We, the neurosurgeons of American Center for Spine and Neurosurgery are writing in support of Encompass Health's Certificate of Need for an acute rehab hospital in Libertyville, Illinois. As practicing physicians specializing in neurosurgery, we work with hospitals in Lake County. We are the main provider of neurosurgery in Lake County covering a total of over 500 inpatient beds, including 50 ICU beds.

Approval of this CON will provide patients with diagnoses of stroke, brain injury, and spinal injury, as well as trauma patients, a cost-effective rehab treatment facility in the local area. This patient population has many health problems, including difficulty ambulating, fatigue, balance deficits, joint pain, stiffness and neuropathy. All these issues contribute to a decrease in their independence as this impacts their activities of daily living. Physical and occupational therapies are helpful, but there are those instances that require further intensive rehabilitative services to assist the patient to regain as much functional independence as possible.

The challenge then becomes where to send the patient for inpatient rehab care. From our experience, the only place to service these patients is downtown Chicago or Milwaukee, Wisconsin, which is too far for families and patients to travel.

For those reasons, we fully support and encourage you to grant a Certificate of Need for the Encompass Health Rehabilitation Hospital, LLC to serve the Lake County area.
