I would like to take this opportunity to share how essential Herrin Hospital is to the greater southern Illinois community as a provider of quality care for over a century. As a safety net hospital in a region with a 20.8% poverty level, I have always appreciated the organization's mission to provide healthcare to all patients, regardless of their ability to pay. Their organizational values are clearly documented, as Herrin Hospital consistently provides a tremendous amount of charity care via its Health Assistance Program and bad debt write-offs. In fact, during fiscal year 2014, Herrin Hospital's total charity care amount totaled \$14,168,026, an increase of over 26% from 2012.

The hospital's physician recruitment efforts have brought over a half-dozen surgical specialists to the facility in recent years, which has decreased outmigration for inpatient and outpatient surgeries. Ongoing recruitment efforts aim to bring in at least three more surgical specialists over the next 12-18 months. This is especially crucial for low-income and vulnerable families in southern Illinois, particularly due in part to the region's dual designation as a Health Professional Shortage Area and a Medically Underserved Area.

As a legislator whose region includes Herrin Hospital, I can attest to the hospital's commitment to the health and well-being of the communities it serves and look forward to the facility's growth and development in the years to come.

Dear Ms. Avery,

By way of introduction, I am a physician engaged in the practice of Anesthesiology serving the communities of Carbondale, Murphysboro, and Herrin since 1993. During my tenure in Southern Illinois, I have witnessed growth in the health care industry across all of the aforementioned communities, but none as significantly and dramatically as Herrin in the past few years. I can personally attest to the need for the modernization project to better serve our patients. As a result, please accept my letter of support for the proposed modernization and expansion of surgical services at Herrin Hospital.

The dramatic increase in patient volumes is in large part due to a significant advance in surgical technologies- something that was never anticipated when the operating rooms were originally designed. We are presently trying to provide our patients 21st century surgical technology into an operating theater designed for 1950's era equipment. Needless to say, the physical space required for modern day surgical equipment and procedures far exceeds the original design concept of the existing operating areas at Herrin Hospital. The project proposes to not only replace and expand antiquated operating room space, but also update and expand several ancillary areas to surgical services, including but not limited to replacement and modernization of endoscopy and minor procedure rooms, and replacement and expansion of surgical prep and post-anesthesia recovery.

This request comes on the heels of dramatic increases in surgical cases and surgical hours over the last four years in particular. With the successful recruitment of additional surgical specialists to meet the regional health needs of our community, operating room space is well over capacity. At present, the existing operating rooms are sized extremely small by current clinical standards. With the proliferation of high-tech equipment and larger beds that are used today, the lack of space is a significant drawback.

This proposed modernization and expansion will not only reduce outmigration to nearby states for advanced care, but will also continue to meet the health needs of

the regional community, which includes some of the most vulnerable patient populations in Illinois. As a safety net health system, parent company Southern Illinois Healthcare provides a significant level of care to low-income and uninsured patients, with a large portion of that care being provided at Herrin Hospital.

Thank you for your consideration of this most worthwhile project.
