Dear Mr. Constantino:

I am the guardian of Susan Davison who became a resident of Murray Developmental Center at the age of six and has resided there for the past 47 years.

While Toni Paulauski and the Arc are to be commended for their advocacy for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, in their letters and other activities in support of these individuals while also advocating the closure of the Warren G. Murray Development Center. As we all are aware there are degrees of I/DD. Many of the individuals described by the Arc are those who have some mental and physical disabilities but are able to work in sheltered workshops, etc. Unfortunately that is not true of many of the current residents of the Murray Center.

My niece is one of those residents. She is 53 and has the mental age of 6 months and is functioning at a retarded age Level IV. Susan is dependent on the staff for all personal care 24/7 since she is confined to a wheel chair and bed due to impaired physical mobility.

Licensed personnel feed Susan through a feeding tube. When her feeding tube must be replaced, licensed personnel must replace it. Susan also has a baclofen pump, a surgically placed pump, that continuously delivers medication to her spinal cord fluid to loosen overly tight muscles. This pump must be administered and monitored by licensed personnel. Due to her physical condition Susan often requires hospitalization at a nearby hospital where doctors are familiar with Susan's needs.

Murray center is a very clean facility and the staff has provided superior care for Susan since she has been a resident there.

Susan can not receive the level of care she needs in a group home; therefore it is imperative that MURRAY CENTER REMAIN OPEN because of the excellent care and service it provides my niece and other residents of Murray Center.

I am the mother & legal guardian
of Carmen Anthony Pace.

Carmen is 32 yrs old. His
birthday is Jan. 5th 1981.

He is a gift from God.

It took me 10 long, hard years of
trying & trying to have Carmen.
By age 17 months I knew there was a
problem. I had several nieces &
nephews by that time, so I knew
what to look for in him.

When he was 4 1/2 he finally had a
diagnosis of autism with educability
mental retardation. They told me he
might never walk or talk or have
any social skills. I proved them
wrong.

At age 1 1/2 he started to have
aggressive behaviors. He doesn't
understand about sex and never
saw anything related to sex so that
was not a problem.

I kept him home. We tried different
types of ~~sch~~ schooling & we tried
Class B. Within 24 hours in the
CTLAS we were asked to pick
him up as they did not have the
"people" power they needed to care

for him. He stopped talking & stopped smiling, etc). By age 21 I thought he would get accidentally killed by someone because no matter what I did there were times he managed to run out of the house & into someone ~~there~~ closer. He would & still sometimes get "out-of-control" out of nowhere. He can get this way upon waking up in the morning or just sitting doing something he wanted.

At age 21 his 2 yr younger brother had to practically choke him from behind while getting him to stop ripping out my hair & hitting me. He would cry the whole time he was hurting me or out-of-control saying, "I have to stop this", but he just could not.

His brother came to me in tears at age 19 & said "Mom, I don't want to have to kill my brother to save you". I knew ~~just~~ then & there I had to make a drastic change.

It took a few months of checking out CLAS & facilities before we finally found W.G. Murray Center in Centralia.

As much as it killed us, we placed Carmen Anthony there.

~~It~~ It was the best place for him & they showed true caring from day one!

Carmen went into Murray ~~Center~~ Center with having between 20 & 25 aggressions a month.

He will be 33 on Jan 5th. His aggressions have gone from 20 & 25 a month to about 2 or 3.

Change is drastic for him.

Taking his "home" away from him will cause him to regress.

He sings, he laughs, he socializes with the caregivers.

We bring him home ~~3 times~~ every 3 weeks from Wed afternoon to Thursday evening. His dad picks him up & they come to my house & stay. As the time goes by he comes to want to "go back" to Murray Center earlier & earlier.

He loves it there!!

I am begging you with all my heart & soul & being!

Don't Close Murray Center!
Please!
