Is it possible for someone to change her future and expand her horizons while never leaving her hometown? I am able to answer this question simply, with one short word, *yes*. I am writing this letter in support and complete endorsement of Herrin Hospital's proposed modernization and expansion project. My health and life have improved exponentially. I am able to attend follow-up appointments and attend monthly support group meetings. I am able to accomplish this because the doctor and the hospital are local.

Dear Ms. Avery,

My name is Cesar Coello. I am a cardiologist who has practiced in Southern Illinois since 1999. Since the beginning of my practice, I have spent a fair amount of time in the city of Herrin and serviced Herrin Hospital for cardiovascular services. In my experience I have seen a remarkable growth of the hospital and services that this institution provides for the community. The community has a large proportion of elderly patients in frequent need of care. In the past, the dominant option for advanced care included being transferred to distant hospitals in St. Louis or Cape Girardeau Missouri, as well as Springfield Illinois, Paducah or Evansville Indiana. The patients and families have a great hardship dealing with problems of caring for the most ill family members in such distant places. Gradually we have seen more of those types of care being provided at Herrin Hospital. This has imposed greater demand from the facility and a need for expansion and updating of its infrastructure.

Due to the increase in demand of surgical services, it has been more difficult to plan certain procedures from my specialty, including cardioversions that require special anesthesia or sedation and even implantation of pacemakers or other implantable devices. Some of these procedures still have to be done at other facilities, which interferes with the fluent care that this community needs. I applaud the decision for the hospital administration to address these issues and make an investment in updating their infrastructure and especially the surgical services. I like to support that effort which is in direct benefit of the community and specifically of patients that receive care at this institution.

This request comes on the heels of dramatic increases in surgical cases and surgical hours over the last four years in particular. With the successful recruitment of additional much needed surgical specialists to meet the underserved communities of this part of Southern Illinois, the demand for increased infrastructure is very intense. Currently, the existing operating

rooms are too small to allow the proper utilization of updated equipment that is needed for the procedures performed at Herrin Hospital.

The proposed modernization and expansion will not only reduce outmigration to nearby states for advance care, but will also continue to meet the health needs of the regional community, which includes some of the most vulnerable patient populations in Illinois. As a safety net health system, parent company Southern Illinois Healthcare provides a significant level of care to low-income and uninsured patients, with a large portion of that care being provided at Herrin Hospital.

After being released from the hospital, I received 9 months of Outpatient Rehabilitation at Herrin Hospital. It was just as amazing as my in-patient care. Because of the care I received at Herrin Hospital, I can now walk, talk and do things that the doctors in Indianapolis said I would never be able to do again.

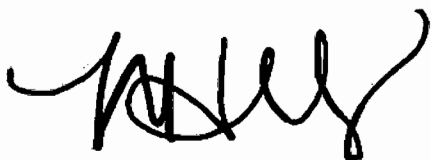
