Dear Ms. Avery:

I write in strong support of the University of Chicago Medical Center's plan to increase access to care for patients on the south side of Chicago. The plan includes a new adult emergency department, new inpatient beds to serve seriously ill patients, and a level I adult trauma center.

While the medical center serves patients from around the world, it is a local hospital to those who live on the south side, and one to which our community wants and deserves greater access. When illness strikes patients on the south side, UChicago Medicine is often the first choice for care, particularly when the illness is serious. The plan for new beds will allow the medical center to meet the growing need for inpatient care at the hospital.

Beyond affecting patients on the south side, existing capacity constraints harm our entire community health care system. Our community hospitals regularly seek to transfer their most complex cases to UChicago Medicine. But capacity constraints limit UChicago Medicine's ability to accept the patients from these community hospitals.

The addition of a level 1 adult trauma center has been identified as a critical need by many in our community. Roughly half of all Chicago trauma cases occur on the south side of Chicago, but there is currently no south side adult trauma center. The addition of a trauma center will be a great asset for our community.

UChicago Medicine has worked collaboratively with the whole community to identify the unique health care needs of south side patients. They have developed an integrated plan to meet needs in the service areas where the need is greatest: emergency care, specialized medicine and Level 1 adult trauma care.

I urge you to approve the plan that will allow the Medical Center to proceed with an important investment in our community.
