As a Director for Denman Services and an employee of Blessing Health System, I oppose CON 18-042.

The proposed CON is a duplication of services. Opening an additional surgery center will come at a cost far greater than possible new business generated. The current surgery center owned by Blessing and managed/operated by Quincy Medical Group is not near capacity. An additional surgery center will take business from the existing center.

Loss of revenue puts Blessing Health Systems' ability to provide services to the under insured (and none insured) community members at risk. For example, many services, such as behavioral health, are not reimbursed at a level covering costs. Other facilities offering mental health services in our region have closed. Duplicating services by building another surgery center puts our community is at risk of losing the services Blessing provides as part of its mission.

Blessing currently provides a \$62 Million community benefit, which includes \$6 Million in charity care. Blessing is important to the Quincy region, as 100% of the profits are reinvested to benefit our community. The long-term impact of duplicating surgery center services puts this community benefit at risk.

I have personally witnessed Blessing assisting our Denman customers by paying for medical equipment or supplies needed when there is no other payer source. This proactive approach helps save healthcare dollars in the long run. Without profits to re-invest in equipment/technology and back into our community, countless individuals could go unserved.

I respectfully ask that the Health Facilities and Review Board deny CON application 18-042 requested by Quincy Medical Group, as it will be detrimental to our Quincy community by duplicating existing services. The current surgery center's capacity is so low, duplicating those services will have a long-term negative impact on our community.

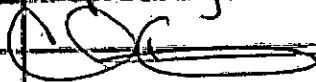

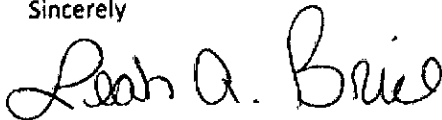
Dear Ms. Avery:

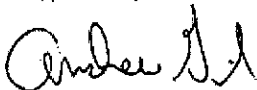
My name is Andrew Griesbaum, and I am a Recruiter with Blessing Health System. This project concerns me from a couple different angles, and I am opposing the above referenced project.

The first reason I object to the CON submitted by QMG is because I don't feel our community can support two separate surgery centers. Not only do I hear that the current surgery center is not operating at capacity, but the Quincy area is having difficulty finding skilled workers to staff the current medical facilities in town. We are finding it increasingly difficult to attract the talent needed, and based off data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics this is not going to change for quite some time. If anything force Blessing Health System, and Quincy Medical Group to find common ground on a cooperation that would benefit the community.

The second reason I object to the CON submitted by QMG is because of the amount of financial support that Blessing provides to the community and surrounding areas. The way I understand is that if the CON gets approved this will negatively affect the financial support that Blessing is able to provide. A family member of mine was fortunate enough to directly experience this support when her spouse passed away. She and her family incurred a significant amount of medical expenses while her husband was in the hospital fighting cancer, and they were under insured. We already have a surgery center serving the community owned by Blessing Hospital and managed by Quincy Medical Group. Normally, I believe that competition is good because it keeps market pricing low. Unfortunately, in this case I don't think that is what this new center would do for our community. I believe it would send money that is currently being used towards the community by Blessing out of the area. Blessing is a non-profit organization that keeps funds locally. This new center would be 40% owned by a for-profit company in another state.

Another concern I have is that I don't believe the two entities have tried hard enough to work together on the existing surgical venture. If we need a new surgery center as a community then how come the existing surgery center is not operating at maximum capacity? If cost is causing people to go elsewhere then the two groups (QMG and Blessing) should first be asked to see what can be done to lower costs and keep people locally.

My name is Steve Felde. I am a lifelong Illinois resident, a 36-year resident of Quincy and a 28-year member of the Blessing Hospital staff. The purpose of this letter is to state my opposition to the above-referenced CON project.

I believe in competition. However, I know that competition does not, in all cases, deliver the desired results of lower costs and higher quality for the consumer. In the case of the establishment of a for-profit outpatient surgery center in Quincy, that would compete with the existing non-profit center, it would drain resources from Blessing Hospital that are needed to deliver Safety Net services that our community desperately needs. These services include inpatient care and trauma care. Only Blessing Hospital provides those services in a 100-mile radius.

In addition, establishment of a second surgery center would be an unnecessary duplication of services, as Blessing Hospital and Quincy Medical Group have partnered for more than a decade in the operation of a successful, non-profit outpatient surgery center in Quincy.

I very much would like to see, with the urging of the members of the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Planning Board, Quincy Medical Group and Blessing continue to work together to refine the operation of the current center to enhance service the community. 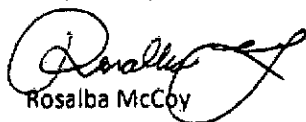

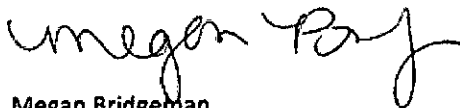

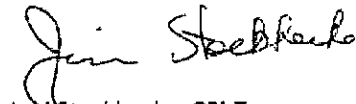

My name is Nila Catron and I work for Blessing Hospital in Quincy, IL. As an employee of Blessing Hospital, I wanted to relay my opposition to CON 18-042.

Below are my reasons for opposing CON 18-042:

1. I feel that this would be a duplication of services to the people of the greater Quincy community. Blessing Health System acquired the current surgery center from QMG more than 10 years ago. In my experience in working with the hospital's surgery system, I have seen cooperation between Blessing employees and the QMG leadership that manages that surgery center.
2. The current surgery center is not even running at full capacity, so I do not see a need for an additional outpatient surgery center in this area.
3. Much of the revenue that is generated from outpatient surgery at Blessing is used to help support Safety Net services that Blessing Health System provides to the region. If QMG is allowed to open their own surgery center, that would take much the money that provides much needed charity care to our region.
4. As a not for profit organization, Blessing provides financial support for medical education to the following organizations: Blessing-Rieman College of Nursing & Health Sciences and the SIU Family Medicine Residency Program. The loss of outpatient surgery revenue would cut funds to those organizations.

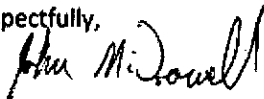
I must oppose this CON application.

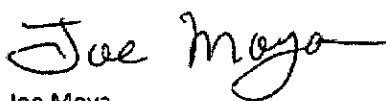

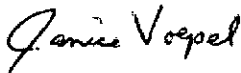

My name is Jim Conboy. I am the Director of Hospice, Palliative Care and Clinical Ethics for Blessing Hospital in Quincy, IL. This hospital has a 140 year history of delivering essential health care services to the community, providing community benefits and services not available by other providers.

The duplication of services proposed by this CON is not needed and will serve to raise health care costs in Quincy and the surrounding community who rely on health care services available. Currently the surgeon suits and cath lab resources are not utilized to capacity. Increasing available resources will drive up costs. When volume is limited and resources are increased, more costs are incurred. This will serve to reduce the financial resources available to provide safety net services, such as behavioral health services and hospice care that are important to serve the mission of Blessing Hospital - to improve the health of the community we serve. From an ethical perspective, when resources are used for duplicative services, justice and the fair distribution of available resources is not honored.

In closing I respectfully ask that the Health Facilities
and Service Review Board deny CON application 18042
for the Quincy Medical Group Surgery Center. Thank you

Dear Ms. Avery:

My name is Chaka Jordan, and I am the Vice President of Marketing and Planning for the Blessing Health System. As Vice President of Marketing and Planning, my job includes analyzing the community's demographic data including the population, socioeconomic, and utilization data for planning purposes. For this reason, I am writing to express my opposition to CON 18-042.

The population of Quincy and surrounding area is expected to remain flat over the next five years, with a slight decline (0.6%) expected. The unique thing about the population of Quincy alone is that it has remained flat for the past several decades, going back to 1940. The fact that there is no anticipated growth of the population of this region, and the demographic is older than the national population is troublesome for QMG's case of anticipated growth for their proposed surgery center. The same physicians will be performing the same procedures as they always have performed, so I am unclear on where they anticipate the growth coming from.

Furthermore, my knowledge of the socioeconomic demographic of the region has me further concerned regarding the risk to eroding Blessing Health System's revenue from the existing surgery center, which is used to reinvest in the communities we serve. While the unemployment rate of Adams County is low at less than 4%, economic challenges still face members of our community. A report published by Illinois Kids Count outlined statistics as it relates to the poverty experienced by children in our community including:

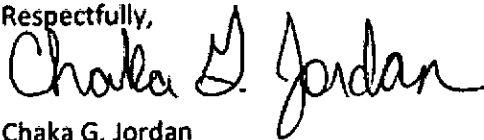
- The child poverty rate in Adams County rose from 12 percent in 1999 to 21 percent in 2015. It rose from 14 percent statewide to 21 percent.
 - Nine percent of children in Adams County were in deep poverty -- below 50 percent of the federal poverty level -- in 2012 compared to less than 5 percent in 1999.
 - Adjusted for inflation, the median family income in Adams County dropped 4 percent, compared to 11 percent statewide.
 - In 2013, 26 percent of households with children in Adams County received Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits, compared to 21 percent statewide
 - In the 2012 tax year, 5,400 households in Adams County, or 18 percent of income tax filers, qualified for the earned income tax credit.
 - Medicaid and related program enrollment increased 41 percent between 2005 and 2013.

The safety net and community benefit services that Blessing is able to offer the community is tremendous to the well-being of the residents of our area. A risk in a significant reduction of this, would be detrimental to the community.

Furthermore, I am impressed and appreciative that Blessing offers Psychiatry and Trauma services to a community of this size. Coming from a rural area in North Carolina with a similar sized hospital in my hometown, Behavioral Health and Trauma services were not available from our local hospital. Individuals who needed such services would have to travel to larger metropolitan areas to receive the care which meant oftentimes, the convenience of have family nearby to visit was not a possibility. The residents of our communities are able to stay close to home to receive needed services, which aids in their loved ones recovery.

The proposed QMG surgery center is a duplicative service that is not justified due to no anticipated growth in our region. For this reason, I respectfully ask the the Health Facilities and Services Review Board deny CON application 18-042, the proposed Quincy Medical Group Surgery Center. Dear Ms. Avery:

My name is Allison Burkhardt and I am both a patient and employee of Blessing Health System. I am strongly opposed to the Quincy Medical Group CON 18-042. I oppose the CON for the following reasons:

Damage to the Safety Net and Community Benefit programs and services: Much of the revenue Blessing generates from outpatient surgery is used to fulfill its not-for-profit mission of providing Safety Net services to the region. These Safety Net services include behavioral health care and trauma care. The Institute of Medicine defines the health care safety net as those providers who organize and deliver a significant level of health care and other related services to uninsured, Medicaid, and other vulnerable populations. The health care safety net is vital to the health of our communities and Blessing is the only provider in the region who offers these critical services. Insurance reimbursement does not provide adequate support for the delivery of inpatient behavioral medicine and trauma care. Opening a second surgery center would result in a loss to the current surgery center of nearly 12,000 cases and revenue of \$25-\$41 million. A significant portion of that revenue is needed by the community to keep Safety Net services operational

Additionally, as a non-profit healthcare provider, Blessing provides financial support to the education of healthcare professionals (*Blessing-Riemann College of Nursing & Health Sciences and the SIU Family Medicine Residency Program, an award-winning program that provides specialty training to new family physicians*); and charity care to those in need of healthcare, regardless of their ability to pay. While these are not Safety Net services, these are important community benefit investments, programs that cannot sustain themselves financially and rely on Blessing's support. The loss of outpatient surgery revenue threatens these and other community benefit programs.

UnityPoint, Quincy Medical Group's Des Moines, Iowa-based business partner, would be a 40 percent owner of the proposed surgery center. Therefore, a portion of the profits from the proposed center will leave the Quincy area.

I respectfully ask that the Health Facilities and Services Review Board deny CON application 18-042 and encourage existing health facilities to work together. Thank you for your consideration.

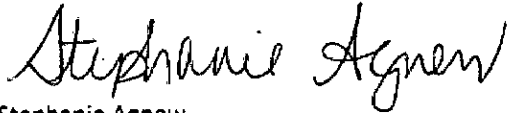
Hello, my name is Stephanie Agnew. I work for Blessing Health System as a Registration/Scheduling Specialist in the Surgery Department. I do all of the scheduling for Blessing Health System, QMG Surgery Center, and GI center both inpatient and outpatient. This CON 18-042 QMG proposal would be a duplication of services that are already provided as a team between QMG/Blessing Health System as we already offer outpatient surgery on the QMG campus. QMG had previously owned the outpatient surgery center and Blessing Health System bought it to assist them with services. Blessing owns the service and QMG manages the center. It has been a successful arrangement for more than a decade now and if they open this new business Blessing Health System would have no role in the proposed project. We do not have a big enough need to have a second outpatient surgery center in place. Also, much of the revenue that Blessing Health System receives from the outpatient surgery is used for not for profit mission providing safety net services to the local region. Opening the second surgery center would result in the loss of the current surgery center, around 12000 cases and up to \$41 million dollars, in which we need to keep the safety net services operational. It would also need to be concerned with the total job loss that would create if it is chosen to open this second outpatient surgery center. Blessing Health System could lose approximately 400 jobs- 12% of the employee body through the loss of its significant portion of the outpatient surgery business. The community deserves cooperation between QMG and Blessing Health System. The key to this is to continue cooperation between QMG/Blessing Health System in the delivery of key services being that's what would be in the best interest of the communities. It has been a very successful cooperation with the current Surgery center and Cancer center. Blessing Health System wants to continue working with QMG, not to be put in a position to work against them in improving the health of our communities.

I am concerned that this will greatly affect my job and many others within the Surgery/Outpatient Surgery facilities if they go through with the Quincy Medical Group Surgery Center. If this project goes through, that will eliminate a great deal of my daily tasks at my job by taking away the need for me to schedule the Outpatient surgeries for the patients, as I do the scheduling for Blessing Health System inpatient and outpatient surgeries, QMG Surgery Center outpatient surgeries and the GI

center patients. I work very closely with the Surgeons/Nurses of QMG and Blessing Health System and I think that we work quite well together and accommodate to their needs the best of our abilities. They are being untruthful in their need of another facility due to hours and accommodations for the surgeons.

I respectfully ask that the Health Facilities and Services Review Board deny the Quincy Medical Group Surgery Center. Thank you for your consideration.

I am Jessica Wilson LPN, assistant instructor in the Educational services department for Blessing Hospital. I have worked for the blessing health system for 7 years, in several capacities, under different umbrellas of the organization. I am also a Quincy resident and taxpayer. I am opposed to the above-mentioned surgery center CON for the following reasons. Significant probability of loss of stable, higher paying employment; loss of financial gain for the communities of Quincy and the surrounding areas; and critical loss of community health care for other services.

Just four short years ago, I was admitted to the hospital in severe pain. Spending 2 days in our facility treated for pancreatitis. A bad diabetic, I needed a lot of care at the time, and after care. I racked up thousands of dollars in medical bills, and tests. Blessing hospital stepped in. Even though I had insurance and gainful employment, I could not afford to pay the bills on my own. Blessing Hospital wiped out my bill, and gave me additional help afterwards. They currently offer free diabetic medications through my insurance. I am proud to say I am managing my diabetes, and taking my medication just prescribed. Blessing did that for me. It cemented my commitment to the organization, and my career at Blessing. I am just one person with one story. Blessing has opened up opportunities for me that I could never imagine. I love coming to work and being a part of our society. Blessing does this for thousands of people in different capacities.

Our patients will suffer if we have to reevaluate our ability to offer mental health facilities, and services. Underinsured and uninsured will have a harder time trying to get approval for help with medical bills. Blessing gave an upwards of 60 million dollars back to the community which included wiping out medical bills for patients just like me.

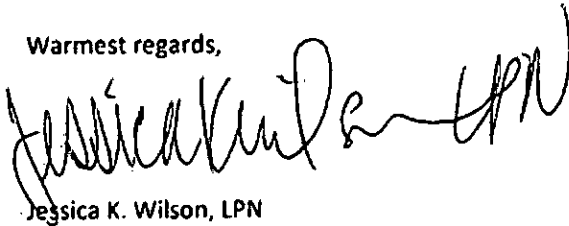
Blessing corporation has projected a loss of 400 jobs, and a loss of at least 25 million dollars in revenue. Blessing is the largest employer in this area; our organization provides employment to family, friends, and neighbors around Quincy. With the projected loss in the Quincy area, we will only cause residents to look elsewhere for employment. Talented members of our community, who pay taxes, volunteer at local organizations, spending the money they earn buying back into our community.
