institutions involved are committed to
14	insuring that the legacy and the values, the values
15	that I continue to hold, Sisters, many of them are
16	here who are part of my upbringing. So it brings me
17	comfort to know that these values will continue in
18	the betterment of our community.
19	Many employees of Holy Cross have .
20	volunteered, including its leadership, serving as
21	support to our organization, to our students, giving
22	community residents an opportunity to participate in
23	many enrichment opportunities including
24	interviewing, receiving counsel from professionals,
25	learning about a variety of health care professions

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1	and the impact of health care training and wellness.
2	Through its health care program advisory,
3	Holy Cross insures assessability of quality training
4	to best prepare disadvantaged Latinos for a career
5	path in this growing field.
6	In addition to understanding the
7	importance of equipping the Latino community with
8	skills necessary to work in the health care sector,
9	Holy Cross has contributed, participated in a
10	special initiatives that support training programs
11	that include not only allied health training, but
12	worker wellness education which promotes health
13	education within the community.
14	Under Vanguard's leadership, Holy Cross
15	will not only improve the range and quality of
16	health care, but continue and expand its tradition
17	about reaching an education among Latinos. In order
18	for our communities to thrive, we must educate and
19	empower its members to work in fields that promise
20	growth. And Holy Cross, the Sisters of St. Casimir
21	in conjunction with Vanguard will do just that, and
22	I urge the board to approve this application. Thank
23	you very much for your time.
24	MS. AVERY: Next is Dr. Dheeraj Mahajan.
25	BY DR. MAHAJAN. Hello, good morning. My

	Page 51
1	name is Dheeraj Mahajan. I'm an internal medicine
2	physician at Lake Hospital and I specialize in
3	geriatrics care. I also serve as the Medical
4	Director for the Geriatric Program Development for
5	Vanguard Chicago market. I thank you all for the
6	opportunity for speaking today.
7	Due to my role overseeing the geriatrics
8	program development for all Vanguard hospitals in
9	Chicago, I think I'm in the great position to speak
10	about the benefits of Holy Cross Hospital that it
11	will enjoy by joining the network. My network-wide
12	responsibilities include geriatric community
1.3	outreach, physician development, inpatient unit
14	development and other senior-related activities.
15	I have been a member of the medical staff
16	at Westlake Hospital for almost ten years and never
1.7	seen our geriatric care in better shape than what it
18	is in today and we have only been under Vanguard
19	ownership for less than six months.
20	The program we are currently developing at
21	Westlake is rooted in all that Vanguard has
22	accomplished at Weiss Memorial Hospital. We have
23	made Weiss the hospital to go for seniors in the
24	area of uptown Chicago. The senior wellness program
25	includes educational sessions for patients to learn

Page 52 about their health care options, free health 1 screenings, senior walking clubs and housing 2 referrals. We have also rebuilt a senior center 3 within the hospital where the geriatric patients or 4 5 the seniors can spend time between appointments. The response from the community has been 6 incredible. Some of the programs that were launched 7 were on a temporary basis and were supposed to be 8 lasting only three months. Due to the high demand 9 and success and good results, nearly all of them are 10 going to be permanent. Some of us actually signed a 11 petition to our CEO at the end of three months to 12 keep this program going. Due to the success, we are 13 now working to replicate this program throughout the 14 network. 15 The development of West Suburban Hospital 16 is nearly complete and we are planning for the 17 18 official launch on February 3rd. Everybody is invited to the open house. The initial response at 19 Westlake has also been extremely positive forcing us 20 to immediately expand our first round of programs 21. 22 and, hopefully, some time in March we will also be doing the open house for the Westlake program. 23 24 By joining Vanguard's network, Holy Cross will have access to the similar program development 25

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- 1 expertise. Having experienced throughout the city,
- 2 I'm familiar with the larger population that the
- 3 Holy Cross Hospital serves on the southwest side of
- 4 Chicago. Under Vanguard's ownership, I'm confident
- 5 that Holy Cross staff will raise their level of
- 6 geriatric care even higher.
- 7 Our growing geriatric program is just an
- 8 example of benefits Holy Cross Hospital will enjoy
- 9 by joining Vanguard network. These other types of
- 10 programs that attract the best doctors in order to
- 11 provide quality care for a growing population of
- 12 patients.
- 13 Since Vanguard purchased Westlake last
- 14 summer, I have already seen measurable increase in
- 15 patient satisfaction and the attitude and morale of
- 16 the entire staff has been improved. Therefore, I
- 17 urge you to approve this transaction so the staff of
- 18 Holy Cross and the community it serves are given the
- 19 same opportunities to enjoy throughout the Chicago
- 20 network of Vanguard.
- MS. AVERY: Thank you. Mr. Brian Lemon.
- BY MR. LEMON: Good morning. Well, isn't
- 23 this something. Thank you for the opportunity to
- 24 testify in support of transferring control of Holy
- 25 Cross Hospital to Vanguard Health Systems. My name

	Page 54
1	is Brian Lemon. I'm the CEO of MacNeal Hospital. I
2	spent 24 of the last 28 years as a member of the
3	management team at MacNeal including 17 years prior
4	to its becoming part of Vanguard in the year 2000
5	and six years following. I've known MacNeal
6	Hospital directly and intimately both before and
7	after its conversion from a free-standing
8	not-for-profit hospital to being part of a
9	multi-hospital, investor-owned system. I also live
10	in the community served by MacNeal less than a mile
11	from the hospital and have since 1990.
12	During the time that I was not at MacNeal,
13	it was a privilege to be CEO of Holy Cross Hospital
14	from 2003 to 2006. I provide this background to
15	help you understand my direct experience and
1.6	personal stake in Holy Cross becoming part of
17	Vanguard.
18	Let me start by saying a few things about
19	Holy Cross Hospital. I think, as you've heard today
20	from a lot of the personal and heart felt testimony,
21	Holy Cross is a special place. During my time
22	there, I experienced the dedication of the Sisters
23	of St. Casimir and their health care ministry on the
24	southwest side. I came to understand directly how
25	important Holy Cross is to the densely populated

	Page 55
1.	communities Holy Cross serves. We cannot let it
2	fall behind the many changes taking place in health
3	care, and certainly, closure of the hospital would
4	be a tragedy.
5	Many people question how Vanguard will be
6	able to stabilize Holy Cross because of this
7	challenge that you've heard today with a very busy
8	emergency department serving many uninsured and
9	Medicaid patients. My experience with these two
10	organizations, Vanguard and Holy Cross, tells me
11	that it can be done. In fact, the improvements we
12	made at Holy Cross during my time there was based in
13	large part on management disciplines I experienced
14	with Vanguard following its acquisition of MacNeal
15	in the year 2000.
16	I also know that Holy Cross is blessed
17	with many talented, dedicated employees who care
18	deeply about the hospital and its ongoing mission.
19	There is no question that a lot of hard work lies
20	ahead. But there is a great harmony between the
21	spirit and philosophy of Holy Cross and the help for
22	life mission of Vanguard. I think our balanced,
23	intense focus on quality and safety, patient
24	experience, employee engagement, community service,
25	growth and financial stability will be successful at

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1	Holy Cross. These and many others are the reasons
2	why I'm confident that Holy Cross will be able to
3	grow and continue to improve as part of our Vanguard
4	Chicago network.
5	I think, as you've already heard today,
6	one of the areas where Vanguard's mission clearly
7	overlaps with the Sisters is our commitment to
8	charity care. By charity care, we mean health care
9	services provided to folks who have no health
10	insurance or inadequate health insurance and cannot
11	pay for the services they receive. This is critical
1.2	when considering Holy Cross is a safety net hospital
13	serving a densely populated, largely underprivileged
14	community.
15	The notion that investor-owned hospitals
16	turns their backs in people in need and refuse to
1.7	provide free care is one of the most damaging and
18	widely held misperceptions out there. Because the
19 .	reality is that hospitals, all hospitals, whether
20	organized as not for profit or investor owned, are
21	organizations of, by and for the communities they
22	serve.
23	Our mission at MacNeal and Vanguard is
24	simply stated. To help people achieve health for
25	life. Critical to our success and delivering on

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1	this mission is that we make a commitment to our
2	communities and key to that commitment is being part
3	of the social services health care fabric that takes
4	care of people in need.
5	Last year an analysis by Crain's Chicago
6	Business examined the rates of charity care provided
7	by Chicago area non-profit hospitals compared to
8	investor hospitals. Crain's highlighted the fact
9	that local investor-owned hospitals provide as much
10	and often more charity care than their non-profit
11	peers. The amount of charity care at MacNeal has
12	actually increased during the years that MacNeal has
13	been part of Vanguard Chicago network. That Crain's
14	analysis found MacNeal was one of six investor-owned
15	Chicago area hospitals to pay taxes and spend a
16	bigger percentage of its revenue on a combination of
17	charity and treatment of public aid patients than
18	was spent by the majority of the areas' 20 largest
19	non-profit hospitals.
20	In our last fiscal year ending June 30,
21	MacNeal provided approximately 3.3 million dollars
2 2	in charity care and I suspect the hospital to
23	provide \$3.6 million dollars in charity care this
24	year. These figures are stated at cost. In other
25	words, the cost of the free care we will provide.

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1	Having had the opportunity to work at both
2	Holy Cross and MacNeal, I know Holy Cross will be a
3	welcome addition to our Vanguard Chicago family.
4	Our values are consistent with one another and our
5	commitments to helping those in need are completely
6	in line. It will be a great partnership and I'm
7	excited to move forward. Thank you for your
8	attention today.
9	MS. AVERY: Thank you. Patricia Lopez.
10	BY MS. LOPEZ: My name is Patricia Lopez.
11	Thank you for the opportunity to speak in support of
12	Vanguard purchasing Holy Cross. I am here wearing a
13	number of hats. First and foremost, as a former
14	patient of both Holy Cross and Vanguard's MacNeal
15	Hospital. I was actually born at Holy Cross
16	Hospital, graduated from Holy Cross School, and now
17	am a patient at MacNeal since Vanguard has purchased
18	it on countless occasions.
19	My first two children were born at MacNeal
20	Hospital. My third child, whom is adopted, quickly
21	joined the family tradition. We took her to
22	MacNeal's Kildare Clinic for her first check-up
23	because of the full faith in the facility and the
24	care and the providers.
25	A year ago I was brought to both MacNeal

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- 1 and Holy Cross under a rather unfortunate
- 2 circumstance. My mother became ill. During this
- 3 very stressful time, the attention and guidance from
- 4 the talented staff of both hospitals were
- 5 indispensable. While she was in and out of the
- 6 hospital for over three months, I knew we were able
- 7 to count on the doctors and medical staff to give us
- 8 the most thorough explanation and trustworthy
- 9 advice.
- 10 MacNeal and Holy Cross are hospitals where
- 11 I know my loved ones and I will receive the best
- 12 care available. I trust Vanguard will help Holy
- 13 Cross enhance and expand its care and service in the
- 14 community. I also look forward to the improvements
- 15 that a partnership with Vanguard will bring to Holy
- 16 Cross, not only the range of quality of services
- 17 they offer, but also an expansion of community
- 18 outreach and development.
- 19 In my professional life, I am assistant to
- 20 Senator Antonio Munoz. I have seen firsthand the
- 21 positive impact Vanguard has on the community
- 22 through MacNeal's participation in our annual toy
- 23 and food drives.
- 24 At one of our holiday toy drives, we had a
- 25 family come in with a four-year old son with

	Page 60
1	cerebral palsy. He could not afford crutches so
2	instead they used sticks. Immediately I called
3	Esther Corpuz from Vanguard. As a result of
4	Vanguard's commitment to charity care, she assisted
5	the family in scheduling a measurement for his
6	crutches and providing him with adequate care. I am
7	happy to say that Philipe now has the proper
8	crutches. Thank you, MacNeal, and, thank you,
9	Vanguard, and especially thank you, Esther.
10	An increase in the hospital's resources
11.	will also be beneficial enhancing the hospital's
12	reputation. I have complete faith Vanguard will be
13	able to stabilize and develop Holy Cross to provide
1.4	its patients with the most advanced level of care.
15	Both of these hospitals have played and will
1.6	continue to play central roles in my life and the
17	lives of my loved ones. I am ecstatic they will
18	soon be part of the same network. I urge the board
19	to approve the pending application. Thank you.
20	MS. AVERY: Thank you. Next is Patrick
21	Durkin.
22	BY MR. DURKIN: Good morning. My name is
23	Patrick Durkin and I am the Chief Operating Officer
24	of Westlake Hospital. I'm here giving testimony on
25	behalf of Patricia Shehorn, the Chief Executive

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1	Officer of Westlake Hospital.
2	My name is Patricia Shehorn and I have
3	been CEO of Westlake Hospital for more than 11
4	years. As many of you know, last year Westlake and
5	West Suburban Hospitals underwent a process similar
6	to the one Holy Cross is going through now to
7	transfer control to Vanguard Health Systems. At the
8	time Westlake and West Suburban faced financial
9	strains in a challenging economy, we hoped then like
10	Holy Cross hopes now that a partnership with
11	Vanguard would ease this hardship and open doors to
12	capital investment and operating capital to keep the
13	hospital open and serve the community.
14	During the process, Vanguard Health
15	Systems made significant promise and commitments to
1.6	improving the hospital and to maintain the highest
17	quality of care. As I stand here today just six
18	months later, I can proudly say that Vanguard has
1.9	kept its promise.
20	Since the sale was completed last summer,
21	Vanguard has already made significant improvements
22	at Westlake and in the Melrose Park community.
23	These are the same types of improvements Holy Cross
24	and Southwest Chicago residents can look forward to
25	in the near future.

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1	Vanguard has made a number of capital
2	investments at Westlake. In addition to cosmetic
3	improvements to the facility itself, we already have
4	new equipment in our cardiac cath lab, radiology,
5	bariatric surgery and ophthalmology programs.
6	Several more capital projects are underway.
7	We have also seen the positive impact of
8	being part of a strong network of Chicago land
9	hospitals. For example, we have used the expertise
10	of professionals at Weiss Hospital to start our own
1.1	seniors program at Westlake. Weiss helped us build
12	a framework of programming that we launched on
1.3	November 1st. We now host lunch and learns once a
14	month, have a senior walking club, offer free health
15	testing and host sessions to help patients
16	understand their medical bills.
1.7	Since the program launched, we have almost
18	170 senior members participating and are
19	consistently expanding the program due to high
20	demand. This program, which would not have been
21	built without the help of Weiss staff, is just one
22	example of network cooperation benefiting all the
23	hospitals involved. We are working on several other
24	initiatives at all four Vanguard Chicagoland
25	hospitals that will help us better serve our

1	respective communities. I am confident that, once
2	Holy Cross joins the network, these opportunities
3	will grow.
4	The transition of Vanguard has also
5	boosted employee morale and instilled a sense of
6	confidence and excitement for the future at
7	Westlake. I recently presented our strategic plan
8	to hospital leadership and reported that we would be
9	working very hard to strengthen and expand services
10	in geriatrics, orthopedics, rehabilitation, senior
1.1	programming and pain management. I looked around
12	the room and all I saw were smiles. One employee
13	who has been at Westlake for eight years said this
14	is the most excited she's ever been about the future
15	of our hospital.
16	We are also experiencing several firsts
17	under Vanguard ownership. For the first time in my
18	tenure, we have a meaningful board made up of four
19	positions and eight community members. For the
20	first time we have a chief financial officer and a
21	chief medical officer. We are also putting together
22	an advisory board of local business leaders who will
23	come together once or twice a year to give their
24	input on the needs of the community and ways that
25	Westlake Hospital can contribute to a healthy work

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1	force. Our first meeting will be held February 3rd.
2	Vanguard is also giving us the support we
3	need to continue and expand programs that are
4	important to the hospital and the people of our
5	community. Our community health and education
6	advisory board made up of Westlake staff and local
7	business, church, school and social service agency
8	leaders is currently planning a simple steps to
9	fitness walk and health screening in May. We
10	continue to provide a dietician in the local schools
11	to help combat childhood obesity and to offer health
12	screenings in partnership with local churches and
13	agencies. Westlake has been a part of over a dozen
14	health fairs providing free screening to over 500
15	members of the community since we became a part of
16	Vanguard.
17	The work Vanguard has done at Westlake is
18	a clear indication of what I believe Holy Cross
19	patents, doctors and staff can expect as part of
20	Vanguard's Chicagoland network. We have gained
21	strength, scale and recognition to help us better
22	serve the Melrose Park, Maywood, Bellwood and the
23	near west Chicago community. In addition, Westlake,
24	along with the rest of the Vanguard network at
25	MacNeal, Weiss and West Suburban, will benefit from

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- 1 the purchase of Holy Cross.
- There used to be a fear that every time I
- 3 held a staff meeting, I was going to announce the
- 4 hospital would close. Now, people are not just
- 5 confident that Westlake will stay open under
- 6 Vanguard's leadership, they are confident that it
- 7 will thrive. The employees at Holy Cross, along
- 8 with all of the Chicago southwest side deserve that
- 9 same confidence. Thank you.
- 10 MS. AVERY: Next we have Sheila Mischke.
- 11 BY MS. MISCHKE: Good morning. My name is
- 12 Sheila Mischke and I'm the Vice-president of Patient
- 13 Services at Holy Cross Hospital. All of the area
- 14 nursing areas and the majority of the clinical
- 15 positions within the hospital are my responsibility.
- 16 The foremost requirement for a hospital is
- 17 quality of care for the patients that it serves. In
- 18 order to have consistently high quality care, the
- 19 hospital has to be able to attract, retain and
- 20 support a great work force. Over the years, Holy
- 21 Cross has developed a reputation for having very
- 22 many competent and committed nurses and support
- 23 staff. We work very hard to keep them with us and
- 24 to attract more. In order to do that, our hospital
- 25 must have the equipment, technology, education,

1	Page 66 support, resources and the benefits that keep us at
2	best practice.
3	A larger organization like Vanguard Health
	Systems will bring the capital, the information
4	
5	systems, best practice experience and shared
6	resources for improvement that will make our
7	hospital a more attractive career environment for
8	both attracting and retaining the excellent nursing
9	and support staff. The affiliation of Holy Cross
10	Hospital with Vanguard Health Systems is a real plus
11	for our continual quest for excellence and for our
12	mission of caring. Thank you.
13	MS. AVERY: Thank you. Next is Warren
14	Brodine.
15	BY MR. BRODINE: Good morning. My name is
16	Warren Brodine. I'm the Chief Executive Officer of
1.7	Chicago Family Health Center. We are a federally
18	qualified health center that operates five sites
19	throughout the south, southeast and southwest sides
20	of the City of Chicago. Our newest site opened just
21.	last year less than one mile from here.
22	Chicago Family Health Center provides
23	comprehensive accessible primary health care to the
24	communities of south and southeast Chicago

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regardless of an individual's race, religion,

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1	gender, age, income or ability to pay. Last year we
2	provided more than 4.7 million dollars of
3	uncompensated care on a budget of just 20 million.
4	The disproportionately high incidence of
5	chronic illness and disease in the Holy Cross
6	Hospital service area makes the partnership between
7	primary care providers, community health centers,
8	specialty providers and the community hospital very
9	important. Through the last year, Chicago Family
10	Health Center has worked closely with Holy Cross
11.	Hospital to expand health care service options and
12	to link care capacity. Together, we can increase
13	community health care services.
14	The strength of Holy Cross Hospital is
15	absolutely imperative in broad success for a
16	healthier Marquette Park community. Without the
17	benefits of a larger and stronger institutional
18	partner like Vanguard Health Systems, it is hard to
19	imagine that the vaulted tradition of the Sister's
20	mission could keep pace with the future needs of
21	investment and change. Chicago Family Health
22	Centers strongly supports the partnership of Holy
23	Cross and Vanguard. Thank you.
24	MS. AVERY: Father Pizzo.
25	BY FR. PIZZO: I'm Father Anthony Pizzo and

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- 1 I'm the pastor here at St. Rita of Cascia Catholic
- 2 Church on the southwest side. I am also the Dean
- 3 for this area of the vicariate of the Catholic
- 4 Archdiocese. The parish serves over 3,500
- 5 households or families in a given area. A large
- 6 number of these families are experiencing
- 7 record-breaking job losses, home foreclosures and
- 8 limited access to affordable health care.
- 9 Thanks to Holy Cross Hospital's efforts,
- 10 three new federally qualified community health
- 11 centers have opened. The hospital's emergency
- 12 department has been expanded and a revitalized and
- 13 newly renovated full service family birth center has
- 14 been reopened in the last two years.
- 15 While it is true that Holy Cross has been
- 16 improving the quality of care, expanding services
- 17 and upgrading technology, we also know that the long
- 18 term financial health of our hospital has been
- 19 perilous. For people that live here, this hospital
- 20 is literally the difference at times between life
- 21 and death. It's where our grandparents go to be
- 22 treated and to be rehabilitated after a stroke. It
- 23 is where many of us will go if we feel chest pain.
- 24 It is where our young mothers will go when a baby is
- 25 about to be born and is a home to a welcoming

1	hospice that cares for families when a young one is
2	nearing the end of life. This is our hospital.
3	Many large and vibrant Catholic parishes
4	look to Holy Cross as a part of our family. We want
	to succeed and to thrive. We want it to employ our
5	
6	parishioners. We want it to support life and
7	provide healing. We want it to carry on the mission
8	of quality and compassionate care of venerable
9	Mother Maia Kaupas and the Sisters of St. Casimir.
10	It is with this desire to sustain and
1.1.	build a stronger community future that we stand in
12	support of the Sisters' affiliation with Vanguard
13	Health Systems. Thank you.
<u>1, 4</u>	And, Sisters, we hope and we pray that the
15	mission and our collaboration with Vanguard will be
16	blessed. Amen.
17	MS. AVERY: Thank you. Next, we have Carmen
18	Velasquez.
19	BY MS. VELASQUEZ: My name is Carmen
20	Velasquez and I'm Executive Director of Alivio
21	Medical Center. We are also a qualified health care
22	center, bilingual and a multi-culture organization.
23	For over two decades we have committed
24	ourselves in our mission and our practice to service
25	the immigrant community including the undocumented.

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- 1. We are in the neighborhoods of Pilsen, Little
- 2 Village, Back of the Yards, some of the people here
- 3 in this community and I have seen a lot of people
- 4 come and go who say they care about us, that they
- 5 care about our community, but when we need them,
- 6 when we need them, they are usually nowhere to be
- 7 found. When we hear about hospitals changing hands
- 8 and companies pledging to invest in our community,
- 9 it is understandable for people to be skeptical and,
- 10 frankly, I'm usually one of them, but this is not
- 11 the case today.
- 12 I am here to express my complete support
- 13 for the pending Certificate of Need application to
- 14 transfer control of Holy Cross Hospital to Vanguard
- 15 Health Systems. I grew up on the southside of

15	comfortable in their roles. We come to work knowing
16	every day we have the support necessary to care for
17	our patients. Having practiced at Holy Cross for so
18	long, I understand the challenges the hospital faces
1,9	and appreciate the incredible job done each day by
20	the staff.
21	I also believe they have the potential to
22	deliver even better care if they are given the
23	access to the types of resources that Vanguard
24	provides us at MacNeal. Those of us at MacNeal and
25	throughout our network are excited about the

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- 1 prospect of adding Holy Cross to our team.
- Every doctor deserves to practice in a
- 3 superior environment that allows us to do our job
- 4 efficiently and effectively. Every patient deserves
- 5 access to a hospital with such an environment. I am
- 6 confident Holy Cross doctors and patients will have
- 7 this opportunity under Vanguard's new ownership.
- 8 Thank you.
- 9 MS. AVERY: Dr. Sandra Vega.
- 10 BY DR. VEGA: Good afternoon, everyone. My
- 11 name is Sandra Vega and I'm an obstetrician and
- 12 gynecologist at MacNeal Hospital. Prior to coming
- 13 to MacNeal, for more than eight years, I worked at
- 14 Holy Cross Hospital until its labor and delivery,
- 15 unfortunately, closed in 2008.
- 16 Having worked at Holy Cross so long, I'm
- 17 very familiar with the southwest side community and
- 18 its challenges that the hospital faces. There are
- 19 few options in the area and many residents have
- 20 limited access to transportation.
- 21 When I was practicing at Holy Cross, many
- 22 of my patients would walk to the hospital in labor
- 23 and it was the only way, it was their only option.
- 24 So for pregnant women in the area, I believe that
- 25 the reopening was vital to the neighborhood and I'm

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1	very happy that that has already happened.
2	There is also a large Hispanic population
3	in the area and, as a Hispanic American, I care
4	deeply about delivering quality care into this often
5	underserved group. Many of my patients were first
6	and second generation Hispanic Americans who
7	appreciated receiving care from a Spanish speaking
8	physician who could relate to them and their family
9	and their culture.
10	If Holy Cross closed or services suffered,
11.	patients like these may no longer have access to
12	quality care in their own neighborhood and would
13	likely neglect their own health. Many of these
14	patients fear going outside of their local
15	neighborhood and seek medical attention locally.

22	BY DR. CULLINANE: Briefly, I will depart

18	at West Suburban Medical Center in Oak Park. I'm
19	honored and blessed also to serve on the Board of
20	Trustees at West Suburban and I thank you for the
21	opportunity to speak.
22	I've been at West Suburban since 1975. I
23	came there as an intern. I've had no prior
24	experience working with a for-profit health care
25	company before Vanguard came in in August. I didn't

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1	know what to expect and I decided to judge the new
2	owners based on what they accomplished after the
3	sale.
4	Less than six months later, I'm very
5 .	favorably impressed by the new ownership. I'm proud
6	to be a part of a new era at my hospital and have
'7	high expectations looking at it. Contrary to what
8	some may expect or fear with a for-profit company
9	like Vanguard, they did not immediately shake things
10	up and sweep people out. Their leadership took time
1.1	to get to know the people at my hospital and began
12	an ongoing dialogue. Vanguard has shown a
13	determination to insure the community's health care
1.4	needs are identified and met.
15	Our new CEO has instilled a sense of
1.6	accountability and responsibility at West Suburban.
17	He's firmly demonstrated his ability to overcome
18	challenges that we face in a straightforward way.
19	This has set a clear direction at our hospital.
20	One great example stems from my new role
21	on the Board of Trustees. We are a quality
22	oversight board made up of individuals from the
23	communities that surround our hospital. Board
24	members are professionally and ethnically diverse as
25	are our communities. I believe we are well suited

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- 1 to make important decisions for our future. Only a
- 2 few members are a carryover from previous boards
- 3 which I think is a sign of welcoming new and fresh
- 4 ideas. So we met just a few months. We've already
- 5 discussed such things as expanded partnerships with
- 6 important community institutions like PCC Community
- 7 Wellness Center.
- 8 I believe people inside and around the
- 9 hospital are all beginning to get an idea of what we
- 10 hope to accomplish at West Suburban. You've heard
- 11 people talk about capital investment and program
- 12 expansion. I will not go back over that. I just
- want to say I've witnessed a boost in morale among

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1	BY MS. WARD: Good afternoon. My name is
2	Karen Ward and I'm a phlebotomist at West Suburban
3	Medical Center. I've been there for 16 years. In
4	my 16 years, I covered a lot of parts and I've
5	touched a lot of hearts. I can truly say that
6	Vanguard was one of the greatest things that I can
7	say happened to us at West Suburban. There were
8	many days that I came to work and I felt like I had
9	weights in my heart and the facility just seemed
10	heavy and dark.
1.1	Once Vanguard came, the lights were on and
12	I could see a way to give the care and I could
1.3	really sense that the patients could tell that we
14	cared. I just want to say to Holy Cross Hospital
1.5	that it's normal to worry and not be sure, but I
16	could tell you that it's all worth what you're going
1.7	to experience once they're there with you.
1.8	We have a CEO, Mr. Jack Cleary. I think
19	he's one of the greatest things that I could have
20	experienced in our transition and I hope that your
21	CEO is as great as the one they gave to us. Thank

23	BY MS. AVERY: Next is Patty Cormack.
24	BY MS. CORMACK: Good afternoon. I know
25	it's been a long day, so I will just say a couple of

Page 87 1 things. I share the same sentiment that I've heard 2 in testimony from people at Holy Cross. West 3 Suburban is not just any employer, West Suburban is 4 my community hospital. I live in my community, so I 5 too was nervous with transition. 2	BY MS. JOHNSON: Good afternoon. My name is
3	Karen Johnson and I'm from Westlake Hospital in
4	Melrose Park. I would first like to take the
5	opportunity to thank you for allowing me to speak
6	about my experiences at Westlake Hospital and why I
7	support the sale of Holy Cross Hospital to Vanguard
8	Health Systems.
9	I'm a supervisor for the Hospitality
10	Services Department and my primary responsibility is
11	to assist in overseeing the food service staff at
12	Westlake Hospital. I have been at the hospital
1.3	since 2001 and I've seen the hospital undergo
14	significant changes which includes the most recent
1.5	transition from Resurrection Health Care to Vanguard
16	Health System.
17	At the time of the sale, Vanguard Health
18	Systems knew that the employees at Westlake Hospital
19	had not received a pay increase in over two years.
20	They promised that the employees would be given a
21	raise by the year's end and, in this past December,
22	they followed through with their promise and all
23	employees received a raise.
24	Additionally, employees in my department
25	and I were concerned about our jobs, years of

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1	service, our vacation time and our extended illness
2	bank. Despite other hospitals closing and employees
3	losing their jobs, Vanguard Health Systems'
4	personnel were very concerned about our feeling.
5	They reassured us that no jobs would be lost, our
6	wage positions would not change and our PTO and EIB
7	would be carried over.
8	Vanguard Systems did everything they could
9	to ease our nerves during this transition. In fact,
10	when some employees expressed a desire to change
11	their health care plans shortly after the
12	transition, Vanguard Health Systems called an
13	unscheduled open session on our health care plan, so
14	that those employees who needed to make a change
15	were able to do so.
16	My team and I are very excited about the
17	commitment to the employees to educate the staff
18	regarding safety, patient excellence and health.
19	This is proven by the programs they have instituted
20	at Westlake Hospital.
21	Additionally, a senior center has been
22	developed for our community.
23	In closing, my family and I are very
24	thankful to Vanguard Health Systems for purchasing

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Westlake Hospital. As a working mom of two small

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- 1 children, my husband and I rely on this income.
- 2 Based on my experiences, I know that Vanguard Health
- 3 Systems will do everything they can to follow
- 4 through with the promises that they make to the
- 5 employees at Holy Cross Hospital and the surrounding
