Elyssa's Mission® provides resources to help prevent teen suicide. The Northbrook-based organization was founded in 2006 in honor of Elyssa, a bright, gifted and outgoing girl who bravely but unsuccessfully battled posttraumatic stress disorder and depression. Elyssa's Mission provides hands-on support to area public and private schools and community organizations in order to educate students, staff and parents on how to recognize and assist those teens most at-risk. We have helped educate over 100,000 students since inception.

Elyssa's Mission funds and implements the evidence-based SOS Signs of Suicide® Prevention Program in close to 90 area-wide middle and high schools. The SOS program informs teens that depression is a treatable illness, and empowers them to seek help from a trusted adult if they are concerned about themselves or a friend. As a crucial next step, students complete the program's life-saving screening tool that enables school staff to identify at-risk students and link them to services.

We compile outcome data annually from our partnering schools in order to track referrals stemming from the SOS program. During the 2014-15 school year, out of 18,885 program participants, 1,053 students were ultimately referred on for further evaluation and/or services. Specifically, 355 students


were recommended for community-based mental health services, and 35 students were hospitalized. In fall of 2015, we brought the program to 41 schools (with many more on the horizon for winter and spring). Our current data reflects that, already this school year, 285 students have been referred on for community-based mental health services, and 46 students have been hospitalized. These numbers, while significant, do not begin to capture the mental health issues that emerge among students within all of our partnering schools, many of which make multiple referrals (in some cases 20-30, or even more, a year) to behavioral health hospitals.

Given our location, we partner with a number of middle and high schools in and around the Northbrook area (e.g. Field Middle School, Wood Oaks Junior High, Glenbrook North High School, Glenbrook South High School, Attea Junior High, just to name a few). In addition, we frequently receive phone calls from local parents looking for resources--oftentimes inpatient psychiatric care. We have therefore seen firsthand the high need for quality inpatient treatment services for adolescents in Northbrook.

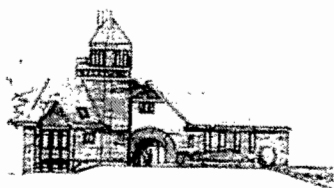
I urge you to support the approval of US HealthVest's application for a behavioral hospital in Northbrook. There is a great need in the area to expand behavioral health services.

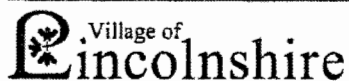



Mathers Clinic is a Mental Health and Substance Abuse Clinic with 4 locations. Our Psychiatrists and Clinicians provide services to children, adolescents, adults and seniors. Inpatient hospitalizations are sometimes the only safe choice for our clients and their families. Hospitals often do not have beds available or do not believe they have the resources to handle complex cases. In trying to hospitalize clients I have needed to contact multiple facilities and spend many hours attempting to find a hospital bed and end up with nothing and sometimes being expected to wait several days. This is not an option in emergency situations. Behavioral Hospitals provide the safety and experience needed for this population.


Persons who live in Northbrook and the surrounding communities often have trouble accessing psychiatric services near their home because of the lack of inpatient beds in the area. Frequently patients from Northbrook and surrounding communities have to be transferred to hospitals far from their homes because there are no open beds in the area. Highland Park Hospital has a small unit for adolescents and young adults. Glenbrook has no inpatient psychiatric services and neither does Skokie Hospital. Evanston Hospital has a small adult unit and is usually full.

The need for additional inpatient psychiatric beds is critical. There are very limited child/ adolescent beds as well as even more limited geriatric beds in metro Chicago. Of course, there is always a need for adult beds. Often I have to transfer a patient who lives in the northern suburbs to a hospital in Oak Lawn, Naperville, or Glendale Heights. This puts additional stress on the patient as well as the family. The patient is far from home and the family are often unable to visit because of the great distance they have to travel to get to the hospital that the patient has been transferred to.

I have been working with US Health Vest's local hospital, Chicago Behavioral Hospital since they opened. I frequently transfer patients to them when our beds are full or if a patient's insurance is out of network for us. They have worked very hard to develop a strong collaborative relationship with us and we look forward to continuing to work with them in the future.

I urge you to support the approval of US Health Vest's behavioral hospital and thank you for your assistance in providing access to care.
