Shortly after Insight took over, the facility was financially stable and making a profit. Now, Insight wants to help give new life to Mercy Hospital.

After reading the Certificate of Exemption, supporting letters from community leaders in Michigan, and supporting letters from previous patients, I am confident that Insight can provide the assistance needed to turn Mercy Hospital around into one of the top hospitals it use to be.
