Access Living urges the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board to vote to close the Murray Developmental Center in Centralia, Illinois. As a Center of Independent Living, Access Living equips people with disabilities with the tools live independently in integrated communities. Access Living offers direct services and advocates on a municipal, regional, and national level on policy that impacts the rights and independence of people with disabilities. A significant disability policy issue in Illinois is the institutionalization of people with disabilities. For generations Illinois has relied on institutions to warehouse thousands of people with disabilities. Institutions segregate people with disabilities, hurting residents by robbing them of independence and community participation. Institutionalization also hurts the broader community because when individuals are shunted away, the isolation perpetuates disability stereotypes and robs communities of the contributions of people with disabilities. In many cases, institutionalization is also unwise economically because in most cases community-based services are less expensive than institutional services. Though the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) mandates that services should be provided in the least restricted setting, Illinois continued to rely on institutions in the decades following passage of the ADA.

The closure of the Murray Developmental Center is part of a broader process to balance Illinois' system of long-term care and rely less on institutions than in the past. As the process moves forward, the Murray closure will not only impact Centralia. The closure will strengthen Illinois' statewide system of community-based services, and will strengthen communities in to which former institution residents move.

Understandably, many residents, family members of residents, and guardians harbor concerns and questions about the upcoming closure. No matter the situation, change typically presents challenges. To address the challenges, the Illinois Department of Human Services Division of Developmental Disabilities is working diligently with each resident, their families, and their guardians, to addresses all service needs. A transition will be developed for every resident to ensure that all residents, no matter the type and severity of disability, will be safe and well served in the community place.

For too long, Illinois has relied on institutional services for people with disabilities. It's time for Illinois to join other states across the country and phase out State Operated



Developmental Centers. It's time for Illinois to ensure that all people with disabilities have the option of community-based services. It's time for Illinois to stop segregating people because of disability. In order for Illinois to take a step forward, it is imperative that the Murray Developmental Center Close.
