St Elizabeth's hospital has been an integral part of this city for over 100 yrs, and it would be devastating to this city, the county seat, to have it closed. It would have a profound effect on the economy and make it much more difficult for patient care for much of the surrounding area - especially for the poor! There is no bus service, metro or other convenient means of transportation to this area. Also Memorial Hospital is building a satellite hospital just a short distance from the proposed new hospital.

They claim to be land locked, but the major hospital in St Louis, Barnes, is also land locked. They wonder not major St. Mary's hospital in Chicago did not move. They wonder where they are!
