## Dear Frankfort Resident,

Riverside Medical Center is currently in the process of proposing the development of a Freestanding Emergency Medical Center at the southwest corner of LaGrange and Steger Rd. This type of emergency facility would require 24/7 emergency care, an ambulance bay, and a helipad. This is a highly inappropriate location given its close proximity to so many neighborhoods. To mention, Silver Cross Hospital is also proposing a Freestanding Medical Center at the corner of Rt. 30 Lincoln Hwy/93<sup>rd</sup>, next to the Walgreens and across from Currie Motors—in a **commercial** area and would already have the existing road infrastructure to support such a facility.

## What this would mean to you?

- A major construction project that would include the widening of LaGrange, Steger and likely Wolf Rd. A project of this scale would last until 2015 and would cause traffic issues, noise issues, and safety issues.
- Significantly more traffic and congestion around these intersections after project completion
- Siren noise, helicopter noise and increased traffic noise at all hours of the night once the facility is established
- Depreciated real estate home values to surrounding neighborhoods due to decreased desirability
- Legitimate safety concerns due to having an emergency room and its clientele so close to a highly residential area (i.e. speeding/reckless driving is shown to occur at much higher rates during emergency hospital visits)
