

This would ultimately cause longer wait times, a potential to receive no care at all, and a high potential for those patients to be rerouted to Blessing anyway. To me, this represents a lower standard of care. As a patient and as a member of the community I believe in the high standard of care provided by Blessing Hospital and see absolutely no need for another hospital at this stage in Quincy's development.
