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Page 4 1 MR. ROATE: Good afternoon. My name is George Roate. I'm accompanied by Mr. John Kniery, 2 3 board administrator, and Sharie Ryan, board administrator staff. We are from the Illinois 4 Department of Public Health and we represent the 5 Illinois Health Facilities & Services Review Board. 6 7 We are here to conduct a public hearing on the proposed project known as 24-032 HSHS St. 8 9 Elizabeth Hospital ASTC and Medical Office Building in 10 O'Fallon. As per the Rules of the Illinois Health Facilities & Services Review Board, I would like to 11 12 read the legal notice into record. 13 In accordance with the requirements of the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act, notice is 14 15 given of receipt to establish a medical office building and ambulatory surgery treatment center in 16 17 O'Fallon, Project 24-032 HSHS St. Elizabeth's Hospital ASTC and Medical Office Building, O'Fallon. 18 19 The applicants are Hospital Sisters Health System, Hospital Sisters Surgery Center, O'Fallon, 20 LLC, HSHS Medical Group, Incorporated, and St. 21 22 Elizabeth -- St. Elizabeth's Hospital of the Hospital 23 Sisters of the Third Order of St. Francis. 24 The applicants propose to establish a three-story medical office building containing a 25



1 multispecialty ambulatory surgery treatment center on 2 the campus of HSHS St. Elizabeth's Hospital, O'Fallon. 3 The hospital is located at 1 St. Elizabeth Boulevard, 4 O'Fallon. The project cost is \$49,790,781.

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A public hearing will take place pursuant to 5 20 ILCS 3960. This hearing is scheduled for 6 Wednesday, November 6, 2024, at 1:00 p.m. at the City 7 of O'Fallon, City Council Chamber, 255 South Lincoln 8 9 Street, O'Fallon. The public hearing is to be held by 10 the Illinois Department of Public Health pursuant to the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act. 11 The 12 hearing is open to the public and will afford an opportunity for the parties with interest to present 13 written and/or verbal comment relevant to the project. 14

15 All allegations or assertions should be relevant to the need for the proposed project and be 16 17 supported with two copies of documentation or materials that are printed or typed on paper, size 18 eight-and-one-half inches by 11 inches. Consideration 19 by the State Board has been tentatively scheduled for 20 the October -- for the March 18, 2025, Illinois Health 21 22 Facilities & Services Review meeting.

If you have not done so, please sign in using the appropriate registration forms. One form is for individuals who want to provide testimony in favor



1 or opposition to the project. The other form is for 2 individuals to register their attendance who do not 3 wish to testify.

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To ensure that the Illinois Health 4 Facilities & Services Review Board's public hearings 5 protect the privacy and maintain the confidentiality 6 7 of an individual's health information, covered entities is defined by the Health Insurance 8 Portability Act of 1996, such as facilities, hospital 9 10 providers, health plans, and healthcare clearinghouses submitting oral or written testimony that discloses 11 protected health information of the individuals, shall 12 13 have a valid written authorization from that individual. The authorization shall allow the covered 14 entity to share the individual's protected health 15 information at this hearing. 16 17 Those of you who came with prepared text for your presentation may choose to submit the text 18 without giving testimony. However, if you're giving 19 oral testimony, please be as brief as possible. 20 As

21 per the legal notice, I would appreciate two copies of 22 your testimony. When you make your presentation, 23 please give the court reporter the correct spelling of 24 your complete name.

We have identified a chief spokesperson for



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Page 7 the applicant. We would like that individual to make 1 2 the first presentation. The remaining testimony will 3 be taken in order of the names as they appear on the register. Please hold your questions until all 4 testimony is presented. And our first speaker, the 5 board would like to call Mr. Chris Klay. 6 7 MR. KLAY: Thank you, George. My name is 8 Chris Klay, C-h-r-i-s K-l-a-y. And I currently serve 9 as the president and CEO of HSHS St. Elizabeth's 10 Hospital here in O'Fallon. 11 150 years ago, two sisters came to 12 Belleville, Illinois, ultimately from Germany with one intention, and it was to begin providing healthcare to 13 the citizens of Belleville. There was an unmet need 14 15 at the time. Within one year, those two sisters earned the confidence and trust of the community and 16 17 raised enough money to construct a hospital. That hospital became St. -- was identified as St. 18 Elizabeth's Hospital. Next year, 2025, we will 19 celebrate 150 years of being here in Southern 20 Illinois. 21 22 When those sisters came to this area 150 years ago, their focus was on serving the communities 23 24 and patients based on that unmet need. St. Elizabeth's Hospital has preserved that commitment to 25



1 the community since that time. In 2017, we were very 2 fortunate to have had the opportunity to relocate from 3 Belleville to O'Fallon. And the reason for that 4 transition or relocation was purely based on need at 5 that moment in time.

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6 Our years of service in Belleville were highly successful. We do remain committed to that 7 8 community, but the infrastructure at that time didn't 9 support our work and our obligation and that's where 10 we are today. Since coming to St. Elizabeth's in 11 2017, we have experienced substantial growth. When it 12 comes to surgical services, we are currently operating greater than -- our utilization of our surgical 13 services department exceeds 120 percent utilization. 14 15 So we are simply out of space as we work to take care of those patients who are choosing to utilize St. 16 17 Elizabeth's Hospital for care today. And that's ultimately the key driver for the ambulatory surgery 18 center request. We simply have to be better at 19 meeting the volume demands that exist at St. 20 Elizabeth's Hospital today. 21 22 In addition, the medical office building

23 piece of our CON application, we have physician groups 24 that currently exist in our campus, clinical 25 specialists, and there are also clinical specialists



that have an interest in coming to this market and we 1 2 simply don't have space available for them. So our goal is to be more efficient and more accessible to 3 the patients that currently utilize St. Elizabeth's 4 Hospital. And then we also want to improve our 5 ability in providing that specialized care that 6 patients are asking for. And that's the intent behind 7 the medical office building. 8

9 So this single structure medical office 10 building and the surgery center will allow us to be better at our efficiency in taking care of those 11 12 patients that choose us today. I want to emphasize 13 the fact that the driver behind this CON application is our existing or current volume. So the volume that 14 15 is currently at St. Elizabeth's Hospital, this infrastructure will allow us to be more consumer 16 17 centric, access, quality, and cost. That's what our patients expect of us and this infrastructure --18 infrastructure tool will allow us to do that. 19 20 Thank you. Thank you. Next, the board 21 MR. ROATE: 22 would like to call Mr. Herb Roach. 23 MR. ROACH: Thank you, sir. Herb Roach, 24 H-e-r-b R-o-a-c-h. I'm the mayor of the City of O'Fallon. I've been involved with the construction 25



Page 10 that has occurred here in the City from the time we 1 2 have started work back in 2011 to the current time. Very familiar with the hospital and the great work 3 that it does for our community and for the region. 4 I was born at the Belleville campus so I'm 5 very familiar with it. My family has been very -- but 6 7 our community -- this has meant so much to our 8 community since it came here. We do a survey of our community needs. And in 2011, when we did it, one of 9 10 the understatements for our community was healthcare facility and healthcare for a community that is a 11 12 growing community. We are the fastest growing community in Southern Illinois. 13 Since St. Elizabeth's opened up, that 14 15 recognition of the services rendered has improved by 55 percent, even though we still have -- many of our 16 17 citizens have to go to St. Louis because, as President Klay just said, they sometimes can't offer some of the 18 services that are needed. 19 So we are very, very supportive of them 20 bringing on these additional services to a growing 21 22 community that continues to grow and also to a region 23 that needs good, solid medical attention. And St. Elizabeth's has done that. They've done that with 24 quality and they've treated their patients with 25



Page 11 dignity. And I cannot say enough of the support for 1 2 the needs that they want to bring to this region. Thank you. 3 MR. ROATE: Thank you, sir. Next, the board 4 would like to call Mr. Walter Denton. 5 MR. DENTON: Hello. I'm Walter Denton, 6 7 I'm the city administrator W-a-l-t-e-r D-e-n-t-o-n. for the City of O'Fallon. I have been for 22 years. 8 9 And so I have been involved with the St. Elizabeth's 10 project from the very beginning when we started talking about it around 2008, 2009, about having 11 12 quality healthcare for Southern Illinois that's 13 accessible to residents all around and having access to the interstate. And we felt at the time that that 14 15 was a wonderful project and echo everything that Mayor Roach said about how it has improved the healthcare, 16 17 access, and quality for our residents. 18 Another aspect of that is we run our own EMS department in the City of O'Fallon and so our EMS 19 people are able to take care of our residents much 20 better because of the access to St. Elizabeth's being 21 22 close and the partnerships that we've had with the 23 hospital and with our EMS and our -- in addition, our 24 police and fire has been exemplary and they work very well together. 25



Page 12 And so we have been thrilled to have them in 1 2 our community and we support their growth because I know the calls for EMS service have gone up every year 3 because of our growing community and just needs of the 4 people in our community. And to have St. Elizabeth's, 5 particularly with the expansion and more -- and more 6 facilities and more services, will help our residents 7 8 and our first responders. 9 Thank you. 10 MR. ROATE: Thank you, sir. Next, the board would like to call Mr. Chad Goldschmidt. 11 12 MR. GOLDSCHMIDT: Hello. My name is Chad Goldschmidt, C-h-a-d G-o-l-d-s-c-h-m-i-d-t. I'm with 13 the Southwestern Illinois Building & Construction 14 15 Trades. We are in -- we are highly in support of this project. We were part of the initial project. It has 16 17 done nothing but help the community, what's already a great community, and it has brought great paying jobs 18 to the residents. And I stand again in support. 19 20 Thank you. 21 MR. ROATE: Thank you, sir. Lastly, I'd 22 like to call or the board would like to call Mr. Dan 23 Lawler.

24 MR. LAWLER: Good afternoon. My name is Dan 25 Lawler, L-a-w-l-e-r. I'm the Certificate of Need



Page 13 counsel for the applicant, St. Elizabeth's Hospital. 1 And if I'm the final speaker, I will pass on comments. 2 Otherwise, I defer to any other person here who's 3 going to speak. 4 5 MR. ROATE: Thank you, Mr. Lawler. Is there anyone who wishes to testify who 6 7 has not had an opportunity? Seeing none, is there anyone who has testified who wishes to provide 8 9 additional testimony? 10 I would remind everyone to submit your 11 written comments to us so that we have this 12 information for the record. Also, this project is scheduled for the consideration by the Illinois Health 13 Facilities & Services Review Board at its March 18, 14 15 2025, meeting.
