Dear Ms. Brockmiller:

On May 9, 2024, the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board (State Board) approved the permit holder's request for an extension of the financial commitment period for the above-referenced project. Therefore, the financial commitment for this project has been extended as defined in 77 Illinois Administrative Code 1130.710(a)(2) which states:

Section 1130.710 Validity of Permits

A permit is effective on the date of HFSRB authorization.

- a) **A permit shall be valid until the project has been completed, provided that:**
- 1) **financial commitment of the project occurs within the time frames specified in the Act, unless HFSRB extends the financial commitment period (as defined in Section 1130.730); and**
 - 2) **the project commences and proceeds to completion with due diligence. The financial commitment period shall be extended for any project for which issuance of a permit has been contested and is in administrative review. The financial commitment period will be extended by the length of time equal to the number of days from the date a summons was received until the date of final disposition of the suit.**

You are reminded that an extension of the financial commitment period can only be requested one time. Should you fail to financially commit the project within this extended 3-month period the Permit will be deemed null and void.



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The permit holder is also reminded of the other post-permit requirements contained in "Subpart G" of Part 1130. Adherence to these requirements is essential in maintaining a valid permit and is the sole responsibility of the permit holder.
