PUBLIC HEARING

IN RE: ASCENSION BELMONT/HARLEM SURGERY CENTER CHICAGO

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS had at the hearing in
the above-entitled cause before MR. GEORGE ROATE,
hearing officer, at Chicago Public Library - Roden
Branch, 6083 North Northwest Highway, Chicago, Illinois,
on October 1, 2024, commencing at 1:15 p.m.

1 THE COURT: Good afternoon. My name is George
2 Roate. I'm accompanied by Ms. Blanca Dominguez, Board
3 Legal Counsel. We are from the Illinois Department of
4 Public Health and represent the Illinois Health
5 Facilities and Services Review Board.

6 We are here to conduct a public hearing on the
7 proposed project known as Ascension E 025-24,
8 Belmont/Harlem Surgery Center Chicago.

9 As per the rules of the Illinois Health
10 Facilities and Services Review Board, I would like to
11 read the legal notice into the record.

12 Prime Healthcare Services, Incorporated is
13 purchasing Belmont/Harlem Surgery Center located at 3101
14 North Harlem Avenue, Chicago, at a cost of \$600,000.
15 This transaction is germane with Prime Healthcare
16 Incorporated's proposal to purchase nine hospitals and
17 two ambulatory surgery centers located throughout the
18 Chicago Metropolitan area at a total cost of
19 approximately \$375 million.

20 A public hearing will take place pursuant to
21 Illinois Code 3960. The hearing is schedule for
22 Tuesday, October 1st, 2024, from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.
23 at the Chicago Public Library, Roden Branch, 6083 North
24 Northwest Highway, Chicago.

1 The public hearing is to be held by the
2 Illinois Department of Public Health pursuant to the
3 Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act. The hearing is
4 open to the public and will afford an opportunity for
5 parties with interest to present written and/or verbal
6 comment relevant to the project.

7 All allegations or assertions should be
8 relevant to the need for the proposed project and be
9 supported with two copies of documentation or materials
10 that are printed or typed on paper sized 8 1/2 by 11
11 inches.

12 Consideration by the State Board has been
13 tentatively scheduled for the October 29, 2024
14 Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board
15 Meeting.

16 If you have not done so, please sign in using
17 the appropriate registration forms. One form is for
18 individuals who wish to provide testimony in support or
19 opposition of the project. The other form is for
20 individuals to register their attendance who do not wish
21 to testify.

22 To ensure that the Illinois Health Facilities
23 and Services Review Board's public hearings protect the
24 privacy and maintain the confidentiality of an

1 individual's health information, covered entities as
2 defined by the Health Insurance Portability Act of 1996,
3 such as facilities, hospital providers, health plans,
4 and healthcare clearinghouses submitting oral or written
5 testimony that discloses protected health information of
6 individuals shall have a written -- valid written
7 authorization from that individual.

8 The authorization shall allow the covered
9 entity to share the individual's protected health
10 information at this hearing. Those of you who came with
11 prepared text for your presentation may choose to submit
12 the text without giving testimony. However, if you are
13 giving oral testimony, please be as brief as possible.

14 As per the legal notice, I would appreciate
15 two copies of your testimony. When you make your
16 presentation, please give the court reporter the
17 spelling of your complete name.

18 We have identified a chief spokesperson for
19 the applicant, and we would like that individual to make
20 the first presentation. The remaining testimony will be
21 taken in the order of the names on the registers.

22 Please hold your questions until all testimony
23 is presented. And we'll begin.

24 First, the Board would like to call Ms. Julie

1 Mirostaw.

2 MS. MIROSTAW: Good afternoon. My name is Julie
3 Mirostaw, and I serve as the chief advocacy officer for
4 Ascension Illinois.

5 I'd like to start by thanking the Illinois
6 Health Facilities Services and Review Board for the
7 opportunity to speak to you on behalf of our Ascension
8 Illinois hospitals.

9 I'm happy to be here to share with you how we
10 came to the decision to transfer ownership of nine of
11 our 14 hospitals and a number of our ambulatory sites to
12 Prime Healthcare. In order to ensure our mission of
13 serving those most vulnerable continues to flourish, we
14 continually explore new options to best serve our
15 communities as we adapt to the rapidly changing
16 healthcare environment.

17 After thorough due diligence, a values
18 compatibility assessment, and an ethics discernment
19 process, Ascension selected Prime Healthcare as the best
20 steward of these facilities for the future.

21 Prime Healthcare is well positioned to serve
22 our communities through an integrated healthcare
23 delivery system to ensure that the greater Chicago area
24 has sustainable, quality healthcare access for

1 generations to come. Thank you.

2 MR. ROATE: Next, the Board would like to call
3 Mr. Steve Aleman.

4 MR. ALEMAN: Good afternoon once again.

5 Prime Healthcare considers it an honor and a
6 tremendous responsibility to have been selected by
7 Ascension Health as the stewards of its Illinois
8 facilities, their employees, and patients, and their
9 combined legacy of service to their communities.

10 Prime Healthcare was founded in 2001 with a
11 mission of saving, improving, and investing in community
12 hospitals. We have since delivered on that mission,
13 growing into an integrated delivery system that includes
14 44 hospitals in 14 states, more than 300 outpatient
15 locations, and nearly 45,000 employees and physicians.
16 We are excited to welcome the Ascension facilities into
17 our Prime Healthcare family.

18 And we strongly believe that we are uniquely
19 positioned to serve these hospitals and their
20 communities to ensure that the greater Chicago area
21 continues to have sustainable, quality healthcare access
22 far into the future. We have done this for communities
23 across the nation, and are confident that we can deliver
24 for the residents of Chicagoland and beyond.

1 It is Prime Healthcare's unwavering dedication
2 to providing compassionate, quality care, building
3 value, preserving access, and improving health outcomes
4 that allows Prime to consistently be nationally ranked
5 among the best hospital systems in the nation.

6 Prime Healthcare has been named a top 10 and
7 top 15 health system by Trueman Health Analytics. Our
8 hospitals have been named among the nation's top 100
9 hospitals 69 times and have received more patient safety
10 excellence awards from Healthgrades than any other
11 health system in the past eight years.

12 In 2023 alone, we received more than 500
13 clinical quality awards from national organizations such
14 as the Leapfrog Group, U.S. News and World Report, and
15 many more. Prime has also been recognized as a top 10
16 health system in the nation by the Lown Institute with A
17 grades for health equity, social responsibility, patient
18 and clinical outcomes, and inclusivity.

19 Prime Healthcare is not only bringing this
20 commitment to quality and health equity to the Ascension
21 Illinois facilities. We have also committed to invest
22 over \$250 million in the Ascension facilities to fund
23 capital improvements, including substantial technology
24 investments and system upgrades, as well as hiring all

1 the acquired facilities' workforce, subject to Prime's
2 standard hiring practices, policies, and titles.

3 Prime Healthcare is also committed to
4 continuing all the services at Ascension and, pending
5 our internal review, hope to actually expand services
6 based on the needs of the community.

7 We have also committed to maintaining the
8 levels of charity care and continuing existing charity
9 care and community benefit programs, preserving these
10 facilities' roles as valued community partners. And
11 this is not an exceptional commitment. It is what we do
12 for all the communities that we serve.

13 In fact, Prime Healthcare has provided more
14 than \$12 billion in charity care and community benefits
15 since 2010, and nearly \$2 billion in capital
16 improvements since 2005 to transform hospitals and
17 ensure health equity and care in communities across the
18 country.

19 Since 2001, Prime Healthcare has also rescued
20 various Catholic hospitals, respecting the traditions of
21 these historic facilities while promoting the spiritual
22 care and well being of all members of the community,
23 including the most vulnerable on the margins of society.
24 We pledge to do this for the Ascension facilities as

1 well.

2 I want to close with the words of our founder
3 who stated if you can see the potential for good, feel
4 the impact of kindness on others, touch the spirit of a
5 generous cause just a bit every day, then you have
6 embarked on a noble path.

7 This perfectly encapsulates the dedication to
8 compassionate care and social responsibility at the
9 heart of Prime Healthcare's mission. We look forward to
10 sharing that dedication, to caring and improving our
11 communities, with all the patients who depend on these
12 hospitals and facilities for generations to come. Thank
13 you.

14 MR. ROATE: Thank you.

15 Next, the Board would like to call Mr. Len
16 Wilk.

17 MR. WILK: Good afternoon. Len Wilk. I am a
18 Board member of the Belmont/Harlem Surgery Center.

19 We thank the Board for providing us this
20 opportunity to hear from our community today during this
21 public hearing and look forward to appearing before the
22 Board.

23 Their support of this transfer of ownership
24 preserves jobs and ensures needed healthcare access

1 across Chicagoland, as well as an investment in
2 Illinois. Thank you.

3 MR. ROATE: Thank you.

4 Is there anyone who wishes to testify who has
5 not had an opportunity? Seeing none, is there anyone
6 who has testified who wishes to provide additional
7 testimony?

8 I would remind everyone to submit your written
9 comments to us so that we may have this information for
10 the record.

11 Also, this project is scheduled for
12 consideration by the Illinois Health Facilities and
13 Services Review Board at its October 29th, 2024 meeting.
14 This meeting will be held at the Municipal Bolingbrook
15 Golf Club, 2001 Rodeo Drive, Bolingbrook, Illinois.

16 The public has until October 9th, 2024 to
17 submit written comments. These comments can be sent to
18 my attention at the Illinois Health Facilities and
19 Services Review Board, care of the Illinois Department
20 of Public Health, 525 West Jefferson Street, Second
21 Floor, Springfield, Illinois, 62761.
