

My uncle was there for 17 years. My dad there for 4 years. My mother-in-law for 5 years; My father-in-law for 4 years. The care was very good and nurses and aides took very good care of them.

The first administrator I knew was Henrietta Bauer; I also knew Collette Rau and Kim Keckritz.

They were amazing. I know there were a few that didn't do a great job; but all in all it is a great place.

Since the new people have taken over the Alzheimer section has closed, there is no longer a gift shop, and I don't know if they still have the activity department that the residents get to come to and have activities to entertain them.

The residents of Monroe County should have a voice in deciding whether the County continues to run Oakhill and not just the three county commissioners.

Hopefully the state will support us and put a referendum on a ballot so we can have a say that the county should or should not continuing to maintain the facility.

In early spring, 2023, the County Commissioners were advised of a billing issue with respect to Medicare billing at Oak Hill. The County continues to address that issue and hopes to bring it to a resolution in the very near future.

That is not the end of the story, however. Once the County board was made aware of the issue, it determined that the only way to ensure that the County could accomplish both forthrightness with Medicare, along with protect the County from those prior issues in addition to protecting against reoccurrence, was to engage with an outside firm to determine the extent, and identify the problems that led to the issue.

Over the next eighteen months, while working alongside Armanino LLP, the county board was brought several conclusions about the genesis of the issues at Oak Hill, but one stood above the rest. The issue was that the county government, as both previously and currently constructed, is not equipped with the expertise, support, and underlying knowledge base to successfully run Oak Hill.

That left the county board with a few paths, each of which was explored by the commissioners with diligence and objectivity. The paths were discussed at length with the consultant group, Armanino.

The paths included, first, hiring personnel, beyond the simple hiring of a nursing home administrator to fully and wholly support the operation of Oak Hill. What was discovered on this path was the indisputable fact that such path would come at a significant cost to the taxpayer, both in monetary terms and in government services. Stated simply, the cost to fully support Oak Hill at the County level, if it could even hire and identify the necessary folks, was going to result in added taxes and cuts to other essential government services.

The second path, a management company. The county had gone down that path before, with mixed results. Once again, the indisputable facts related to this path, given the parameters of management agreements again resulted in added costs, and ultimately losses for Oak Hill overall.

The third path, and the one that was ultimately decided upon, was to figure out how to make sure that Oak Hill survived the realities of staffing challenges and everevolving regulations so that future generations of Monroe County residents have Oak Hill as a choice for care for their grandparents, parents, and eventually themselves. Because of the realities that a sale of the facility is not permitted short of a voter referendum, a lease of the facility and a sale of the operations were the obvious solution.

Despite a solution to the problem being settled upon, the county board was not optimistic that a suitable partner would be found. After many discussions, and after engaging with an expert in the nursing home real estate field, the county was introduced to Accolade. The introduction was just the beginning, but through continued communication, a relationship formed, and it became clear that Accolade was the right group to shepherd Oak Hill into the future.

The Monroe County board recognizes the following indisputable facts, that Oak Hill's prior and expected continued success are based on the sterling employees that have made Oak Hill a part of their lives. And, that Oak Hill is a beautiful facility with wonderful residents. As a county board, we are sad that the conclusion to lease Oak Hill was one that had to be reached. We are sad that the ability for any county to successfully run a nursing home has become unsustainable. And we are sad that Oak Hill will no longer be called by its actual name, the Monroe County Nursing Home. That sadness will persist, because Oak Hill has been such a significant part of the county for so long, but it will subside as we continue to realize that though it is not the Monroe County Nursing Home, it is still there, and its story, and history cannot be erased, and will be remembered by myself, and every commissioner that I have served with and that has come before me. And its continued existence, and the history associated with it, will be in the capable hands of Accolade Health.

The Accolade group is made up of wonderful, caring folks, who have a passion for this field. They have a base of expertise that the county knows will equip them for significant and continued success with the operation of Oak Hill. But, most importantly, the board recognizes that Accolade represents the sustainable and successful future of Oak Hill. The lease with Accolade is what the county board knew so many months ago, it was the path to ensure that Oak Hill is saved for the future generations of Monroe County residents. We are happy to have them as a part of our community and look forward to their continued success.

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Attached to Oak Hill is Evergreen Pointe Rehabilitation Facility. In the past two years, I have had direct contact with this facility. My parents both had to spend some time there before returning home due to medical conditions. We found the quality of the care and the staff to be phenomenal.

During the summer of 2023, my dad, Vernell Moehrs, spent a total of almost two months at Evergreen Pointe. In fact, it was one of the nurses who is the reason that he is alive today. Camille noticed that Dad's incision did not look quite right along with Dad being unusually lethargic, unable to eat and running a low grade fever. She got in contact with his surgeon who sent him immediately by ambulance back to Memorial East where he had an emergency bowel repair; Dad's bowel had ruptured. Dad was in ICU for almost two weeks and then returned to Evergreen Pointe where he was rehabbed. It was a long and difficult road but Dad was able to return home.

During the summer of 2024, my mom, Lucille Moehrs, spent two weeks there recovering from a fractured pelvis. Again, extremely pleased with the care she received during her time there with her, as well, eventually being able to return home.

Evergreene Pointe provides quality care with quality people. It is my fear that if Accolade is allowed to assume control of the entire Oak Hill facility that the quality of care will begin to suffer. I have lived in Monroe County my entire life paying property taxes for a total of 39 years which a portion goes to maintaining the nursing home. It has been a comfort for me to know that the standard of care given to my loved ones who have needed to stay there has been top notch. I would also like to know that a quality facility will be there should I need to use it for any reason.

I strongly feel that Monroe County should maintain control of Oak Hill. I also feel that if Oak Hill should become privatized then the voters should have a say in this matter and be the ones to approve that decision.

Public Hearing for Oak Hill

My name is Jason Chism. I am the District 7 Sub 2 District Director for the United Steelworkers Union. We represent the hard-working men and women at Oak Hill. We have a collective bargaining agreement in place. Our current CBA was recently negotiated and it runs through December 1st 2024 – November 30th 2027.

The USW has represented workers at this location since February 25th 2004. The Union has negotiated many contracts since then and has worked diligently to have a strong working relationship with Oak Hill and Monroe County. The USW also represents workers in the Monroe County Highway Department. The Union has a major vested interest in maintaining the current labor contract which protects the current work force at Oak Hill, but also making sure the residents continue to receive the outstanding care they receive from our members.

Our skilled nursing staff, CNA's, PRN's, housekeeping, cooks, dietary and maintenance employees, including management personnel have worked diligently to make Oak Hill one of the top nursing homes in the state. This doesn't happen overnight. It is from years of dedicated employees and this community being dedicated in making Oak Hill successful.

These things will not change if Oak Hill remains a Monroe County entity and not allowed to move forward with this lease to an outside company.

Since this was made public, there has been nothing but confusion, very little answers to questions, and has not met with the Union to discuss any of the potential changes up to this point.

The potential new company has been in the facility meeting with our members creating even more confusion among them. Discussing policy, possible changes in working conditions, wages and even disparaging the Union. We have a contract in place and the Union has been waiting patiently to sit down with Monroe County and the possible new employer to discuss our current labor contract.

Commissioneds

Monroe County would lead you to believe this is a struggling facility. This facility is far from it. Do we have our challenges, sure we do. We work together with management and we figure out the best way to resolve an issue and move forward always keeping the residents best interest in mind. It has always been this culture that makes this a special "top of the line" nursing home.

Commissioners

Monroe County claims it no longer has the requisite expertise to operate a skilled nursing facility. As I stated before, we have a skilled nursing staff, CNA's, PRN's, housekeeping, cooks, dietary, maintenance employees among other positions and including a hardworking management team that has worked diligently in making Oak Hill one of the top nursing homes in the state, for the County to make this claim is just plain false.

In fact, it is true we have had 5 administrators in 5 years. These troubles should not be lumped in with an excuse to lease the facility to an outside entity. Monroe County should be held accountable to tighten up their belts and hire the right qualified person for the position. In all business cases, this would be the outcome. This situation should be no different.

Oak Hill is one of the oldest county operated nursing homes in the state. It's been embedded in this community for many, many years, dating back all the way to 1858. The USW has represented workers at this facility for a very long time and its skilled workers has made this facility a 5-star facility for many years and currently sits at a 4-star rated facility. Both awesome achievements but indicate the dedication from the workers, the community and the residents that reside at Oak Hill.

We ask for this provided to re-consider allowing this lease to go through, We ask to hold Monroe County Commissioners accountable to doing their jobs and not allow them to throw decades of hard work and dedication by the workers and the community to the hands of an outside entity.

I am writing to respectfully request that the Illinois Facilities and Service Review Board deny the lease/contract agreement between Accolade Waterloo LLC/Accolade Ventures LLC, and Oak Hill Living and Rehabilitation Center.

As a concerned Citizen of Monroe County, I am worried about the potential impact of the lease agreement on Monroe County. The County Commissioners have been working behind closed doors for months without the knowledge of the county residents or the residents and workers at the facility. They have not released a copy of this agreement and the actual contents to the public. Most of the county is not even aware of what is happening because not everyone gets our local paper or know how to research on the internet. I've attended the meetings and they have not been forthcoming with information. They are acting as thought this is a done deal. Some citizens have made the statement "it's a done deal" because the commissioners are acting as it is. They have designed it to appear to be the case and that irritates me since the voters of the county have not had a vote in this or a say because they don't know about it, that too by design.

One thing that they have used for their argument for the lease is they (the commissioners) don't have the expertise to run the facility, however neither did their predecessors but thy hired people that did and they did an excellent job for many years. The facility is now paid off so they can come to the tax payers and ask to keep the facilities same tax paid previously to pay for the facilities to hire those with expertise to administer to the needs of the Oak Hill.

One other concern I have is they say Accolade can offer services that Oak Hill can't and that high acuity resident with tracheotomies, requiring dialysis and complex wound care can be taken care of when Accolade takes over. It seems to me that requires a very sterile environment will be required and could cause a serious outbreak of infection for our current residents, should that occur. They may restrict certain areas off limits to our residents and they lose their independence of movement. I appeal to you, once again, to deny Accolade Waterloo, L LC to take over Oak Hill Living and Rehabilitation Center.

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I truly hope this meeting will have an impact on you and you will not approve the lease of Oak Hill to Accolade. Even though the lease has not been approved by the state, there are a number of changes happening at Oak Hill.

- Gift Shop remodeled
- · Entry way and reception area updated
- Activity room painted, floor cleaned and buffed.
- Staffing changes too.

Let it be known that we didn't find out about the county's decision regarding Oak Hill until a few weeks before we had the first and only meeting with our commissioners (the end of August). Originally, we thought the meeting would be a question and answer but it was only comments from the residents. Even though questions were not answered the most asked was why? Why didn't they reach out to the community before making this impactful decision?

This Nursing home has been in our county since 1951. It has assisted generations of residents to keep their relatives close in a great facility. The staff treats the residents with care and respect, as well as their families. If there are questions or issues, they are addressed promptly.

Oak Hill provides jobs for local residents. With the facility being county owned, it has allowed the staff to have a retirement plan. If Accolade leases, they will not be able to keep their retirement because it will no longer be a county facility. This is a huge benefit for staff along with their union.

Since COVID there have been many changes and not many of them are good. I was not aware of the liaison group which Oak Hill had prior to COVID. It was a group comprised of doctors, nurses and staff that facilitated between Oak Hill and the commissioners. When we came out of COVID, the commissioners should have resurrected this group. In my opinion, the commissioners don't want the responsibility of Oak Hill because it has become difficult for them and not profitable. If that was the case, they should have reached out to the community first. It is terrible that 3 individuals made this decision that impacts potentially thousands.

With the leasing of Oak Hill, Accolade wants to change it to a critical care facility as well. All beds are filled quickly and the type of facility we have now has been fine. The hospital is the best place for residents to receive critical care. Not sure how many beds will be removed for this new area and what the full impact will be. Definitely more credentialed nurses will need to be hired and possibly an on staff doctor. This would definitely make payroll go up and we would lose beds for noncritical residents.

For all of the folks that came to the meeting in August, we spoke but weren't heard. Hopefully we will be heard now. Please don't approve this lease!

I urge you to reject the proposed change of ownership of Oak Hill from Monroe County to Accolade Health. This transfer threatens to erode the quality and accessibility of care for our most vulnerable residents, undermines the core values of our community, and introduces unacceptable risks to both residents and staff.

As a lifelong Monroe County resident, I have a personal connection to Oak Hill and Magnolia Terrace. Several of my loved ones have previously lived in these facilities.

Transferring Oak Hill's ownership to Accolade Health puts our most vulnerable residents at immediate risk and dismantles a vital community safety net. This decision weakens the quality and accessibility of care. I implore the board to reject this transfer for the following urgent reasons:

Access to Care:

- One of the first acts of the judges of Monroe County in the 1800s was to establish an "Alms House" to care for the most vulnerable in our community. Over time, the "Alms House" became "Oak Hill", but its mission has remained steadfast. Oak Hill provides services to everyone, regardless of ability to pay.
- As a for-profit operator, Accolade is likely to prioritize higher-paying patients, which could limit affordable access for lower-income seniors and disadvantage our vulnerable residents.
- Oak Hill's Independent Living Facility will be managed by a separate company under Accolade, creating uncertainty about resident qualifications, costs, and available services.

2. Quality of Care:

- o Oak Hill has mostly maintained a 5-star CMS rating since 2010, slipping to 4 stars in 2022 and 2025. Accolade's facilities rate lower: Savoy (1 star), Danville and Paxton (2 stars), Pontiac and Peoria (3 stars). Sam Brooks of the National Consumer Voice for Long Term Care notes quality often declines after nonprofit sales (Fortune 2024). Accolade's Savoy, acquired in 2023, remains at 1 star. ("History & Tradition - OakHill", 2024)
- Savoy quality per www.medicare.gov: 12/6/24 19 health citations, 9 fire safety citations 2025 5 complaint inspections, fined \$37k).

- Despite voter support, commissioners decided to lease and eventually sell Oak Hill to Accolade Health without public input, announcing the decision just before final papers were signed. The public comment session held that night left many questions and concerns unresolved.
- Accolade is now on-site and has begun preparing Oak Hill employees for the ownership transition. In a recent meeting, Accolade expressed frustration with HFSRB delays and conveyed confidence in receiving approval.
- I urge the HFSRB to pause this transfer of ownership and require Monroe County to consult its citizens and thoroughly explore community-centered alternatives before taking any final action. The future of Oak Hill demands full transparency, accountability, and a collective community voice.

In summary, this is a pivotal moment for Monroe County:

- Accolade, a for-profit organization facing financial distress, is likely to prioritize
 profits over people, which would endanger access to essential care for our most
 vulnerable residents and compromise Oak Hill's mission.
- For over 60 years, Monroe County has set the standard for compassionate, reliable senior care. In contrast, Accolade's limited experience and commitment do not meet our community's expectations.
- Oak Hill maintains strong 4- and 5-star quality ratings, which Accolade has not matched at its other facilities. This raises concerns that care quality may decline under new ownership.
- Accolade's ongoing expansion and financial struggles heighten the risk of downsizing or abandoning facilities such as Oak Hill. Given this significant risk. I ask the HGSRB to keep Monroe County responsible as the owner to ensure essential oversites and safeguards. Encourage Oak Hill to leverage Accolade to "assist in operations".
- Since 2017, Accolade has acquired seven nursing facilities; none rate above three stars, and one has closed. This rapid growth and instability increase the risk of future sale or bankruptcy. ("Accolade, Inc. 2017 Annual Report", 2017)

The Monroe County Board of Commissioners stated that they no longer have the required expertise to operate a skilled nursing facility and decided to exit the business so they can focus on public safety and essential services to the residents of Monroe County

THE MONROE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS HAVE NOT ALWAYS HAD THE EXPERTISE TO OPERATE A SKILLED NURSING FACILITY. Former county boards have worked diligently to provide other health care options for its success in the past without leasing or selling the facility. One of those examples being 25 years ago the county board decided they would hire a management firm to assist the nursing home with changing regulations, staffing issues, and appropriate Medicare and Medicaid billing but still reported to the commissioners in all their decisions. The commissioners were still involved with overseeing Oak Hill as voted by tax payers in Monroe County. They also were instrumental in finding a competent administrator to manage the nursing home.

Since 1951 till 2000 (49 years) the nursing home has had 11 administrators. The current county board of commissioners stated "they employed 5 administrators in the past 5 years". In reality they have only hired 3 administrators. The nursing homes long time administrator was there for 21 years and decided to go part time. Then the commissioners hired a fulltime administrator and fired him within a year. The long time administrator left her part time position to take over the full time administrator position for 6 months until the board hired another fulltime administrator. The next administrator was terminated within 2 years of being hired. Then the board gave the position to an LPN at the facility. She had no experience as a nursing home administrator but was going to school for her nursing home administrator license. She left the facility within 10 months of taking that position after an audit was completed and the financial records were substandard which

leads us to the present situation. Most of these administrators were terminated by the county commissioners. Were the administrators properly vetted to ensure the right person was hired for this very crucial position? Why should the seniors of Monroe County have to pay the price for the mismanagement of Oak Hill by the commissioners. I oppose the lease between Oak Hill and Accolade Healthcare. I feel Oak Hill is an exceptional senior facility and needs to stay county owned and operated. There are not many choices in a 15mile radius of Waterloo for exceptional care like Oak Hill provides. If Accolade does not keep up the same standards of care Oak Hill is known for where will the seniors of Monroe County receive their care? The commissioners have stated in their letter to this board that the only other facility in Monroe County is a 1star nursing home and now they want to lease our nursing home to a nursing home chain that has a average 2.3 overall star rating. I plead with this board to please deny Accolades request for the certificate of need so or seniors will have the best care they deserve. Oak Hill is a essential service for Monroe County residents.

As a lifelong citizen of Monroe County, I was appalled and disappointed to say the least when I picked up the August 6th newspaper and read that the County Commissioners decided to lease Oak Hill to Accolade Healthcare ultimately giving Accolade **complete** control of Oak Hill. The only invitation for a public comment meeting was scheduled for August 26. The community packed the room and the many questions that were asked along with comments about the decision to lease Oak Hill. No answers were received and to this date remain unanswered.

Oak Hill has been a county home for 75 years and the taxpayers have supported the home as evidenced by building the first county home, adding additions to that building twice and then building Oak Hill. A decision was made by the Commissioners to lease the nursing home for 5 years and with the possibility of another 5 years or selling it at a fixed price pending a referendum from the taxpayers. How could they make this decision that has a great impact on the residents of Oak Hill, senior citizens and 200 employees without being transparent to the taxpayers? Information obtained through the Freedom of Information Act indicates that the Commissioners were already considering leasing Oak Hill as early as March 2025 and I am sure many months prior to March there were discussions on this during their many closed meetings. There was ample time to have meetings with the community to voice their concerns with regarding ownership of Oak Hill and receive feedback Transparency was needed but not given.

According to information provided to Illinois Health Facilities and Service Review Board the commissioners made the decision to "exit the business, so it could focus on public safety and essential services". Should not the COUNTY (taxpayers) have a voice in the decision to exit the business and isn't Oak Hill; the seniors of Monroe County, part of the **essential** services, or are they not included in public safety? Signing a lease to Accolade Health Care to take over operations of Oak Hill, **WITHOUT** having to regularly report to the Commissioners as previous Administrators and the Management firm did does not seem to go with their focus of public safety and proven business practices.

The staffing issues, complex and growing regulations requiring costly managers were mentioned as some of the reasons for "exiting the business". The nursing home industry has faced many complex and growing regulations for the past 75 years. As a nurse and a DON with 35 years of employment at Oak Hill I saw many complex and challenging changes where administration and staff met those challenges and made the required changes.

Oak Hill, a non-for-profit facility, has had to resort to agency staff, as many health care facilities do, to provide for the care our residents need and deserve. Will Accolade Health Care, a for profit, do the same? Per information from CMS on average Accolade has a 1.5-star rating for staffing. Oak Hill has a 4-star rating for staffing per CMS.

I oppose this lease and request for CON by Accolade. Let us look forward to celebrating 100 plus years of quality care Oak Hill has and should continue to provide the seniors of Monroe County.

My name is Julia Olszewski and I am speaking this evening to oppose the lease of Oak Hill to Accolade. I was the Whispering Pines director at Oak Hill for 20 years. I understand that Accolade will be de-certifying Whispering Pines and there will no longer be a dedicated Alzheimer's unit at Oak Hill. This is a grave injustice for the citizens of this area and the residents of Oak Hill's memory care unit.

Whispering Pines was designed for the safety and well-being of those with dementia. If the Pines is decertified, that means that the exit doors at the end of each hall will be unlocked. Currently, a waiver from the state allows those doors to be locked at all times for the safety of the residents who have cognitive impairment unless there is an emergency. It is my understanding that residents with dementia will still reside on that unit and having unlocked doors to the outside will pose a risk for serious injury or possible death for a resident who may unintentionally leave the building. Is this worth the risk? I think not.

According to the Alzheimer's Association statistics from 2023, 10 to 11% of the county's population has dementia. That is 700 individuals in Monroe County and that number will continue to grow. Monroe County needs a safe and compassionate place for those with dementia to live when they can no longer live at home anymore. Accolade is already not replacing activity staff positions on that unit, causing more safety risks, such as falls, due to lack of supervision.

The main reason Accolade would want to decertify the Pines is to make more money to line their pockets at the expense of some of the most vulnerable residents. Please seriously consider the negative impact that Accolade will have on our loved ones with dementia and their families in Monroe County and the surrounding areas.. I have spent time with the residents, their families, and the dedicated staff who make Oak Hill such a special and compassionate place.

am here to oppose the proposed change of ownership from Monroe County to Accolade Ventures LLC. Transferring Oak Hill to a for-profit organization poses serious risks to both the quality and accessibility of care for our seniors.

For-profit ownership often leads to prioritizing financial gain over patient well-being. These operators frequently favor higher-paying residents and may limit access for individuals who rely on Medicaid or have lower incomes. This type of "cherry-picking" would disadvantage many vulnerable residents and families in our community.

I have personally witnessed what can happen in for-profit nursing homes. At another facility, I saw residents left tied into wheelchairs in hallways for hours, many slumped over and asleep in discomfort due to chronic understaffing. This was not an occasional sight — it was a daily occurrence. That kind of neglect robs residents of dignity, comfort, and safety.

Oak Hill has always stood for compassionate, community-based care, serving people of all financial backgrounds with respect and integrity. Turning it over to a for-profit operator like Accolade Ventures would endanger that legacy and the values that make Oak Hill so important to Monroe County.

For these reasons, I strongly urge the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board to deny **Application #25-031** and preserve Oak Hill as a trusted, community-centered home for our seniors.

"My name is Pam Muertz speaking today as a concerned resident of Monroe County. Oak Hill has been a cornerstone of our community for decades, and While I understand the financial pressures that led to this lease, I'm deeply concerned about the lack of county oversight once Accolade takes control.

Specifically, #d-like to ask: What safeguards are in place to ensure residents are not transferred, discharged, or subjected to changes in care without proper review? When Accolade falls to meet its promises—whether in staffing, care quality, or resident rights— as is proven in their other facilities, the county and families will have no decision making authority to fix it.

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Thank you for coming here and giving us the opportunity to voice our concerns regarding Oak Hill's lease agreement with Accolade.

I am a lifelong resident and taxpayer of Monroe County. Many of my loved ones have been residents at Oak Hill, at the old location and at the current location. They had the best care and were well taken care of. The staff were excellent they always kept our family up to date with our loved ones' needs and concerns. It is really disheartening to hear the staff that put their heart and soul into the facility and stuck with the facility during and after COVID are now losing their retirement benefits that only county owned facilities offer.

I am here today to oppose the lease and potential sale of Oak Hill to Accolade Healthcare. The long-term care industry has always been a complex and everchanging business! Some people think the county should not be in the nursing home business, but I say why not? Monroe County has an outstanding nursing home, we are proud of, why not be different from other counties and continue to offer this essential need to Monroe County taxpayers instead of losing control to a nursing home chain such as Accolade! The Monroe County tax paying seniors have contributed to the success of Monroe County and what it is today! Years ago, Monroe County taxpayers voted to continue providing our seniors with the essential care they need by voting for a beautiful new building.

The County Commissioners were elected to oversee those responsibilities! Change of ownership only relieves the County Commissioners of that responsibility and that should be up to the taxpayers who own Oak Hill! The Commissioner's state Oak Hill does not have a clinical team of managers to oversee day-to-day patient care. Again, the Commissioners have failed to properly vet a competent Administrator to assemble a team of managers to lead the nursing home the last few years. Some feel the facility was set up to fail so the commissioners could validate leasing and potentially selling Oak Hill due to their fatigue and frustration for some issues that have occurred. Due to the Commissioner's lack of transparency, the taxpayers can only assume what those issues might be. One of those issues the Commissioner's state are an inexperienced Medicare biller had inappropriately billed Medicare for several years and will cost the taxpayers seven figures with paying back overpayments and fines? The elected officials feel the overpayments and fines will be a tax burden for Monroe County residents. If this is a concern they should have taken this to the taxpayers and let us decide if it is a burden or not! It was reported in the Republic Times in September 2025 that Oak Hill has 1 million in a CD and 1

million in another account. This should cover some of the burden made by the inexperienced Medicare biller. Monroe County is very fortunate Oak Hill has been financially stable in the past to have funds to help pay for this issue! The Commissioner's now want to lease and potentially sell our nursing home to Accolade that owns 6 other homes. Per the CMS website, those combined homes have paid \$459,410 dollars in fines and have had 97 complaints with citations in the last 3 years. Also, according to the CMS website, Oak Hill paid 1 fine of \$8,190.00 and 1 complaint with citation the last 3 years. This is quite a difference with the quality of care given. Even though Oak Hill is a county owned nursing home it has made a profit! Accolade is aware Oak Hill is a fantastic opportunity for them to increase their profit margins and cash in on the taxpayers of Monroe County but at what cost! Studies have shown, that "For profit" nursing home chains typically cut staff, decrease supplies and serve substandard food and the proof of that is on their surveys posted on nursing home compare and star ratings.

My loved ones enjoyed the food and different choices offered at Oak Hill; they made many friends with their caregivers and enjoyed the many activities offered. Accolade states they will take higher acuity residents, but will they increase staff that these types of residents require? Per CMS website, Accolade home's staff star ratings average 1.5 stars. This rating indicates they will not. I would like to see the statistics of how many Monroe County residents require the higher acuity of care Accolade states they will offer!

Oak Hill is a fantastic facility and Monroe County is blessed to have it. If the County Board is fatigued and frustrated with the responsibility of the oversight the nursing home requires, I think the taxpayers have a right to ask for a different solution than leasing and selling to a for profit, chain nursing homeowner. The stress of this situation is taking a toll on the residents and staff at Oak Hill plus the many seniors in the area that may one day call Oak Hill their home.

To.Whom it May Concern

I am Kelly Schipkowski, a licensed nurse in Illinois, speaking today as a healthcare professional and concerned citizen.

I want to contrast the performance we currently see under county operation (as exemplified by Oak Hill in Monroe County) with what we observe in Accolade's existing facilities in Peoria(now closed), Danville, Savoy, Pontiac, and Paxton.

Oak Hill operates under Monroe County oversight. It delivers nurse hours per resident per day, that exceed the state average, and holds relatively strong ratings across health inspections, staffing, and quality—historically even reaching 5 stars.

Even so, Oak Hill has not been perfect: it has had deficiencies, including an infection control citation, and has been fined in the past. But crucially, because it is county-run, these issues are transparent, local stakeholders have recourse, and corrective action is under public oversight.

In contrast, Accolade's facilities consistently show repeated and serious deficiencies in infection control, lower staffing ratings, and substandard survey results in Illinois CMS / state data. When you aggregate those data across multiple locations, a pattern emerges of systemic quality issues.

If we transfer our county home to such an operator, we risk losing the safeguards that keep the quality at least within some acceptable bounds under local oversight. Oak Hill shows what county stewardship can achieve—neither perfect, but accountable and relatively strong. Let that be our benchmark when deciding the future of our county nursing home.
