EXEMPTION APPLICANT(S):

University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority, University Health Care, Inc. University of Wisconsin Medical Foundation, Inc., SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation, and SwedishAmerican Hospital

FACILITY NAME and LOCATION:

SwedishAmerican Hospital, Rockford, Illinois and SwedishAmerican Hospital d/b/a SwedishAmerican Medical Center/Belvidere, Belvidere, Illinois

DESCRIPTION: The applicants (University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority, University Health Care, Inc., University of Wisconsin Medical Foundation, Inc., SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation, and SwedishAmerican Hospital) are proposing a change of ownership for SwedishAmerican Hospital and SwedishAmerican Hospital d/b/a SwedishAmerican Medical Center/Belvidere. The licensees and operating entities and the owner of the sites will remain unchanged with the approval of these changes of ownership. There is no cost to this change in ownership. The fair market value of the transaction is \$179,500,000. The anticipated completion date is December 31, 2014.

WHY THE PROJECT IS BEFORE THE STATE BOARD:

The applicants are before the State Board because the applicants are proposing a change in control of health care facilities as defined by the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act (20 ILCS 3960/3).

PUBLIC COMMENT:

A public hearing was offered in regard to the proposed project, but none was requested. No letters of support or opposition were received by the State Board Staff.

STATE BOARD STAFF REPORT CHANGE OF OWNERSHIP EXEMPTION

E-050-14- SwedishAmerican Hospital d/b/a SwedishAmerican Medical Center/Belvidere E-051-14 - SwedishAmerican Hospital

I. The Exemption Application

The Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act defines a change of ownership as "a change in the person who has ownership or control of a health care facility's physical plant and capital assets. A change in ownership is indicated by the following transactions: sale, transfer, acquisition, lease, change of sponsorship or other means of transferring control (20 ILCS 3960/3).

The Act also states "The State Board shall establish by regulation the procedures and requirements regarding issuance of exemptions. An exemption shall be approved when information required by the Board by rule is submitted. Projects eligible for an exemption, rather than a permit, include, but are not limited to, change of ownership of a health care facility. For a change of ownership of a health care facility between related persons, the State Board shall provide by rule for an expedited process for obtaining an exemption. In connection with a change of ownership, the State Board may approve the transfer of an existing permit without regard to whether the permit to be transferred has yet been obligated, except for permits establishing a new facility or a new category of service (20 ILCS 3960/6 (b)).

For the applicants to successfully address the exemption to permit for a change of ownership of a health care facility the applicants must provide the following information;

- The name and address of the health care facility;
- The name and address of the applicants;
- The Certificates of Good Standing for the applicants;
- The licensee and owner of the site of the health care facility;
- Outstanding permits issued by the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board;
- Organizational Chart;
- The most recent Audited Financial Statements;
- Evidence of an "A" or better bond rating;
- The complete signed and dated transaction document;
- Contingency language that states the proposed change of ownership is subject to State Board approval; and
- Attestations as required by 77 IAC 1130.520

II. Findings

A. The State Board Staff finds the proposed change of ownership exemption application to be in compliance with 77 IAC 1130.500 and 77 IAC 1130.520.

III. The Facilities

SwedishAmerican Hospital d/b/a SwedishAmerican Medical Center/Belvidere is a 39 bed acute care hospital located at 1625 South State Street, Belvidere, Illinois. SwedishAmerican Hospital d/b/a SwedishAmerican Medical Center/Belvidere provides stand-by emergency services. The table below documents the utilization and payor mix for the past three calendar years for SwedishAmerican Hospital d/b/a SwedishAmerican Medical Center/Belvidere.

IV. The Applicants

The University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority is an academic medical center operating an acute care hospital with 545 available beds, numerous specialty clinics, and four ambulatory facilities providing comprehensive health care to patients, education programs, research, and community service primarily to residents of southern Wisconsin.

Prior to fiscal year 1997, the Hospital was a unit of the University of Wisconsin – Madison (the University). Beginning in fiscal year 1997, in accordance with legislation passed by the Wisconsin State Legislature, the Hospital restructured as a Public Authority, a public body corporate and politic created by Wisconsin Statutes. This legislation provided, among other things, for the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System (Board of Regents) to execute various agreements with the Hospital. The State of Wisconsin (the State) appoints the majority of the board of directors of the Hospital. Based on statutorily mandated relationships with State governmental units, the Hospital is included as a discretely presented component unit in the State's basic financial statements.

Moody's Investor Service has assigned Aa3 to the University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority's Series 2013A fixed rate bonds to be issued by the University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority and upgraded the rating on the University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority outstanding rated debt to Aa3 from A1. The rating outlook is stable. The table below documents the financial position and income for previous two fiscal years for the University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority.

The University of Wisconsin Medical Foundation, Inc. is a not-for-profit corporation. It was created on January 1, 1996, by organizing 14 separate Departmental Practice Plan

Associations (DPPA) of the University of Wisconsin Medical School (DPPAs) into one entity. As a result, the Foundation performs all functions previously performed by the DPPAs. An agreement with the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System was executed upon creation of the Foundation. The organization, operation and distributions of the Foundation are subject to the provisions of the agreement. The Foundation was formed for the purposes of: (1) providing education to medical students, practicing physicians, health care providers and personnel, patients and the general public; (2) supporting medical research in the field of clinical medicine; and (3) promoting the delivery of patient care. Medical care is primarily provided in the southern half of the state of Wisconsin. The Foundation operates exclusively for the benefit of, and to support the purposes and operations of, the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health (the Medical School) and the University of Wisconsin-Madison (the University). The Foundation also provides support to, and receives support from, the University of Wisconsin Hospital and Clinics Authority (UWHCA), which has an affiliation agreement with the Board of Regents of the University. V. The Proposed Transaction

Under the terms of the Transaction, **University Health Care**, **Inc**. will become the sole corporate member of SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation. University Health Care, Inc. has as its two corporate members: University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority and University of Wisconsin Medical Foundation, Inc.

SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation is, and will remain, the sole corporate member of SwedishAmerican Medical Center/Belvidere in Belvidere and Swedish American Hospital in Rockford, Illinois. SwedishAmerican Hospital is, and will remain, the owner and licensee of both SwedishAmerican Medical Center/Belvidere and SwedishAmerican Hospital in Rockford.

Dr. William Gorski, the current CEO of SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation will continue to serve as the system's CEO after the transaction.

Board of Directors

The initial composition of the **Board of Directors** of SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation will be comprised of no more than 25 directors. Two directors shall come from UW Health (comprised of University Health Care, Inc., University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority and University of Wisconsin Medical Foundation, Inc) and the SwedishAmerican Health System's Board will nominate the remaining 23 directors. All directors are to be appointed by University Health Care, Inc. as the sole corporate member of SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation. At least a majority of the directors of Swedish American Health System Corporation will be either independent community members from SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation service area or physician-members of the medical staff of the SwedishAmerican Hospitals. The initial composition of the University Health Care, Inc. Board shall be comprised of nine directors: six shall come from UW Health(comprised of University Health Care, Inc., University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority and University of Wisconsin Medical Foundation, Inc), and three shall come from SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation.

Capital Commitment

During the first five (5) full fiscal years after the Closing Date, the applicants will assure funding for SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation current policy of maintaining routine capital expenditures at least at the level of depreciation, not including depreciation on the \$130 Million of new investments.

The applicants will fund the One Hundred Thirty Million Dollars (\$130,000,000) in program capital expenditures, program investments, and operating losses (collectively the "Capital Commitment"), with the applicants intending that the capital commitment be fulfilled during the first five (5) full fiscal years after the Closing Date. In the event the SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation Board does not recommend and the University Health Care Board does not approve the expenditure of the entire One Hundred Thirty Million Dollars (\$130,000,000.00) before the expiration of the fifth (5th)

full fiscal year following the Closing and/or such expenditures are not completed before the expiration of the fifth (5th) full fiscal year following the Closing, then the applicants agree to satisfy the capital commitment as soon as practicable thereafter, upon the recommendation(s) of the SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation Board.

The routine capital expenditures and the capital commitment will be funded in the following order:

- by SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation operating cash flow;
- from SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation available cash, and
- by additional capital contributions of University Health Care, Inc. or the University Health Care Members.

The obligation of the applicants to fund the routine capital expenditures and the capital commitment is hereby and will be guaranteed by The University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority. Any debt incurred by SwedishAmerican Hospital or SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation to meet all or a portion of the routine capital expenditures or the capital commitment will be subject to the mutual agreement and approval of the applicants.

As long as the SwedishAmerican Hospital (SAH) Master Trust Indenture and Bond Loan Agreements remain outstanding and SAH remains subject to the terms and covenants therein:

- (1) SAH's available cash will not be expended in an amount that causes an event of default,
- (2) SAH's available cash will not be expended in an amount that causes SAH's days cash on hand (as defined in the SAH Master Trust Indenture) to fall below one hundred fifty days (150) (this condition will expire the earlier of five (5) years from the Closing Date or the date on which SAH becomes a member of the UW Health integrated debt structure; and,
- (3) SAH's incurrence of debt will be subject to the debt limitations under the SAH Master Trust Indenture or SAH Bond Loan Agreements.

Additionally, it is not intended that the assets of **SwedishAmerican Foundation** be used to fund the routine capital expenditures or the capital commitment, and therefore SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation's operating cash flow and available cash shall not include any SwedishAmerican Foundation cash or assets.

The transaction document states that there will be no change in the **medical staff and the employees** of the hospitals will continue under the same salary, seniority and benefits as before the agreement.

The applicants (University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority, University Health Care, Inc., University of Wisconsin Medical Foundation, SwedishAmerican Health System Corporation and SwedishAmerican Hospital) provided the following certifications:

- 1. That no adverse action has been taken against by the federal government, licensing or certifying bodies, or any other agency of the State of Illinois against any health care facility owned or operated by the applicants directly or indirectly, within three years preceding the filing of this application of change of ownership exemption,
- 2. Affirm that the applicants intend to cause University Health Care, Inc, to maintain ownership and control of the Facility for a minimum of three years.
- 3. Affirm that the Facility will not adopt a more restrictive charity care policy than the policy that was in effect one year prior to the change of ownership transaction, and affirm that the compliant charity care policy will remain in effect for a two-year period following the change of ownership transaction.
- 4. Affirm that the failure to complete the project in accordance with the applicable provisions of Section 1130,500(d) no later than 24 months from the date of exemption approval (or by later date established by the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board upon a finding that the project has proceeded with due diligence) and failure to comply with the material change requirements of this Section will invalidate the exemption,
- 5. Attest that the applicants have not received any permits issued by the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board and has no outstanding compliance requirements with respect to any permits.
- 6. Attest that the categories of service and number of beds reflected in the Inventory of Health Care Facilities will not substantially change for at least 12 months following the project's complete date

VI. Other Information


Current Facility Organizational Chart
