As a physician, I am writing to express my strong support for OSF HealthCare's Certificate of Need (CON) application to consolidate intensive care (ICU) and inpatient obstetrics (OB) services from Ottawa to the hospital facility in Peru.

In my professional experience, OSF HealthCare has consistently demonstrated a deep commitment to quality, safety, and compassionate care. The proposed regional model reflects a forward-thinking approach that ensures patients across LaSalle, Bureau, Putnam, and surrounding counties will continue to have access to exceptional care delivered in the most clinically appropriate and sustainable settings.

The challenges facing health care today, including provider shortages, population declines, and the need for specialized expertise, require innovative solutions. OSF's plan to centralize certain inpatient services while expanding outpatient, emergency, behavioral health, and specialty care locally is both practical and in the best interest of patients.
