Dear Chairwoman:

I am writing to you in opposition of OSF's plans to discontinue services at St. Elizabeth Medical Center ("SEMC") in Ottawa, and in opposition of OSF's plans to demolish the hospital and build a newer, smaller facility that greatly reduces access to inpatient hospital services.

In March 2024, OSF announced plans to build a new hospital in Ottawa and demolish the one built in the 70s. The new hospital would keep 26 mental health beds; but the 5-bed ICU and 14-bed OB units would be eliminated; and only 12 med/surg beds would remain (a 78% reduction from the 54 it has today). In stark contrast, OSF shared plans to re-open Peru's once shuttered hospital as the system's new inpatient hub on I-80, and increase the number of beds. **Even with OSF re-opening the Peru hospital with an increase in beds, the severe reduction planned for SEMC-Ottawa still leaves the C-02 region short 24 med/surg beds and 2 OB beds, and will place all ICU beds West of I-39 - leaving a gaping hole in access in LaSalle County.**

Please vote against OSF's projects to demolish our hospital in Ottawa and replace it with a smaller facility that eliminates our ICU and OB units, and severely reduces our medical surgical unit to one of the smallest in the state. OSF's plans do not align with the growth in our area – both traditional residential and also through tourism as Heritage Harbor looks to build 300 vacation homes. OSF's plans also do not align with the promises they made to our community 12 short years ago – and the promises stated in their exemption application to the IHFSRB in 2012.

It is our hope that OSF takes the time to make a better plan for our hospital, one that is right-sized for our community's needs and honors the spirit of the partnership we entered into with their system and our local hospital.

Dear Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board,

I am an Ottawa Resident and Registered Nurse who previously worked at Community Hospital of Ottawa, Ottawa Regional Hospital and Healthcare, and OSF Saint Elizabeth Medical from 1999 to 2016. I left nursing in 2016 after being the Employee Health Nurse for OSF SEMC for 3 years.

Ottawa Regional Hospital and Healthcare joined OSF in 2012 to maintain access to quality healthcare in our area. We were a profitable hospital at the time and wanted to ensure continued growth in the future. Now, OSF is planning to use the patients from Ottawa's profitable hospital to support their other destitute hospitals in our region.

I urge the state to check the structural condition of our current hospital in Ottawa. I believe it is not in the poor condition as OSF is portraying it to be! It most certainly is in better condition than Illinois Valley Community Hospital which they are proposing to be used as the main hospital hub.

This current plan will under-bed our community and our region. The Ottawa area serves- Serena, Marseilles, Grand Ridge, Streator, and other small towns and villages. Twelve beds is absurd. LaSalle County is the second largest county in Illinois and Ottawa Hospital serves 1/3 of our county. To keep our county's healthcare needs covered, Ottawa needs a full-service hospital that includes an ICU, OB, daily surgery services, and enough Medical beds to support our daily census!

OSF claims to serve with the greatest care and love. OSF is choosing to separate families by distance in the patient's greatest time of need. Ask any medical professional and they will testify to the importance of the presence of the patient's loved ones during a medical crisis. Facetime and phone calls are not enough. There is healing and comfort in the human touch and support from a loved one. OSF will decrease the patient's positive outcome by making it difficult for the patient to receive the needed support from family during their time of need.

OSF Saint Elizabeth Medical Center (SEMC) has already proven to be a strain on Ottawa's police and fire/ambulance departments. Our officers and paramedics are frequently tied up at SEMC, either with assisting staff with an agitated/dangerous patient or lack of room in the emergency department (ED) for a patient needing care. A decrease in services will decrease the available staff members to be called to help de-escalate an agitated patient before calling the police. This will lead to more calls from the hospital for help. Also, there will be fewer inpatient beds available, which will jam up the ED and ambulances even more. Patients will be waiting in ED while awaiting a transfer for admission to Peru, Mendota, or Princeton, which coincidentally have too many beds for their community. Likewise, people in need will be waiting in their homes for EMS to respond to their calls for help.

Having a small hospital with only minor, basic services will ultimately hurt the City of Ottawa's population growth. Families will stop choosing Ottawa because of the lack of availability of healthcare services. This will adversely affect our schools, retail shops, restaurants, tourism, and housing market.

OSF should look to balance the bed count between Peru, Ottawa, Mendota, and Princeton. With the current plan, SEMC-Ottawa will have the least amount of beds. This does not add up, since Ottawa has the largest population and services a large rural area, including Streator. The largest town with the largest service area should not equal the least amount of hospital beds in the region and the smallest hospital in the state!

According to Dr. Michael Crux, OSF SFMC President, the critical access hospitals in Princeton and Mendota, have an average census of 5 inpatients. If his low census numbers are correct, then both of these hospitals have 20 open inpatient beds daily. OSF is attempting to fill those beds with patients from Ottawa and our surrounding communities. They are attempting to keep those hospitals open by using our local patients! Peru's hospital has already closed once. It appears that OSF is trying to use our hospital's prosperity to give Peru the appearance of a successful hospital.

OSF continues to use the excuse that rural healthcare in the United States is dying. This is interesting when looking at the income of each member of the administration in the western region for OSF. If rural healthcare is dying, then how are all the CEOs making \$400,000 plus? Shouldn't these CEOs take a pay cut to allow more funds for physician recruitment and physician support? Rural Healthcare is dying because CEOs are making too much money! Follow the money. Why is it going to so many administration members and not to physicians and staff who are saving lives? The administration is feeding off of patient healthcare disparities!

Here is a scenario that Ottawa and surrounding community members will have to face should OSF's current plan pass!

Your loved one drops in the living room. You call 911 and start CPR, knowing that their best chance at survival is with early cardiac defibrillation. The dispatcher notifies you that an ambulance will be there as soon as possible, but the ambulances are all

currently tied up at the hospital or out on other calls. Ambulances are waiting outside the ED to drop off patients but there is no space in the ED because there are too many patients waiting to be admitted to the medical unit. There are no beds in Ottawa available for these admissions because there are already 12 patients in the medical unit. The patients in ED are awaiting transfer to Peru, Mendota, or Princeton but this will take the transferring ambulance from one hour to one hour twenty minutes round trip. Additional time is needed to wheel the transferred patient to their awaiting medical bed and report off to the receiving staff. So, as soon as the ED has an empty bed, the ambulance can release their current patient to Ottawa's ED. Then that ambulance will rush to assist you.

Just remember that while you are trying to save your family member's life, OSF skewed their numbers, minimized our hospital, and pretended they knew better than our highly educated citizens (some of whom were previous Administration and Physicians at OSF) all in the name of saving rural healthcare, while just trying to line their pockets! OSF Administration must be stopped. In this scenario, your loved one has a very small chance of survival because early defibrillation is not available. The defibrillator and life-saving medications in this scenario were sitting in line at SEMC's ED parking lot! I'm sorry for your loss!

I adamantly oppose OSF's plan to decrease hospital size and capabilities in Ottawa. To be a fully functioning hospital, Ottawa needs 30+ medical beds and fully functioning Surgery, Obstetrics, and Intensive Care Units!
