If I had the opportunity to express in ten different languages the pleasure and honor that I am experiencing as I write this letter of support for Dr. Zahoor Makhdoom and Southern Illinois Gastrointestinal Endoscopy Center, LLC, there would still not be enough time or enough translators for me to express Dr. Makhdoom's concern and commitment to the southern Illinois region's health care.

It comes as no surprise to me that Dr. Makhdoom sees the need to establish a licensed endoscopy center in the city of Carbondale for people who are dire in need of medical services that too often, they cannot afford. Simply stated, the demographics of this region dictates that there are many people who are in need of this kind of professional health care and because of their limited income many do not receive services. The mere thought of going to a hospital and all of the additional expenses connected to the service, becomes overwhelming and therefore, help is not always sought. Are services available? Yes. Can they afford it? No.

This is why I can state in plain English that Dr. Makhdoom recognizes that there are those in need of appropriate health services that he is willing to provide to them without astronomical costs to them. If he were to establish a licensed endoscopy center, I am positive that so many people in the area would benefit from his magnanimous gesture.

I feel so strongly about his undertaking of this center, because his heart is in the right place and he and his family are tremendously concerned about the people in the community. This is not just another money-making project that he wants to do. It is so much a part of his daily concern and commitment that he has for others and I must say this is not always evident in

A center that is not threatening to its clients and fees that are not astronomical just might prevent long-term illnesses and death. I think that this is what Dr. Makhdoom envisions as he applies for the opportunity to serve the community in just another way of helping others.

When you make a decision about whether he receives this opportunity, think about a man who constantly thinks about his community and how he can make it a better place for those who have as well as for those who do not have.
