Dear Ms. Avery:

I am writing to express my strong support for Project 16-057. This permit will approve the renovation of both the General Intensive Care Unit and the inpatient Behavioral Health Unit at Mercy Hospital.

I am a Board Certified physician in Critical Care and Pulmonary Medicine and have received my medical training at the University of Illinois, Northwestern University, and Rosalind Franklin University. I have been on staff at Mercy Hospital as an intensivist and served as Director of the General Intensive Care Unit and Director of Critical Care Service since 2010. Prior to coming to Mercy Hospital, I had served as Director of the Medical Surgical Intensive Care Unit at the University of Illinois Hospital in Chicago for 15 years.

Long before my recruitment by Mercy the General Intensive Care Unit located on the first floor, constructed in 1968, has been in dire need of replacement. Among the most pressing problems affecting patient care are: 1) the extremely small size of the patient rooms and the difficulty in accommodating essential medical equipment; 2) existence of several two bed critical care rooms; 3) lack of isolation rooms; 4) and the absence of adequate support areas for nursing and ancillary staff. In addition, the 50-year old physical plant is simply inadequate for providing patient care in a contemporary medical setting.

Just as important, if not more important, is that the aspect of the project will increase the number of General Intensive Care beds. The project will redistribute the Hospital's current 30 intensive care beds such that our complement in the General Intensive Care Unit will increase from 14 to 19 beds. Note that the General ICU's experienced occupancy has been exceptionally high, consistently around 80% or higher, during the last 5 years. The rate is 20% higher than the Board's target occupancy rate of 60%. However, what these numbers fail to show is the additional demand or latent demand for general ICU beds on an hourly or daily basis by



patients that are deflected or boarded elsewhere due to lack of bed availability. Routinely, patients in need of a General Intensive Care bed are boarded in the Emergency Department and the Post-Operative Care Unit. This is almost a daily occurrence.

I am convinced that once the unit's deficiencies are corrected and the number of General ICU beds expanded, that the number of patient's served will increase significantly. This is largely due to the following:

- The latent demand for General ICU beds will be accommodated with those patient days being appropriately reflected in the ICU.
- The aging of the Hospital's service area population. Studies conducted show that Mercy's ICU services are provided disproportionately to our patients 65 and over. This segment of our patient population is increasing significantly.
- The modernization of the General ICU as well as desired reduction of beds will result in both critical care units at Mercy operating more effectively.

This project will provide for both the renovation and expansion of beds for our General ICU services. As such it will provide an appropriate setting for care and number of beds for our patients for the foreseeable future. It will help me and my staff to continue to provide the highest quality of service to those we care for.

In your consideration of the requested Certificate of Need (CON) please review the following safety and clinical care improvements this renovation project will allow for the Behavioral Health (BH) Department at Mercy Hospital and Medical Center.

The plan includes a de-centralized nursing care delivery model which will bring the staff closer to the patients. This increased physical proximity, of staff to patients, allows for improved observation and timely responsiveness to the patient's needs. This design feature was modeled after Mercy Hospital in Grand Rapids Michigan. Since implementation of this model they have reported Behavioral Health restraints decreased from greater than 500 hours per year to 50 hours per year. This positive clinical outcome is very important for the safety of the patients and staff.

Our current BH unit is outdated and in need of improved safety features. The proposed design includes multiple safety features unique to Behavioral Health clinical needs including alarm systems, cameras and pressure sensitive alarms on doors. The safer environment decreases the risk of a patient committing suicide or harming another person while receiving treatment on our unit.

The newly designed environment is able to significantly improve safety while providing a welcoming and respectful tone. It has been shown that minimizing institutional experiences for patients improves the safety of all.

The updated environment will promote recruitment of more psychiatrists which is very challenging with a dated environment of care.

Mercy Hospital and Medical Center is committed to treating the very vulnerable person in need of BH inpatient services with safe, respectful and clinically excellent care. This renovation project will greatly assist in this goal. Thank you for your consideration of Mercy Hospital and Medical Center's CON request and of these clinical care issues this renovation will allow us to improve.
